



Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (5808-98 Small Hearts - Black Multi), cut:

- (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ x 57" strip from the LOF.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (1) 18 ½" diameter circle

Fabric B, (5805-98 Large Circles - Black Multi) cut:

• (2) 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (1) 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 57" strip.

Fabric C, (5812-28 Polka Dots - Fuchsia) cut:

• (2) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (1) 3 ½" x 57" strips.

Fabric D (5812-64 Polka Dots - Lime), cut:

- (1) $20 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 57" strip from the LOF for the lining.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (1) 18 ½" diameter circle

Fabric E (5813-77 Tonal Tossed Numbers - Royal), cut:


• (1) 4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (2) 4" x 10" strips.

Sewing

Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Bag Assembly

- 1. To make the handles, fold in the short ends of (1) 4" x 10" Fabric E strip a $\frac{1}{4}$ " and top stitch in place to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 1). Repeat to make a second Unit 1 strip.
- 2. Fold (1) 4" x 10" strip in half lengthwise and press (Fig. 2). Open the folded fabric and fold each long edge to the creased centerline and press (Fig. 3).
- 3. Fold the pressed fabric in half again and press to make one $1" \times 10"$ strip (Fig. 4). Top stitch down both long sides 1/8" in from the edge to make (1) Handle (Fig. 5).
- 4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make a second Fabric E Handle.



5. Sew the $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 57" Fabric A strip to the bottom of the 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 57" Fabric B strip lengthwise. Sew the 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 57" Fabric C strip to the top of the Fabric B strip lengthwise to make (1) $20 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 57" Outer Bag strip (Fig. 6).




- 6. Pin the Outer Bag strip to the edge of the 18 ½" Fabric A circle overlapping the edges a ¼" and mark (Fig. 7). Unpin the Outer Bag Strip from the circle. Trim the Outer Bag Strip if needed.
- 7. Trim the 20 ½" x 57" Fabric D lining strip to match the Outer Bag Strip and set aside.
- 8. Fold the trimmed Outer Bag strip right sides together to align the short ends. Sew the two short ends together to make a tube (Fig. 8).



9. Pin the Fabric A circle back to the Outer Bag strip along the Fabric A edge, right sides together. Sew the (2) pieces together to make the Outer Bag (Fig. 9).









Fig. 10



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

- 10. Position and pin (1) Handle to each side of the Outer Bag. Topstitch the handles in place (Fig. 10).
- 11. Sew the two short ends of the Lining strip trimmed in Step 7, together to make a tube, leaving a 4" opening in the side seam for turning.
- 12. Pin the $18 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D circle to the Lining tube, right sides together. Sew the (2) pieces together to form the Lining.
- 13. Place the Lining and Outer Bag, right sides together, make sure to tuck the handles inside and out of the way of the seam. Align the top raw edges of Outer Bag with the Lining and pin the (2) pieces together. Sew around the top edge.
