






Cutting Instructions

Notes:

- Please make sure to check studioefabrics.net for pattern updates prior to starting the project.
- All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

Fabric A, fussy cut:

- (2) 16½" squares, centered on square blocks
- (2) 22½" x 12½" rectangles, centered on rectangular blocks

Fabric B, cut:

- (4) 2½" x 27½" WOF strips
- (2) 2" x WOF strips; sub-cut (4) 2" x 16½" strips
- (2) 2" x WOF strips; sub-cut (4) 2" x 19½" strips
- (2) 2" x WOF strips; sub-cut (4) 2" x 14½" strips
- (1) 1½" x WOF strip; sub-cut (6) 1½" x 4½" strips
- (8) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end-to-end with diagonal seams and cut (6) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $54\frac{1}{2}$ " strips

Fabric C, cut:

(4) 2" x WOF strips; sub-cut (4) 2" x 25½" strips and (4) 2" x 12½" strips

Fabric D, cut:

(3) 4½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end-to-end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 4½" x 52½" strips

Fabric E, cut:

(2) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end-to-end with diagonal seams and cut (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $52\frac{1}{2}$ " strip

Fabric F. cut:

- (6) 3½" x WOF strips
- (8) 21/2" x WOF strips for the binding

Fabric G, cut:

(6) 3½" x WOF strips

Fabric H, cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end-to-end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 66½" strips
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end-to-end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 571/2" strips

Fabric I, cut:

- (4) 5½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end-to-end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5½" x 69½" strips
- (4) 5½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end-to-end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5½" x 67½" strips

Backing, cut:

(2) 87" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 75" x 87" to make the back




Sewing


- Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Press seams towards the darker fabric, unless otherwise indicated.
- The arrows in the figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

Block Assembly


1. Sew (1) 2" x 16½" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 16½" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2" x 19½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 18½" x 18½".** Repeat to make a second Block One square.




2. Sew (1) 2" x 12½" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) 22½" x 12½" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 2" x 25½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make (1) Unit 1 rectangle (Fig. 2). **Trim the unit to measure 24½" x 14½".** Repeat to make a second Unit 1 rectangle.




3. Sew (1) 2" x 14½" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 rectangle. Sew (1) 2½" x 27½" Fabric B strips to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 square to make (1) 27½" x 18½" Block Two rectangle (Fig. 3). Repeat to make a second Block Two rectangle.




4. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each end of (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $52\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $54\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric E strip to make (1) $54\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Block Three strip (Fig. 4).



5. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each end of (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $52\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $54\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric D strip to make (1) $54\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Block Four strip (Fig. 5). Repeat to make a second Block Four strip.



- 6. Sew (3) 3½" x WOF Fabric F strips and (3) 3½" x WOF Fabric G strips together lengthwise and alternating them from left to right to make (1) Strip Set 1 (Fig. 6). Repeat to make a second Strip Set 1.
- 7. Cut the (2) Strip Set 1's into (18) 3%" x 18%" Unit 2 strips.




8. Paying attention to the orientation of the units, sew (3) Unit 2 strips together end to end to make (1) Block Five strip (Fig. 8). Repeat to make (4) Block Five strips total.



- 9. Sew together (1) Unit 2 strip, (1) Block One square, (1) Unit 2 strip, (1) Block Two rectangle and (1) Unit 2 strip, in that order from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 9).
- 10. Sew together (1) Unit 2 strip, (1) Block Two rectangle, (1) Unit 2 strip, (1) Block One square and (1) Unit 2 strip, in that order from left to right, to make Row Two (Fig. 9).
- 11. Sew together (1) Block Five strip, Row One, (1) Block Five strip, (1) Block Three strip, (1) Block Five strip, Row Two and (1) Block Five strip lengthwise and in that order from top to bottom to make the 54½" x 54½" Center Block (Fig. 9).





Quilt Top Assembly

Follow the Quilt Layout (Page 6) while assembling the quilt top.

- 12. Sew (1) Block Four strip to the top and bottom of the Center Block.
- 13. Sew (1) $2'' \times 66\%''$ Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $2'' \times 57\%''$ Fabric H strip to the top and bottom of the Center Block.
- 14. Sew (1) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $69\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $67\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip to the top and bottom of the Center Block to make the Quilt Top which should measure $67\frac{1}{2}$ " x $79\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished.

Layering, Quilting and Finishing

15. Press the quilt top and 75" x 87" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

- 16. Cut the ends of the (8) Fabric F binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.
- 17. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
