



Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

Cityscape (Backing) 22921-BLK-CTN-D

From the C'est Magnifique 36in Panel (A):

• Fussy cut (4) 20 ½" x 16 ½" rectangles each centered on a block.

From the Starry Night (B), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 2" x 16 ½" strips.
- (8) 2" x 23 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 2 ½" x 10 ½" strips.
- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 2 ½" x 18 ½" strips.
- (4) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3 ½" x 76 ½" strips.
- (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3 ½" x 60 ½" strips.

From the Tranquil Valley (C), cut:

• (2) 10 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (4) 14 ½" x 10 ½" strips.

From the Fields of Gold (D), cut:

- (2) 1 ½" x 74 ½" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- From the remaining fabric cut (8) 2 ½" x 14 ½" WOF strips, (8) 2 ½" x 22 ½" WOF strips and (2) 1 ½" x 54 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.

From the Rolling Hills (E), cut:

• (3) 2 ½" x 72 ½" LOF strips.

From the Solid White (F), cut:

- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 72 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 52 ½" strips.

From the Solid Black (G), cut:

• (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.


From the Cityscape (Backing), cut:

• (2) 90" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 68" x 90" back.


Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 16 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 20 ½" x 16 ½" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 2" x 23 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make (1) Block One rectangle (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 22** ½" x 18 ½". Repeat to make (4) Block One rectangles total.




2. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 10 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 14 ½" x 10 ½" Fabric C strip. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 18 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and bottom of the Fabric C strip to make (1) 18 ½" x 14 ½" Unit 1 rectangle (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (4) Unit 1 rectangles total.




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3. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 14 ½" Fabric D strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 rectangle. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 22 ½" Fabric D strip to the top and bottom of the Unit 1 rectangle to make (1) 22 ½" x 18 ½" Block Two rectangle (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (4) Block Two rectangles total.




- 4. Sew Together (2) Block One rectangles and (2) Block Two rectangles, lengthwise and alternating them from top to bottom, to make Column One (Fig. 4).
- 5. Sew together (2) Block Two rectangles and (2) Block One rectangles, lengthwise and alternating them from top to bottom, to make Column Two (Fig. 4).
- 6. Sew together Column One, (1) 2 ½" x 72 ½" Fabric E strip and Column Two, lengthwise and in that order from left to right, to make the 46 ½" x 72 ½" Center Block (Fig. 4).



Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)
7. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 72 ½" Fabric E strip to each side of the Center Block.

- 8. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 72 ½" Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 52 ½" Fabric F strip to the top and bottom of the Center Block.
- 9. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 74 ½" Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 54 ½" Fabric D strip to the top and bottom of the Center Block.
- 10. Sew (1) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 76 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 60 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
- 11. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 12. Sew the (8) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric G strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 13. Bind as desired.
