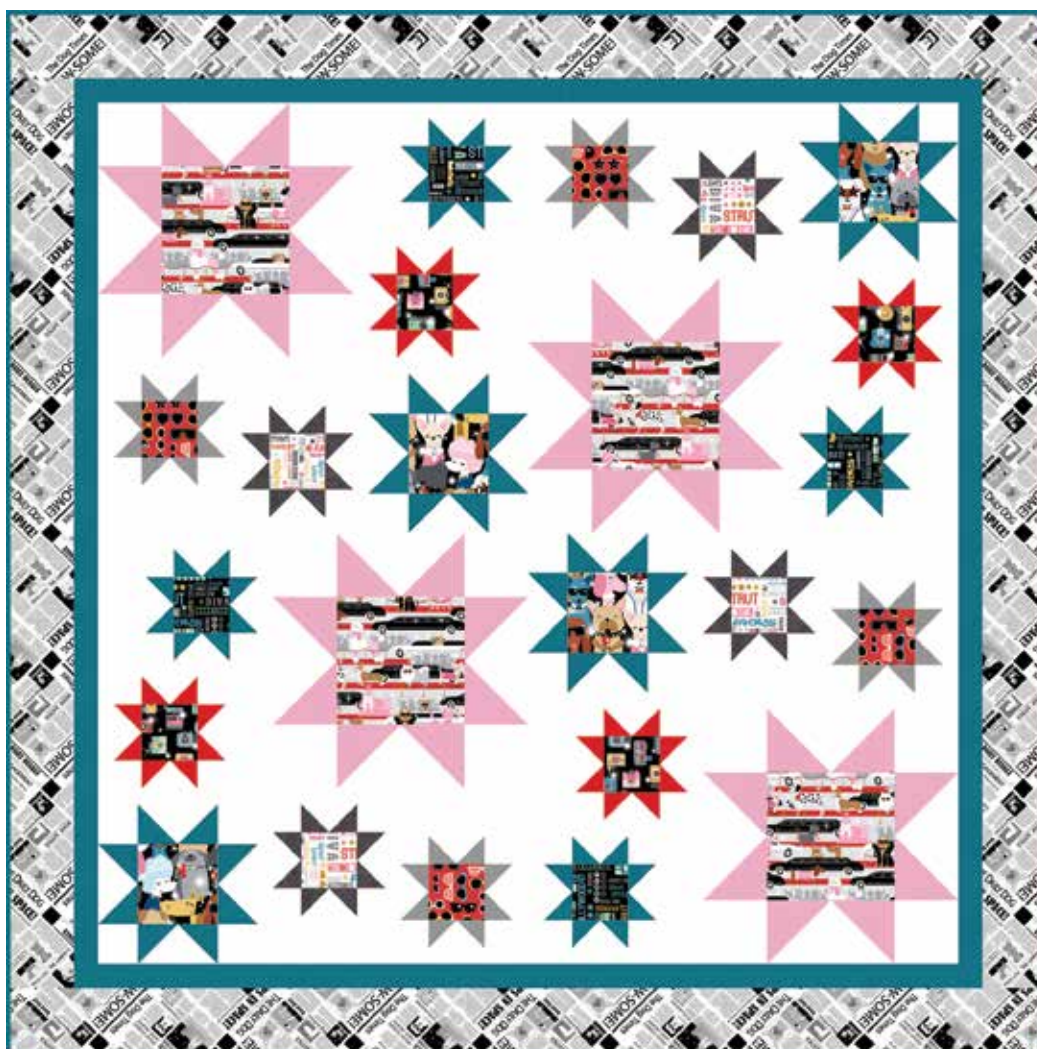

## Cutting

### Cutting Instructions

*Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.*

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

**Fabric A (4164-90 Limos – Gray), cut:**

- (1) 8 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 8 ½" squares.

**Fabric B (Cottage Rose-06 Peppered Cottons – Cottage Rose), cut:**

- (4) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (32) 4 ½" squares.

**Fabric C (4168-99 Marquis Words – Black), cut:**

- (1) 4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4" squares.

**Fabric D (Lagoon Blue-78 Peppered Cottons – Lagoon Blue), cut:**

- (3) 3" x WOF strips, sub-cut (32) 3" squares.
- (2) 2 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (32) 2 ¼" squares.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 54 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 57 ½" strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

**Fabric E (4162-99 Cameras – Black), cut:**

- (1) 4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4" squares.

**Fabric F (Flame-16 Peppered Cottons – Flame), cut:**

- (2) 2 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (32) 2 ¼" squares.

**Fabric G (4166-88 Shades – Red), cut:**

- (1) 4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4" squares.

**Fabric H (Aluminum-60 Peppered Cottons – Aluminum), cut:**

- (2) 2 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (32) 2 ¼" squares.

**Fabric I (4168-22 Marquis Words – Pink), cut:**

- (1) 4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4" squares.

**Fabric J (Charcoal-14 Peppered Cottons – Charcoal), cut:**

- (2) 2 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (32) 2 ¼" squares.

**Fabric K (4163-93 Headshots – Multi), cut:**

- (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 5 ½" squares.

**Fabric L (4165-91 Gossip Newspaper – Black/White), cut:**

- (3) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end, matching patterns and cut (2) 4 ½" x 57 ½" strips.
- (4) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end, matching patterns and cut (2) 4 ½" x 65 ½" strips.

**Fabric M (White Sugar-09 Peppered Cottons – White Sugar), cut:**

- (2) 8 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.
- (2) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 4 ½" squares.
- (4) 3 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 3 ½" x 7 ½" strips.
- (3) 3" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 3" x 5 ½" strips and (2) 3" squares.
- (1) 3" x WOF strip, sub-cut (14) 3" squares.
- (7) 2 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (64) 2 ¼" x 4" strips (10) 2 ¼" squares.
- (3) 2 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (54) 2 ¼" squares.
- (7) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (20) 1 ½" x 11 ½" strips and (1) 1 ½" x 7 ½" strip.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (15) 1 ½" x 7 ½" strips.
- (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 1 ½" x 10 ½" strips.

**Backing (4162-99 Cameras – Black), cut:**

- (2) 73" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 73" x 73" to make the back.

## Sewing

Sew using a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

### Block Assembly

1. Place (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B square on the left side of (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric M strip, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 2). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.

2. Place another  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B square on the right side of the  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric M strip, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 4).

3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make (16) Unit 1 strips total.

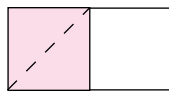

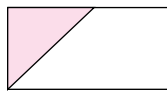

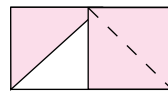

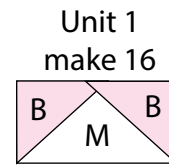

4. Repeat Steps 1-2 using (16)  $3$ " x  $5\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric M strips and (32)  $3$ " Fabric D squares to make (16) Unit 2 strips (Fig. 5).

5. Repeat Steps 1-2 using (16)  $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $4$ " Fabric M strips and (32)  $2\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric D squares to make (16) Unit 3 strips (Fig. 6).

6. Repeat Steps 1-2 using (16)  $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $4$ " Fabric M strips and (32)  $2\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric F squares to make (16) Unit 4 strips (Fig. 7).

7. Repeat Steps 1-2 using (16)  $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $4$ " Fabric M strips and (32)  $2\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric J squares to make (16) Unit 5 strips (Fig. 8).

8. Repeat Steps 1-2 using (16)  $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $4$ " Fabric M strips and (32)  $2\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric H squares to make (16) Unit 6 strips (Fig. 9).

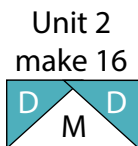

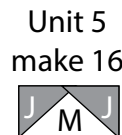

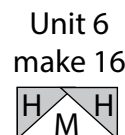

9. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of (1) 8 ½" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 4 ½" Fabric M square to each end of (1) Unit 1 strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A strip to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 10). Repeat to make (4) Block One squares total.

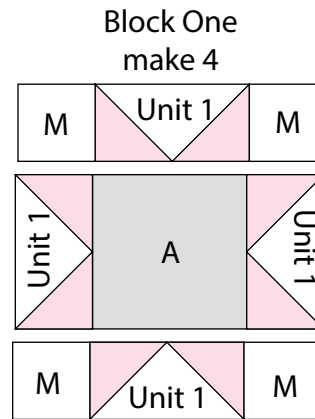

10. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip to each side of (1) 5 ½" Fabric K square. Sew (1) 3" Fabric M square to each end of (1) Unit 2 strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric K strip to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 11). Repeat to make (4) Block Two squares total.

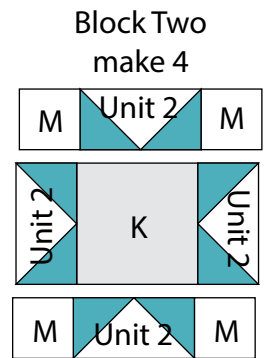

11. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to each side of (1) 4" Fabric C square. Sew (1) 2 ¼" Fabric M square to each end of (1) Unit 3 strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric C strip to make (1) Block Three square (Fig. 12). Repeat to make (4) Block Three squares total.

12. Sew (1) Unit 4 strip to each side of (1) 4" Fabric E square. Sew (1) 2 ¼" Fabric M square to each end of (1) Unit 4 strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric E strip to make (1) Block Four square (Fig. 13). Repeat to make (4) Block Four squares total.

13. Sew (1) Unit 5 strip to each side of (1) 4" Fabric I square. Sew (1) 2 ¼" Fabric M square to each end of (1) Unit 5 strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric I strip to make (1) Block Five square (Fig. 14). Repeat to make (4) Block Five squares total.

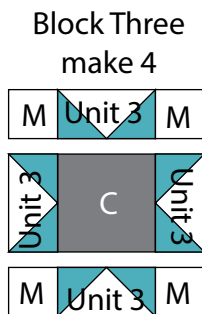

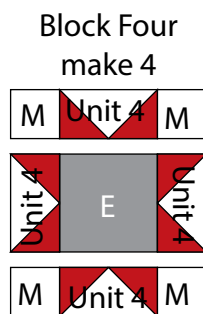

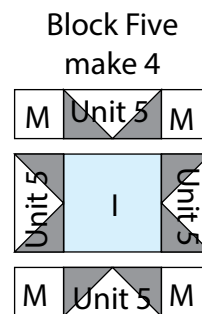

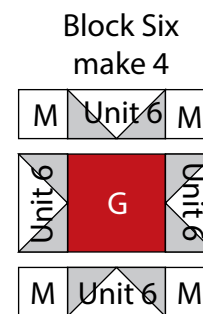

14. Sew (1) Unit 6 strip to each side of (1) 4" Fabric G square. Sew (1) 2 ¼" Fabric M square to each end of (1) Unit 6 strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric G strip to make (1) Block Six square (Fig. 15). Repeat to make (4) Block Six squares total.

## Quilt Top Assembly

*(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)*

15. Follow Figure 16 and sew together (1) of each block (Blocks 1-6), (5)  $1\frac{1}{2}" \times 11\frac{1}{2}"$  Fabric M strips, (4)  $3\frac{1}{2}" \times 7\frac{1}{2}"$  Fabric M strips, (4)  $1\frac{1}{2}" \times 7\frac{1}{2}"$  Fabric M strips and (1)  $1\frac{1}{2}" \times 10\frac{1}{2}"$  Fabric M strip to make the Upper Left Section of the Center Block.

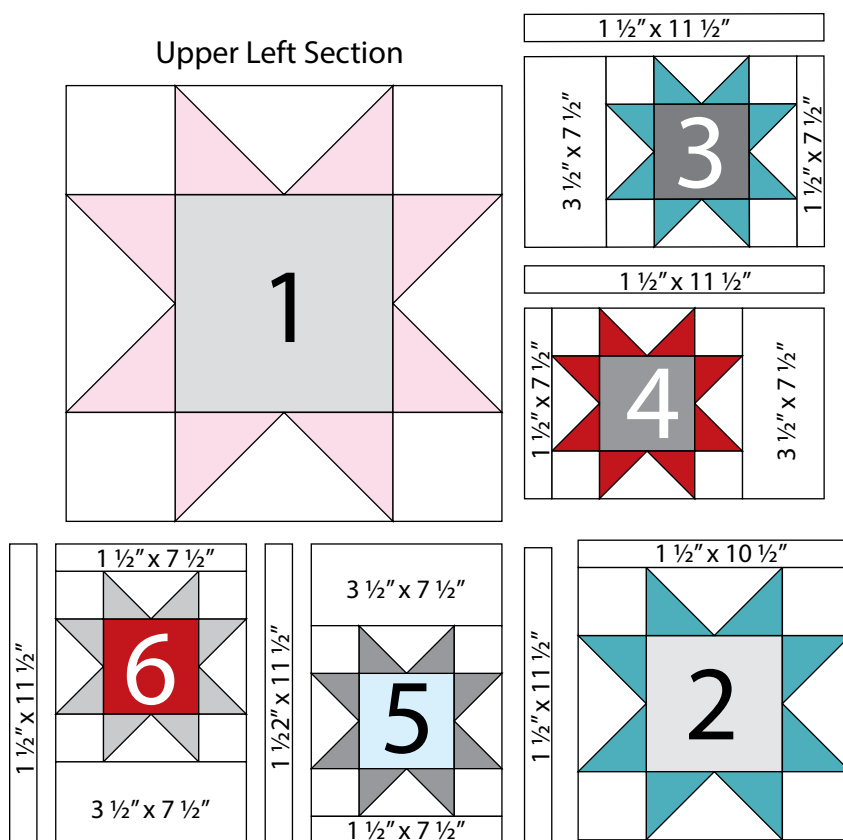

16. Repeat Step 15 and use Figures 17-19 for fabric identification and location to make the Upper Right Section, Lower Left Section and Lower Right Section of the Center Block.

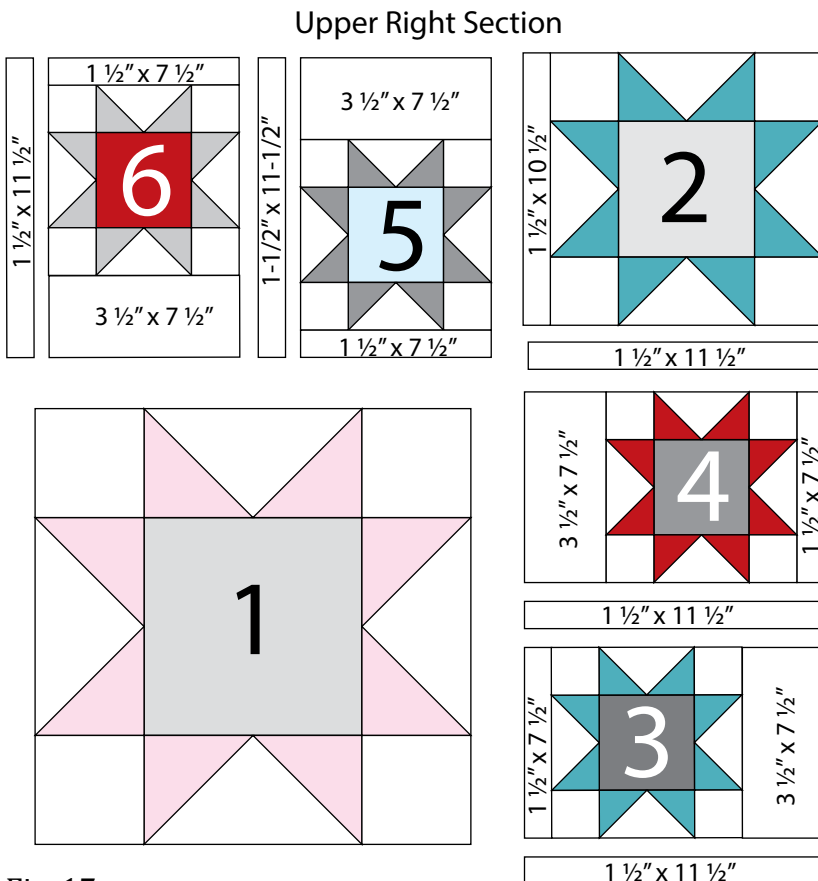

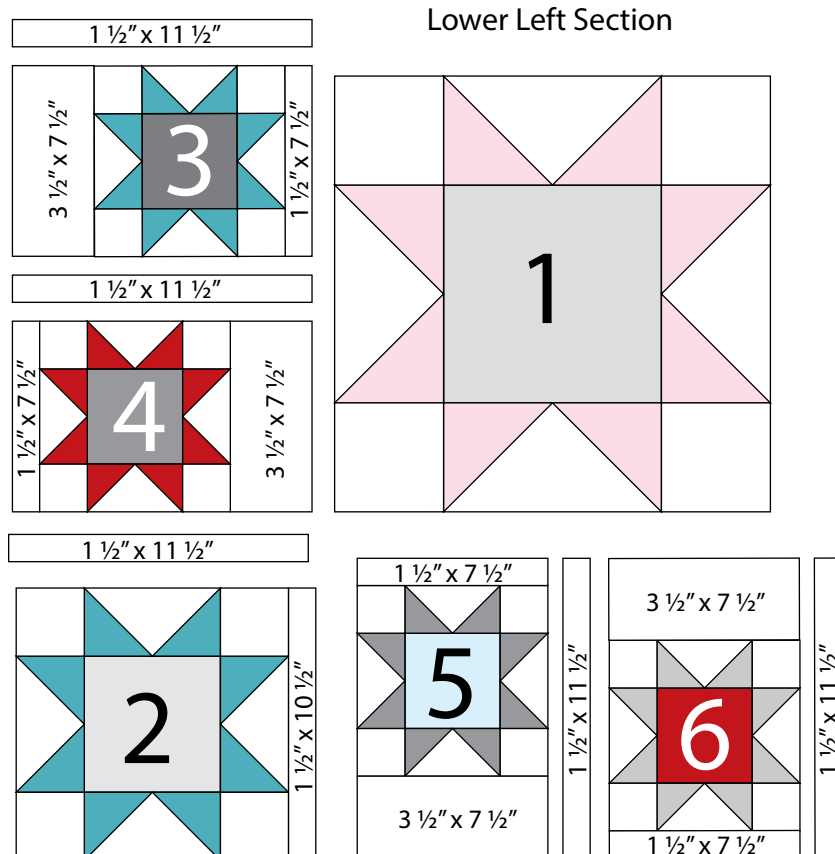

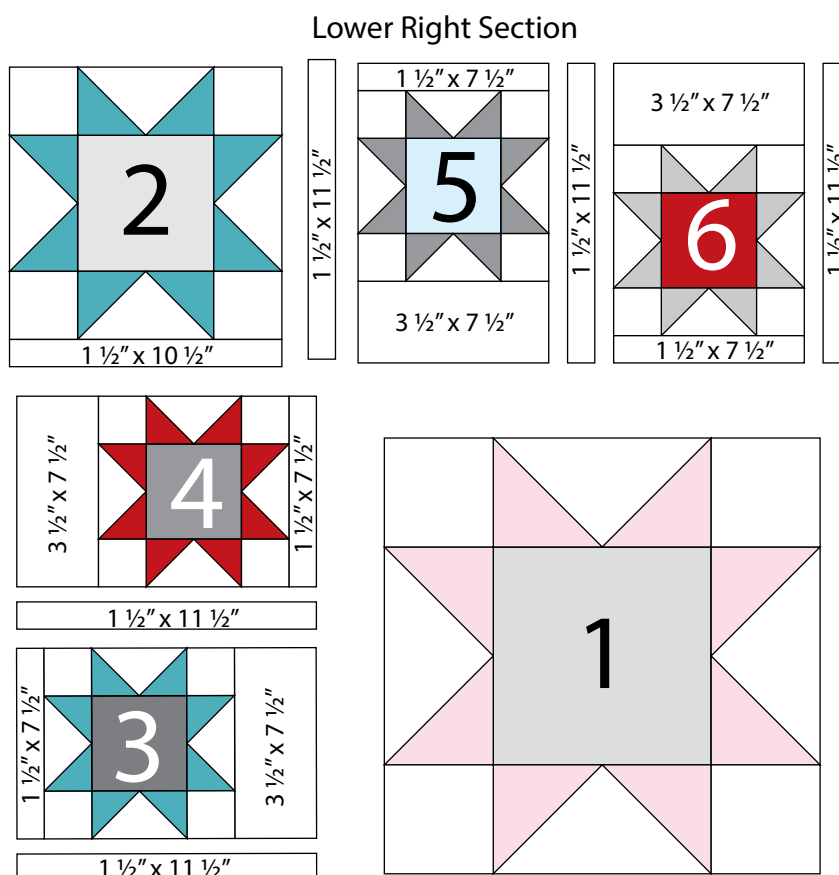

17. Sew the (4) sections together to make the Center Block.

18. Sew (1) 2" x 54 ½" Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 57 ½" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

19. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 57 ½" Fabric L strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 65 ½" Fabric L strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

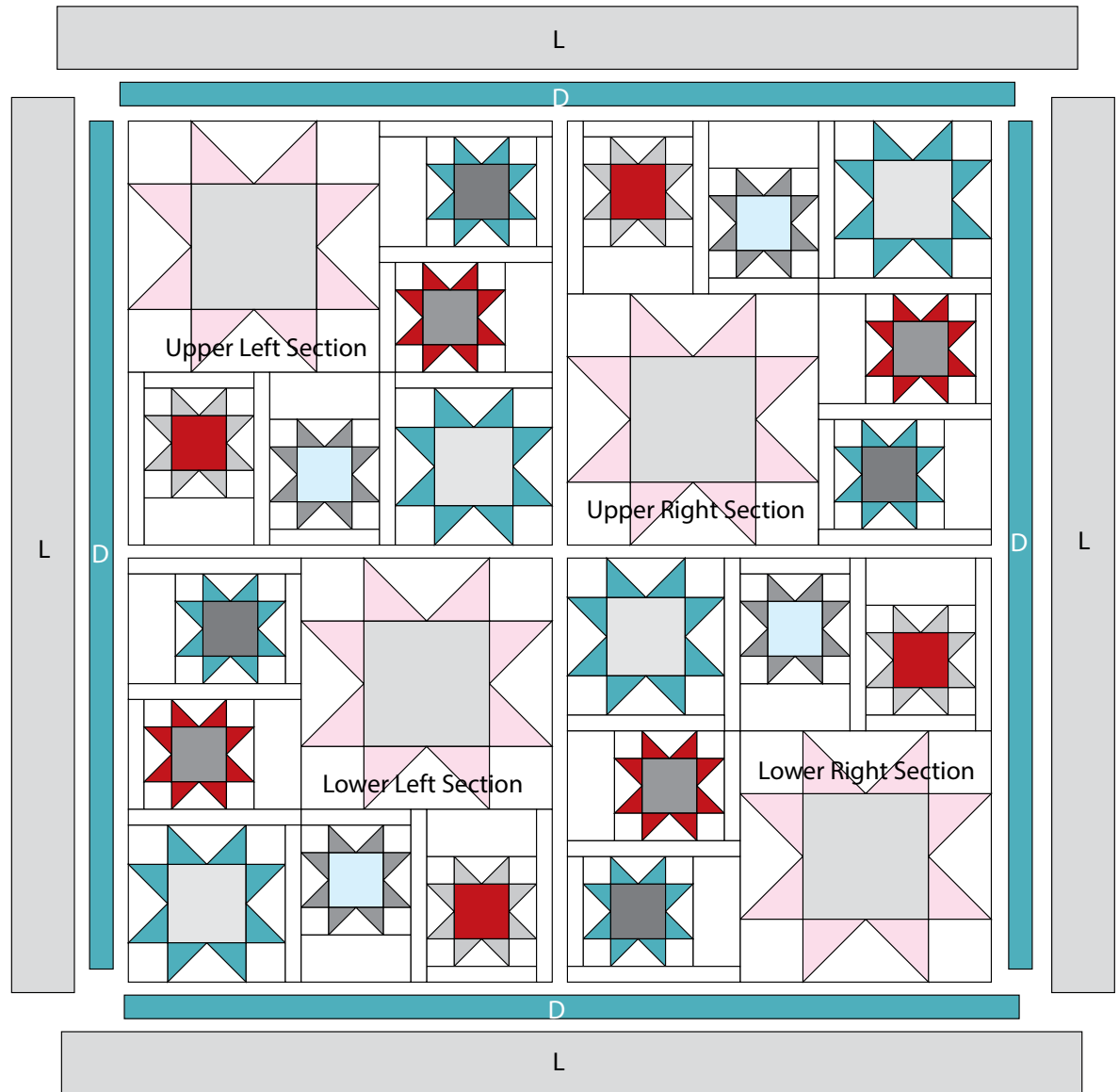
## Layering, Quilting and Finishing

20. Press the quilt top and 73" x 73" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

## Binding

21. Cut the ends of the (7) Fabric D binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

22. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
