



# Cutting

# **Cutting Instructions**

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

# Fabric A (5800P-98 Birthstone Panel – Multi):

• Fussy cut (1) 32 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 41 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" rectangle, centered on the panel.

# Fabric B (1351-Iron Just Color! - Iron), cut:

- (3) 4 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 4 1/2" x 48 1/2" strips.
- (2) 4 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 40 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" WOF strips.
- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4 ½" squares.
- (7) 4 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (4) 4 1/2" x 72" strips.
- (2) 2" x 41 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 2" x 35 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 46 1/2" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 40 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 56 1/2" strips.
- (3) 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 50 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" strips.

# Fabric C (5799-90 Birthstone – Diamond), cut:

- (3) 2 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 43 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" strips.
- (2) 2" x 38 ½" WOF strips.
- See instructions to cut (1) Half-Circle.

# Fabric D (5799-71 Birthstone – Zircon), cut:

- (3) 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 58 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" strips.
- (3)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 52  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (4) 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x 70 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" strips.
- (4) 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x 64" strips.
- (8)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips for the binding.
- See instructions to cut (1) Half-Circle.

# Fabric E (5797-98 Large Gemstones – Multi):

• Apply fusible web to the wrong side of the fabric and fussy cut (4) 3" circles, each centered on a gemstone.

# Fabric F (5798-98 Tossed Gemstones All-Over – Black), cut:

- (3) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5 ½" x 60 ½" strips.
- (4) 5  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 62  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

# Fabric G (5799-11 Birthstone – Aquamarine), cut:

• See instructions to cut (1) Half-Circle.

# Fabric H (5799-55 Birthstone – Amethyst), cut:

• See instructions to cut (2) Half-Circles.

# Fabric I (5799-66 Birthstone – Emerald), cut:

• See instructions to cut (3) Half-Circles.

# Fabric J (5799-22 Birthstone – Tourmaline), cut:

• See instructions to cut (2) Half-Circles.

# Fabric K (5799-89 Birthstone – Garnet), cut:

• See instructions to cut (2) Half-Circles.

# Fabric L (5799-43 Birthstone – Citrine), cut:

• See instructions to cut (2) Half-Circles.

# Fabric M (5799-77 Birthstone – Sapphire), cut:

• See instructions to cut (2) Half-Circles.

### Fabric N (5799-64 Birthstone – Peridot), cut:

• See instructions to cut (2) Half-Circles.

### Fabric O (5799-51 Birthstone – Alexandrite), cut:

• See instructions to cut (2) Half-Circles.

### Fabric P (5799-82 Birthstone – Ruby), cut:

• See instructions to cut (2) Half-Circles.

# Backing (5798-98 Tossed Gemstones All-Over - Black), cut:

• (2) 88" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 80" x 88" to make the back.

# Sewing

Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.


# **Block Assembly** *Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components.*

1. Sew (1) 2" x 41 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the 32 ½" x 41 ½" Fabric A panel. Sew (1) 2" x 35 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 34 ½" x 43 ½"**.

2. Refer to Figure 2 to arrange and press (1) Fabric E circle onto (1) 4 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" Fabric B square.

3. Finish the raw edges of each circle with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to make (1) Unit 1 square.

4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (4) Unit 1 squares total.





5. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about 1/8" outside the drawn lines.


6. Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.



10. Repeat Steps 7-8 and refer to Figure 5 for fabric identification, placement and orientation while using (5) assorted half-circles, (1)  $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " x  $40 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip and (2) Unit 1 squares to make the Top Border.



11. Repeat Steps 7-8 and refer to Figure 6 for fabric identification, placement and orientation while using (5) assorted half-circles, (1) 4 ½" x 40 ½" Fabric B strip and (2) Unit 1 squares to make the Bottom Border.

# **Quilt Top Assembly**

# (Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

12. Sew (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$  x 43  $\frac{1}{2}$  Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 38  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

13. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 46 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 40 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

14. Sew the Left Border and Right Side Border to the left and to the right sides of the Center Block. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.


15. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 56 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 50 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

16. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 58 ½" Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 52 ½" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

17. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 60 ½" Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 62 ½" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

18. Sew (1) 1 ¼" x 70 ½" Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ¼" x 64" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

19. Sew (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x 72" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x 72" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.


# Layering, Quilting and Finishing

20. Press the quilt top and 80" x 88" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

# Binding

21. Cut the ends of the (8) Fabric D binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

22. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
