(H) 5601-77	1 ⅔ yards

## Fabrics in the Collection



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# **Cutting**

#### **Cutting Instructions**

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

#### Fabric A (5598-17 Diamond Medallion - Sky/Multi):

• Fussy cut (21) 9 3/4" squares, each centered on a medallion.

#### Fabric B (5599-77 Large Medallion Allover - Indigo/Multi), cut:

• (1) 9 3/4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 9 3/4" squares.

#### Fabric C (5600-17 Paisley Allover - Sky/Multi), cut:

• (4) 9 ¾" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 9 ¾" squares.

#### Fabric D (5605-77 Scroll Mini - Indigo/Multi), cut:

- (3)  $1 \frac{5}{8}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2)  $1 \frac{5}{8}$ " x 52  $\frac{3}{4}$ " strips.
- (3)  $1 \frac{1}{8}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2)  $1 \frac{1}{8}$ " x 55" strips.
- See instructions to cut (32) Template 1's.

#### Fabric E (1351-Grape Just Color! - Grape), cut:

- (3)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 55" strips.
- (3)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 57" strips.
- See instructions to cut (16) Template 1's.

#### Fabric F (1351-Grass Just Color! - Grass), cut:

• (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips.

#### Fabric G (5605-17 Scroll Mini - Sky/Multi), cut:

• (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips.

#### Fabric H (5601-77 Blooming Paisley - Indigo/Multi), cut:

- (2) 5 ½" x 57" LOF strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 5 ½" x 67" strips, piece as needed.

#### Fabric I (5603-11 Hexie Medallion - Rainbow/Multi), cut:

• (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### Back (5602-77 Mini Mandala - Indigo/Multi), cut:

• (2) 75" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 75" x 75" to make the back.




Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.


#### **Block Assembly**

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.


- 1. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace (64) Template 1's onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about 1/8" outside the drawn lines.
- 2. Press (32) prepared templates onto the wrong side of the Fabric D yardage and (16) prepared templates onto the Fabric E yardage. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.
- 3. Sew (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF Fabric F strip to the left side of (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF Fabric G strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (4) Unit 1 strips total.
- 4. Align (16) prepared templates onto the Unit 1 strips as shown in Figure 2. Cut out each template on the drawn lines to make (16) Unit 2 shapes.



- 5. Sew (1) 9 ¾" Fabric A square to each side and the top of (1) 9 ¾" Fabric C square to make Row One.
- 6. Repeat Step 5 and refer to Figure 3 for fabric identification, location and orientation to make Row Two through Row Seven.
- 7. Sew the (7) Rows from Steps 5-6 together, in numerical order from top to bottom, to make (1) Unit 3 block.



8. Follow Figure 4 and trim the Unit 3 block to measure 52 ¾" x 52 ¾" to make (1) Unit 4 square.

- 9. Refer to the Figure 5 to arrange and press the (64) assorted Template 1 shapes onto the Unit 4 square.
- 10. Finish the raw edges of each shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to make the Center Block.



#### **Quilt Top Assembly**

#### (Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

- 11. Sew (1) 1  $\frac{5}{8}$ " x 52  $\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1  $\frac{5}{8}$ " x 55" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 12. Sew (1) 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 55" Fabric E strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 57" Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.


13. Sew (1) 5  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 57" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 67" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

#### Layering, Quilting and Finishing


14. Press the quilt top and 75" x 75" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

#### **Binding**

- 15. Cut the ends of the (7) Fabric I binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.
- 16. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
