Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (4722P-98 30" Panel – Black/Red):

- Fussy cut (1) 25 ½" x 20 ½" large panel.
- Fussy cut (4) 11 ½" x 8 ½" small blocks.

Fabric B (4730-88 Chalkboard Words – Red), cut:

- (1) 4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 4" x 20 ½" strips.
- (2) 3" x 32 ½" WOF strips.

Fabric C (4726-90 Trees– Gray), fussy cut:

- (4) 3 ½" squares each centered on a tree.

Fabric D (4725-99 Snowflakes – Black), cut:

- (1) 4 ¼" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 4 ¼" squares.
- (2) 3 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 3 ½" squares.
- (4) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3 ½" x 67 ½" strips.
- (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3 ½" x 58 ½" strips.

Fabric E (4727-1 Candycane – White), cut:

- (1) 4 ¼" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 4 ¼" squares.

Fabric F (4725-1 Snowflakes – White), cut:

- (2) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 4 ½" x 9 ½" strips.

Fabric G (4728-80 Peppermint Stripe – Red), cut:

- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 1 ½" x 9 ½" strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric H (1351-Pewter Just Color! – Pewter), cut:

- (2) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 2" x 9 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 49 ½" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 64 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 52 ½" strips.

Fabric I (1351-Red Delicious Just Color! – Red Delicious):

- (2) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 2" x 8 ½" strips.
- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 1 ½" x 14 ½" strips.
- (5) 1 ¼" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (4) 1 ¼" x 49 ½" strips.

Fabric J (4725-90 Snowflakes – Gray), cut:

- (5) 1 ¾" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (4) 1 ¾" x 49 ½" strips.

Fabric K (4723-98 Border Stripe – Black/Red):

- Fussy cut (2) 6" x 49½" length of fabric LOF strips centered on wide stripe.

Backing (4724-98 Patchwork – Black/Red), cut:

- (2) 66" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 66" x 81" to make the back.

Sewing

Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

1. Sew (1) $4'' \times 20\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric B strip to each side of the $25\frac{1}{2}'' \times 20\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric A large panel. Sew (1) $3'' \times 32\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A large panel. Trim the block to measure $31\frac{1}{2}'' \times 24\frac{1}{2}''$ to make (1) Block One rectangle (Fig. 1).
2. Sew (1) $2'' \times 8\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric I strip to each side of (1) $11\frac{1}{2}'' \times 8\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric A small block. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 14\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A small block. Trim the block to measure $13'' \times 9\frac{1}{2}''$ to make (1) Block Two rectangle (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (4) Block Two rectangles total.

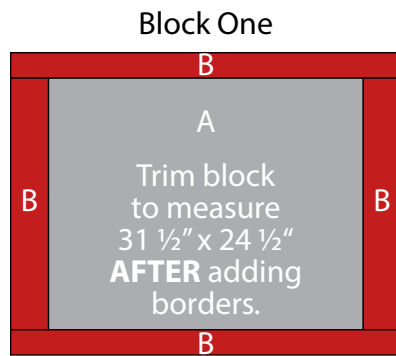

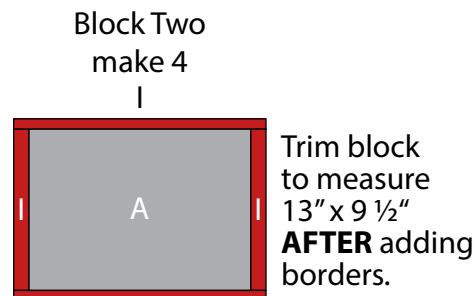

3. Place (1) $4\frac{1}{4}''$ Fabric D square on top of (1) $4\frac{1}{4}''$ Fabric E square, right side together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 3). Sew $\frac{1}{4}''$ away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 3). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line to make (2) half-square triangles (Fig. 4). Trim the blocks to measure $3\frac{7}{8}''$ square (Fig. 5).

4. Place (1) half-square triangle from Step 3 on top of another half-square triangle, right sides together. Make sure the center seam is going in the same direction on both half-square triangles and the Fabric D triangle in the top block is opposite from the Fabric D triangle in the bottom block (Fig. 6).

5. Draw a diagonal line across the top half-square triangle so that it goes through the sewn seam. Sew $\frac{1}{4}''$ away from both sides of the drawn line (Fig. 7). Cut on the drawn line to make (2) quarter-square triangles. Trim the blocks to measure $3\frac{1}{2}''$ square to make (2) Unit 1 squares (Fig. 8).

6. Repeat Steps 3-5 to make (16) Unit 1 squares total.

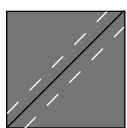

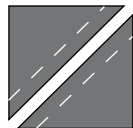

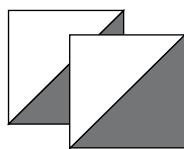

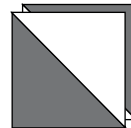

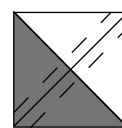

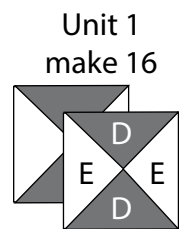

7. Sew (1) 3 ½" Fabric D square to each side of (1) Unit 1 square, along the Fabric E sides to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 1 square to each side (1) 3 ½" Fabric C square with the Fabric D sides touching the Fabric C square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together to make (1) Block Three square (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (4) Block Three squares total.

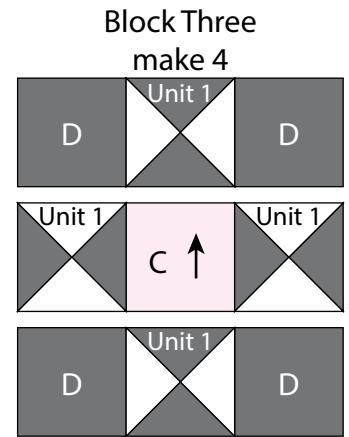

8. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 9 ½" Fabric G strip to each side of (1) Block Three square. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 9 ½" Fabric F strip to each side of the sewn strip. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 9 ½" Fabric G strip to each side of the new strip. Sew (1) 2" x 9 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of the sewn strip to make (1) Unit 2 strip (Fig. 10). Repeat to make a second Unit 2 strip.

9. Repeat Step 8 but sew the Fabric G, F, G and H strips to the top and to the bottom of (1) Block Three square to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 11). Repeat to make a second Unit 3 strip.

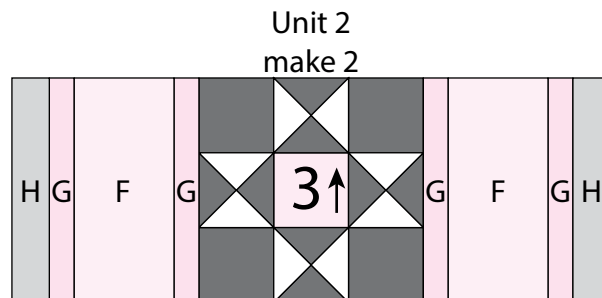

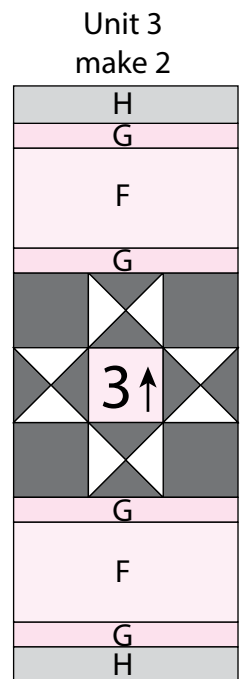

10. Sew (1) 1 ¼" x 49 ½" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) 6" x 49 ½" Fabric K strip. Sew (1) 1 ¾" x 49 ½" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the new strip to make (1) Unit 4 strip (Fig. 12). Repeat to make a second Unit 4 strip.

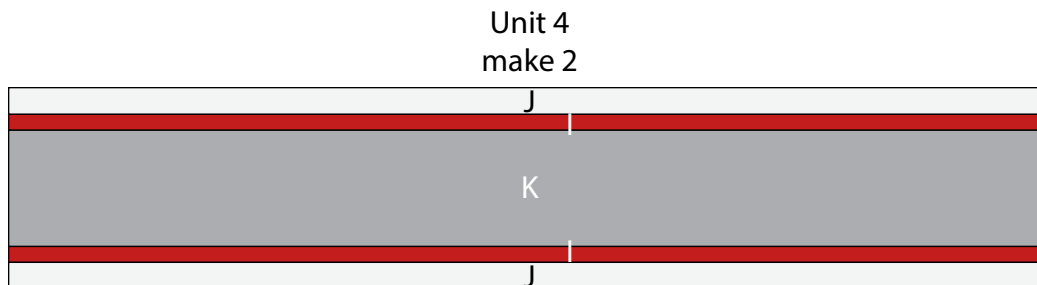

11. Sew (1) Block Two rectangle to each end of (1) Unit 2 strip. Sew (1) 2" x 49 1/2" Fabric H strip to the top of the new strip to make Row Two.

12. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to each side of the Block One rectangle to make Row Three.

13. Sew (1) Block Two rectangle to each end of (1) Unit 2 strip. Sew (1) 2" x 49 1/2" Fabric H strip to the bottom of the new strip to make Row Four.

14. Sew (1) Unit 4 strip, Row Two, Row Three, Row Four and (1) Unit 4 strip together lengthwise and in that order to make the Center Block.

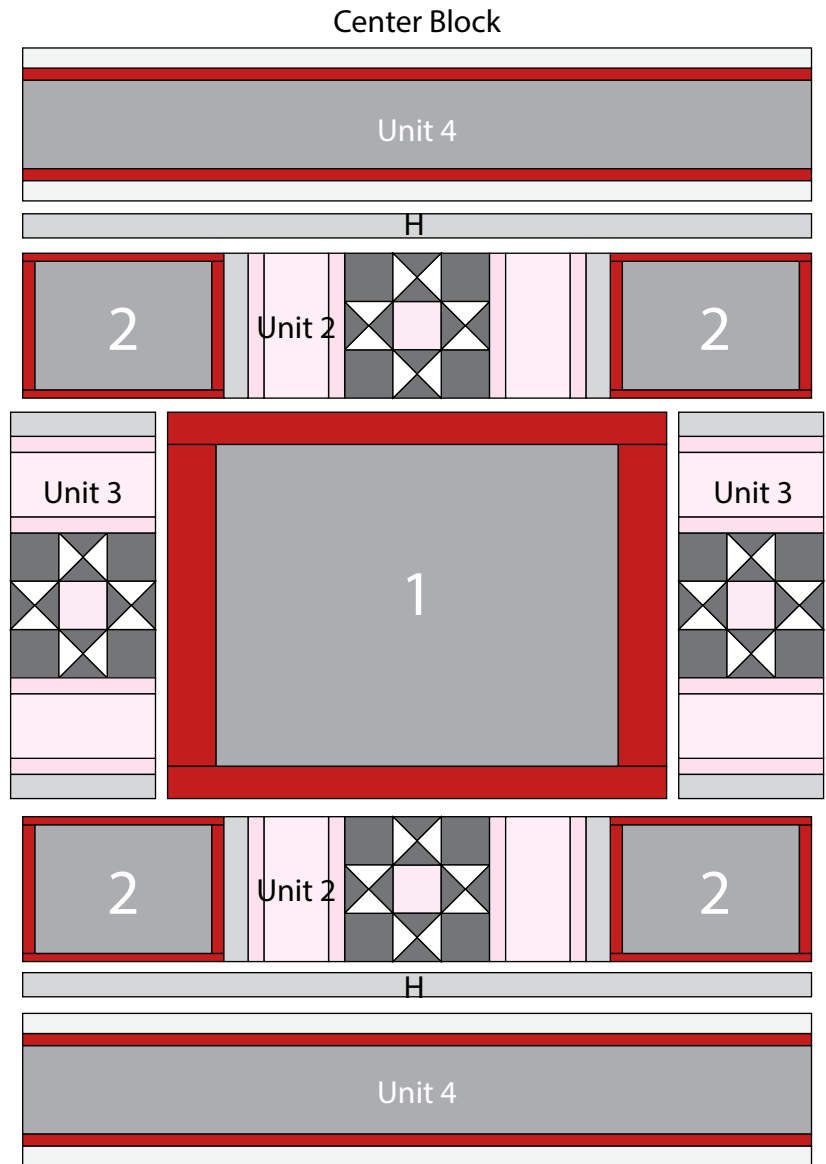

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

15. Sew (1) 2" x 64 1/2" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 52 1/2" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

16. Sew (1) 3 1/2" x 67 1/2" Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 3 1/2" x 58 1/2" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

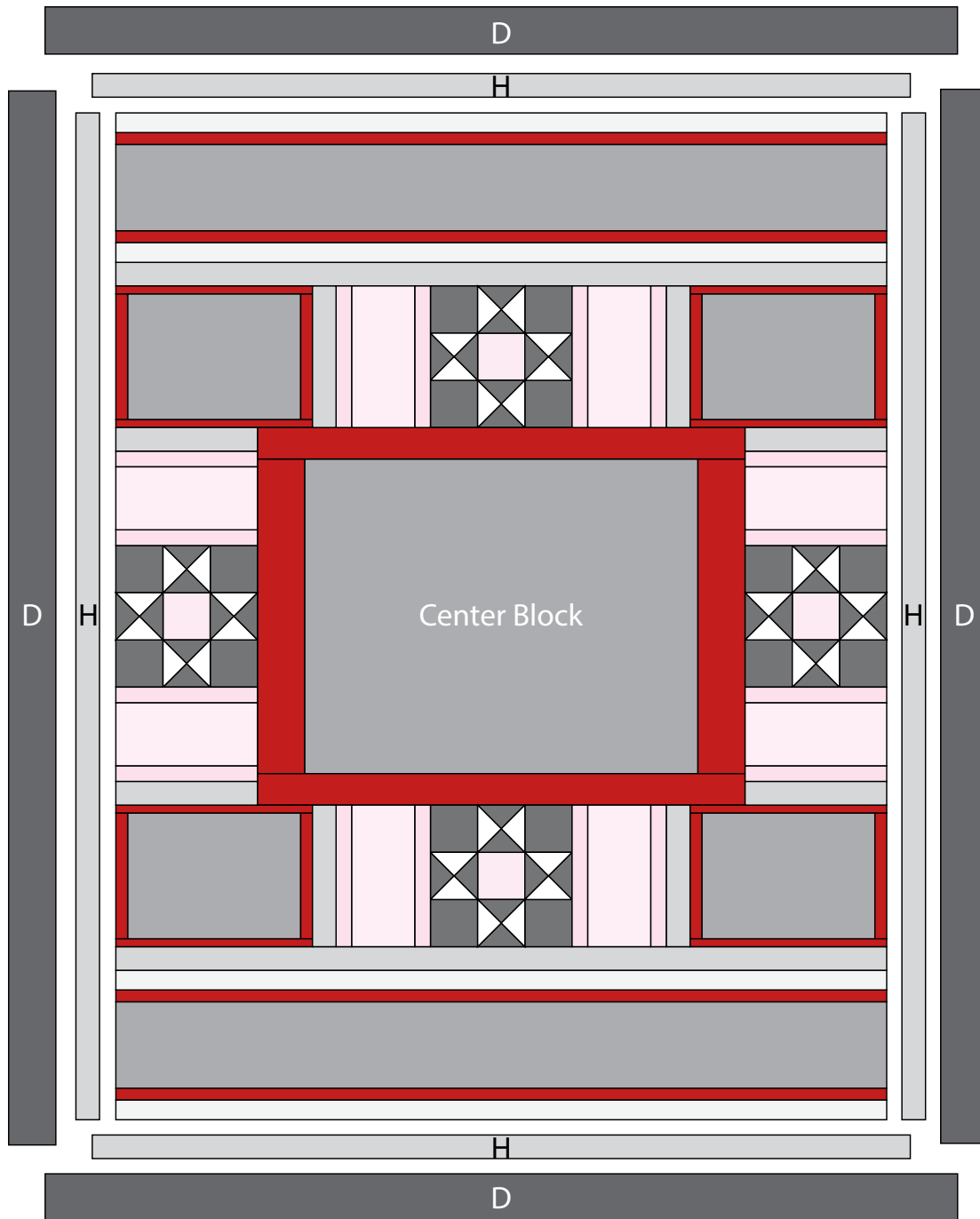
Layering, Quilting and Finishing

17. Press the quilt top and 66" x 81" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

18. Cut the ends of the (7) Fabric G binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

19. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
