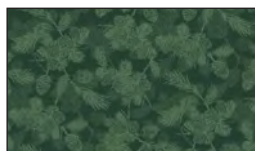

Cutting and Sewing

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of the fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage unless otherwise noted. (WOF = Width of Fabric, LOF = Length of Fabric).

Fabric A (7850P-38 Block Panel – Multi), trim:

*(1) 22½" x 34" rectangle.

Fabric B (7843-40 Garden Animals - Beige), cut:

*(2) 3½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 1½" x 3½" strips.

Fabric C (7846-90 Flower Fluffs - Gray), cut:

*(4) 1½" x WOF strips for border 4.

Fabric D (7840-48 Dry Flowers - Cream), cut:

*(6) 1½" x WOF strips for border 8.

Fabric E (7842-40 Foxes - Beige), cut:

*(2) 4½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 1½" x 4½" strips.

Fabric F (7845-40 Small Floral Damask - Beige), cut:

*(4) 2" x WOF strips for border 2.

Fabric G (7841-88 Floral Damask - Red), cut:

*(2) 2½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2½" squares.

*(4) 2" x WOF strips for border 1.

Fabric H (7844-09 Hares - Gray), cut:

*(5) 3" x WOF strips for border 5.

Fabric I (7848-33 Wood Grain - Brown), cut:

*(1) 4½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (28) 1½" x 4½" strips.

*(2) 5½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 1½" x 5½" strips and (12) 1½" x 4½" strips, for a total of 40.

Fabric J (7847-66 Pine Cones – Green), cut:

*(2) 2½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2½" squares.

*(6) 1½" x WOF strips for border 9.

*(6) 2½" x WOF strips for binding.

Fabric K (Peppered Cottons – Oyster-35), cut:

*(6) 1½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (160) 1½" squares.

*(2) 2½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 1½" x 2½" strips.

*(2) 3½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 1½" x 3½" strips.

*(4) 1½" x WOF strips for border 3.

*(3) 2" x WOF strips for border 6 – sides.

*(3) 1¼" x WOF strips for border 6 – top/bottom.

Sewing

Block Assembly

1. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of the 1½" Fabric K squares. With right sides together, place one marked Fabric K square on a corner of one 2½" Fabric J square and stitch on the drawn line. Repeat with the opposite corner of the same square. Trim seam allowances to ¼" and press open. Repeat with the other corners of the square. Make (20) 2½" units.

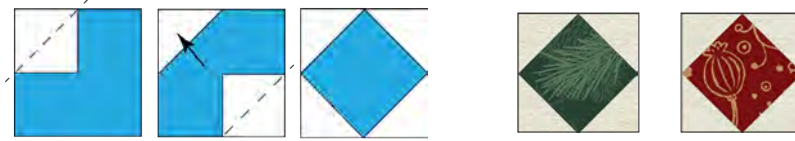


Figure 1 – Make 20 of each type.

- Repeat this step with the remaining 1½" Fabric K squares and the 2½" Fabric G squares to make (20) 2½" units (*figure 1*).

2. Sew a 1½" x 2½" Fabric K strip to the left side of the Step 1 units. Press the seams away from the center. Sew a 1½" x 3½" Fabric K strip to the top of each unit (*figure 2*). Press.

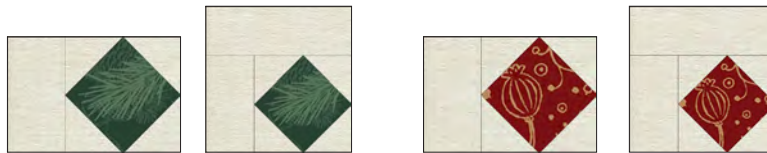

3. Sew a 1½" x 3½" Fabric B strip to the right side of the Step 2 units (*figure 3*). Press as before.

4. Sew a 1½" x 4½" Fabric E strip to the bottom of each Step 3 unit (*figure 4*). Press.

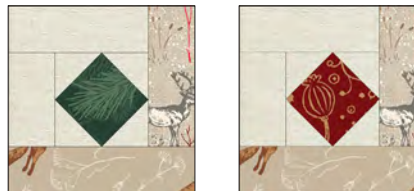

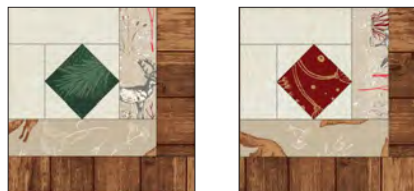


Figure 5 – Make (20) 5½" blocks of each.

5. Finally, sew a 1½" x 4½" Fabric I strip to the right side and a 1½" x 5½" strip to the bottom of every unit (*figure 5*). Press. Make (20) 5½" blocks of each type.

Sewing

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the quilt diagram and photograph while assembling the quilt top.)

6. For border 1, trim (2) 2" Fabric G strips to 34" and sew one strip to each side of the Fabric A panel. Press the seams toward the border. Trim 2 more 2" Fabric G strips to 25½" and sew one to the top and one to the bottom of the panel. Press as before.
7. For border 2, trim (2) 2" Fabric F strips to 37" and sew one strip to each side of the Fabric A panel. Measure the width of the quilt top through the center. Trim 2 more 2" Fabric F strips that length and sew one to the top and one to the bottom. Press.
8. For border 3, measure the vertical length of the quilt top through the center and trim (2) 1½" Fabric K strips that length. Sew one strip to each side of the quilt center. Measure the width of the quilt top through the center. Trim 2 more 1½" Fabric K strips that length and sew one to the top and one to the bottom. Press.
9. For border 4, sew (4) 1¼" Fabric C strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Measure the vertical length of the quilt top through the center and cut two border strips that length. Sew 1 strip to each side of the quilt top. Measure the width of the quilt top through the center. Cut 2 strips that length and sew one to the top and one to the bottom. Press.
10. Repeat Step 9 with the (5) 3" Fabric H strips to make and add border 5.
11. For the **sides** of border 6, sew (3) 2" Fabric K strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Measure the vertical length of the quilt top through the center and cut 2 border strips that length. Sew one strip to each side of the quilt top and press. For the **top and bottom**, sew together the (3) 1¼" Fabric K strips, measure the width of the quilt through the center, and cut 2 strips that length. Sew one to the top and one to the bottom. Press. The quilt measures 40½" x 50½" up to here.
12. For border 7 and referring to the quilt photo for block placement and orientation, lay out 4 strips with 10 blocks for the sides and top/bottom of the quilt. Notice that each strip begins with a green-center block and ends with a red-center one. Sew the blocks together, press, then sew one strip to each side of the quilt center. Press the seams toward the quilt center. Sew the top and bottom strips, then press.
13. Repeat Step 9 with the (6) 1½" Fabric D strips to make and add border 8.
14. Repeat Step 9 with the (6) 1½" Fabric J strips to make and add border 9.

Layering, Quilting, and Finishing

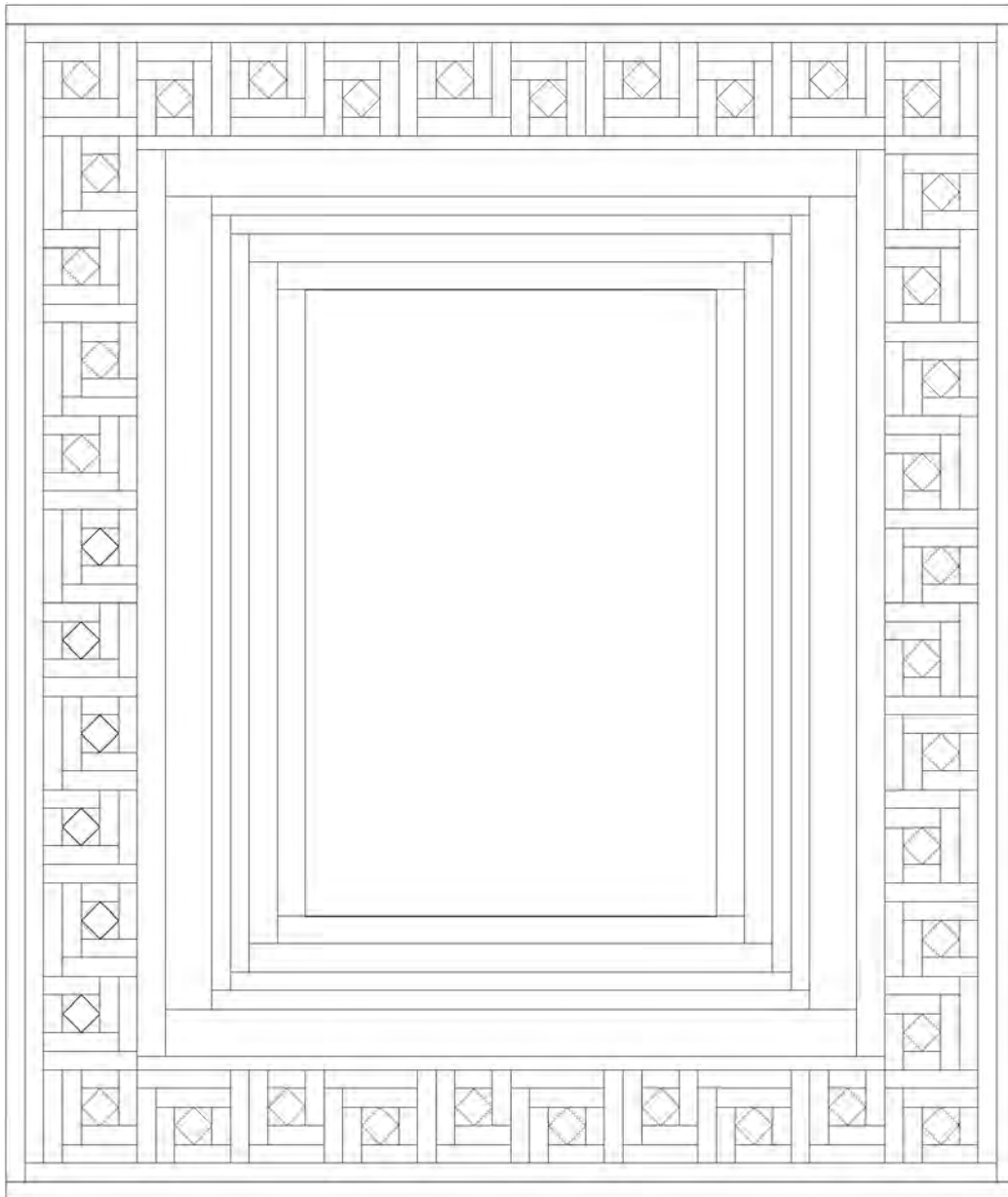
15. Create a quilt sandwich with the batting between the quilt top and the backing. Pin or baste layers together, mark the quilting design, and quilt by hand or machine. When the quilting is complete, remove pins or basting and trim the batting and backing even with the raw edges of the quilt top.

Binding

16. Join the (6) 2½" Fabric J binding strips together end to end using a diagonal seam to make one long strip. Fold in half lengthwise with wrong sides facing, and press. Sew the binding to the edges of the

quilt top, mitering corners, and overlapping ends. Fold the binding to the back of the quilt and stitch it in place by hand to finish.
