Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (7158P-11 24 Inch Panel – Soft Blue):

• Fussy cut (1) 22 ¹/₂" x 40 ¹/₂" rectangle, centered on the panel.

Fabric B (1351-Mint Just Color! – Mint), cut:

- (2) 2" x 40 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 2" x 25 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips.

Fabric C (1351-Light Lime Just Color! – Light Lime), cut:

• (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips.

Fabric D (1351-Daffodil Just Color! – Daffodil), cut:

• (8) 1 ½" x WOF strips.

Fabric E (7148-17 Tossed Quails – Light Teal), cut:

• (1) 3 ¹/₂" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 3 ¹/₂" squares.

Fabric F (7153-01 Allover Motifs – White), cut:

• (1) 3 ¹/₂" x WOF strip, sub-cut (7) 3 ¹/₂" squares.

Fabric G (7154-90 Tossed Tractors - Gray), cut:

• (1) 3 ¹/₂" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 3 ¹/₂" squares.

Fabric H (7150-11 Ducks on Lake – Soft Blue), cut:

• (1) 3 ¹/₂" x WOF strip, sub-cut (7) 3 ¹/₂" squares.

Fabric I (7147-01 Apples – White), cut:

• (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (7) 3 ½" squares.

Fabric J (7149-90 Sheep – Gray), cut:

• (1) 3 ¹/₂" x WOF strip, sub-cut (7) 3 ¹/₂" squares.

Fabric K (1351-Red Just Color! - Red), cut:

• (5) 2 ¹/₂" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric L (7155-66 Farm Scenic – Green), cut:

• (1) 6 ¹/₂" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 6 ¹/₂" squares.

Backing (7156-01 Small Blocks - White), cut:

• (2) 62" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 44" x 62" to make the back.

Sewing

Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.


1. Sew (1) 2" x 40 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the 22 ½" x 40 ½" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 2" x 25 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 24 ½" x 42 ½"**.

2. Sew (1) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF Fabric D strip to each side of (1) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF Fabric B strip lengthwise to make (1) Strip Set 1 (Fig. 2). Repeat to make a second Strip Set 1.

3. Cut the (2) Strip Set 1's into (22) 3 ¹/₂" squares to make (22) Block One squares (Fig. 3).

4. Sew (1) 1 ½" x WOF Fabric D strip to each side of (1) 1 ½" x WOF Fabric C strip lengthwise to make (1) Strip Set 2 (Fig. 4). Repeat to make a second Strip Set 2.

5. Cut the (2) Strip Set 2's into (22) 3 ¹/₂" squares to make (22) Block Two squares (Fig. 5).




6. Follow Figure 6 and sew together (7) Block One squares, (7) Block Two squares, (3) 3 ½" Fabric E squares, (2) 3 ½" Fabric I squares, (3) 3 ½" Fabric G squares, (2) 3 ½" Fabric J squares, (2) 3 ½" Fabric H squares and (2) 3 ½" Fabric F squares into a 2 x 14 matrix to make the Left Side Border.

7. Repeat Step 6 and refer to Figure 7 for component identification, placement and orientation to make the Right Side Border.


8. Follow Figure 8 and sew together (4) Block One squares, (4) Block Two squares, (2) 3 ½" Fabric E squares, (1) 3 ½" Fabric G square, (1) 3 ½" Fabric I square, (2) 3 ½" Fabric F squares, (1) 3 ½" Fabric H square and (1) 3 ½" Fabric J square into a 8 x 2 matrix. Sew (1) 6 ½" Fabric L square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Top Border.



9. Repeat Step 8 and refer to Figure 9 for component identification, placement and orientation to make the Bottom Border.

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

10. Sew the Left Side Border and Right Side Border to the left and to the right sides of the Center Block.

11. Sew the Top Border and the Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.


Layering, Quilting and Finishing

12. Press the quilt top and 44" x 62" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

13. Cut the ends of the (5) Fabric K binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

14. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
