



1 ½ yards (1.38m)	Cherries Jubilee (C)*

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Bows and Flowers (A), cut:

• (7) 8 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 8 ½" x 12 ½" strips.

From the Packed Hazel (B), cut:

- (3) 8 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 8 ½" x 4 ½" strips.
- (5) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

From the Cherries Jubilee (C), cut:

- (5) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.
- (9) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Quilt Market (D), cut:

• (5) 8 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 8 ½" squares.

From the Highland Farm (E), cut:

- (2) 16 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (25) 2 ½" x 16 ½" strips.
- (11) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (6) 2 ½" x 74 ½" strips.

From the Highland Farm (Backing), cut:

• (2) 100" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 82" x 100" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 8 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric A strip to the top of (1) 8 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric B strip to make the left column. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric B strip to the left side of (1) 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric C strip lengthwise. Sew the newly sewn square to the top of (1) 8 ½" Fabric D square to make the right column. Sew together the (2) columns lengthwise to make (1) 16 ½" Block One square (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (5) Block One squares total.



2. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric C strip to the left side of (1) 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric B strip lengthwise. Sew the newly sewn square to the bottom of (1) 8 ½" Fabric D square to make the left column. Sew (1) 8 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric B strip to the top of (1) 8 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric A strip to make the right column. Sew together the (2) columns lengthwise to make (1) 16 ½" Block Two square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (5) Block Two squares total.



3. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric B strip to the left side of (1) 8 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric A strip to make the top row. Sew (1) 8 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric B strip to the top of (1) 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric C strip lengthwise. Sew the newly sewn square to the right side of (1) 8 ½" Fabric D square to make the bottom row. Sew together the (2) rows lengthwise to make (1) 16 ½" Block Three square (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (5) Block Three squares total.



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4. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric C strip to the top of (1) 8 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric B strip lengthwise. Sew the newly sewn square to the left side of (1) 8 ½" Fabric D square to make the top row. Sew (1) 8 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric A strip to the left side of (1) 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric B strip to make the bottom row. Sew together the (2) rows lengthwise to make (1) 16 ½" Block Four square (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (5) Block Four squares total.






Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 5. Sew together (1) 2 ½" x 16 ½" Fabric E strip, (1) Block One square, (1) 2 ½" x 16 ½" Fabric E strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) 2 ½" x 16 ½" Fabric E strip, (1) Block Three square, (1) 2 ½" x 16 ½" Fabric E strip, (1) Block Four

square and (1) 2 ½" x 16 ½" Fabric E strip, in that order from left to right to make Row One.

- 6. Repeat Step 5 and refer to the Quilt Layout for fabric and unit identification, placement and orientation to make Row Two through Row Five.
- 7. Sew together (6) 2 ½" x 74 ½" Fabric E strips and the (5) pieced Rows in numerical order, lengthwise and alternating them from top to bottom, to make the quilt top.
- 8. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 9. Sew the (9) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric C strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 10. Bind as desired.



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
