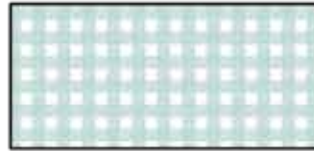

Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (7820-149 Bears- Blue/Taupe), cut:

- (3) 8 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 8 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (24) 8 $\frac{7}{8}$ " triangles. *Note: You will only use (12) 8 $\frac{7}{8}$ "triangles.*

Fabric B (7821-66 Bee Sayings – Green), cut:

- (2) 8 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strips, sub-cut (5) 8 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (10) 8 $\frac{7}{8}$ " triangles. *Note: You will only use (5) 8 $\frac{7}{8}$ "triangles.*

Fabric C (7822-14 Rainbows – Blue/Yellow), cut:

- (3) 8 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strips, sub-cut (9) 8 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (18) 8 $\frac{7}{8}$ " triangles. *Note: You will only use (9) 8 $\frac{7}{8}$ "triangles.*

Fabric D (7826-11 Bee Hex – Light Blue), cut:

- (2) 8 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strips, sub-cut (6) 8 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (12) 8 $\frac{7}{8}$ " triangles.

Fabric E (7827-39 Daisies – Taupe), cut:

- (1) 8 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 8 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (8) 8 $\frac{7}{8}$ " triangles. *Note: You will only use (7) 8 $\frac{7}{8}$ "triangles.*

Fabric F (7825-46 Mini Hex – Yellow/Green), cut:

- (1) 8 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (3) 8 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (6) 8 $\frac{7}{8}$ " triangles. *Note: You will only use (3) 8 $\frac{7}{8}$ "triangles.*

Fabric G (7824-66 Dot- Green), cut:

- (3) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Fabric H (7829-44 Suns – Yellow), cut:

- (3) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Fabric I (Oyster-35 Peppered Cottons – Oyster), cut:

- (6) 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (96) 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ " triangles.

Fabric J (1351-Seaglass Just Color! – Seaglass), cut:

- (6) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips for the binding.

Backing (7831-149 Hex Cheater – Blue/Taupe), cut:

- (2) 56" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 56" x 72" to make the back.

Sewing

Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) $4\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric I triangle to both the top and to the left side of (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H square. Sew (1) $8\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric A triangle to the long side of the newly sewn triangle to make (1) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Block One square (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (12) Block One squares total.

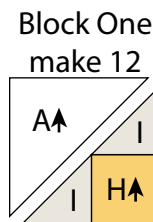

2. Repeat Step 1 and refer to Figures 2-6 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (5) Block Two squares, (9) Block Three squares, (12) Block Four squares, (7) Block Five squares and (3) Block Six squares.

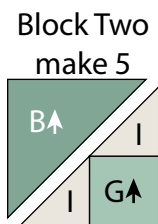

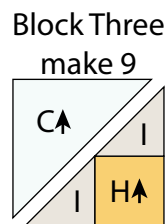

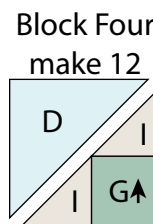

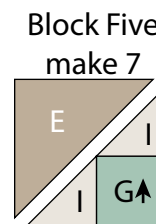

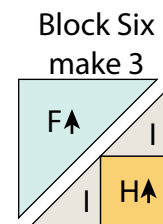

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

3. Sew together (1) Block One square, (2) Block Two squares, (2) Block Three squares and (1) Block Four square, in that order from left to right, to make Row One.

4. Repeat Step 3 and refer to the quilt layout for component identification, placement and orientation to make Row Two through Row Eight.

5. Sew together the (8) Rows, lengthwise and in numerical order from the top to bottom, to make the quilt top.

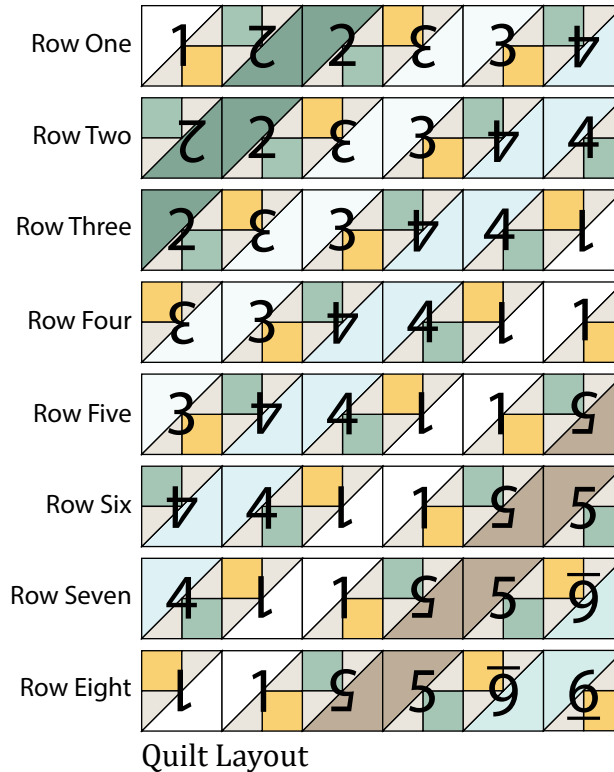
Layering, Quilting and Finishing

6. Press the quilt top and 56 " x 72 " backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

7. Cut the ends of the (6) Fabric J binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

8. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
