## Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.
WOF = Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric
Fabric A (1351-Pigment White Just Color! - Pigment White), cut:

- (1) $101 / 2 "$ x $301 / 22^{\prime \prime}$ WOF strip.
- (2) $57 / 8$ " x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) $57 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares.

Fabric B (6092-22 Medium Floral - Pink), cut:

- (1) 5 7/8" square.
- See instructions to cut (1) Letter "h".

Fabric C (1351-Slate Just Color! - Slate), cut:

- (1) $57 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ square.
- (4) $21 / 2$ " x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric D (6099-44 Daisy Toss - Light Gold), cut:

- (1) $57 / 8 "$ x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) $57 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares.
- See instructions to cut (1) Letter " $S$ " and (1) Letter " $h$ ".

Fabric E (6095-2 Butterfly Toss - Multi), cut:

- (1) $57 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ square.
- See instructions to cut (1) Letter "h".

Fabric F (6092-11 Medium Floral - Aqua), cut:

- (1) $57 / 8$ " square.

Fabric G (6096-22 Hopping Bunnies - Pink), cut:

- (1) $57 / 8$ " square.

Fabric H (6097-1 Rainbows - Multi), cut:

- (1) $57 / 8$ " square.

Fabric I (6099-11 Daisy Toss - Aqua), cut:

- (1) $57 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ square.
- See instructions to cut (1) Letter "h".

Fabric J (6094-22 Ditsy Floral - Pink), cut:

- (1) $57 / 8$ " square.
- See instructions to cut (1) Letter "h".

Fabric K (6100-22 Tiny Floral Toss - Pink), cut:

- (1) $57 / 8$ " square.
- See instructions to cut (1) Exclamation Point Top and (1) Exclamation Point Bottom.

Fabric L (6095-77 Butterfly Toss - Teal), cut:

- (1) $57 / 8$ " square.

Fabric M (6093-21 Texture Stripe - Multi), cut:

- (2) 2 " x $301 / 2$ " WOF strips.
- (2) 2 " x $331 / 2$ " WOF strips.

Backing (6097-1 Rainbows - Multi), cut:

- (1) 41" square for the back.

Sew using a $1 \nmid 4$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

## Block Assembly

## Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about $1 / 8$ " outside the drawn lines.
2. Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.
3. Refer to Figure 1 to arrange and press the assorted letters and exclamation point onto the $10 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 301 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A strip.
4. Finish the raw edges of each shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to make the Block One strip (Fig. 1).

5. Place (1) $57 / 8 "$ Fabric B square on top of (1) $57 / 8 "$ Fabric A square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 2). Sew $1 / 4$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 3) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (2) Unit 1 squares (Fig. 4).

6. Repeat Step 5 and refer to Figures 5-14 for fabric identification and placement to make the indicated number of each unit square for Unit 2 through Unit 11.

7. Sew (1) Unit 1 square to the left side of (1) Unit 2 square to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to the left side of (1) Unit 4 square to make the bottom row. Sew together the (2) rows lengthwise to make (1) $101 / 2$ " Block Two square (Fig. 15). Repeat to make a second Block Two square.

8. Repeat Step 7 and refer to Figures 16-17 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (2) Block Three squares and (2) Block Four squares.

9. Sew together (1) Block Two square, (1) Block Three square and (1) Block Four square, in that order from left to right, to make the Top Row. Repeat to make the Bottom Row. Sew the Top Row and Bottom Row to the top and to the bottom of the Block One strip lengthwise to make the $30 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 301 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Center Block (Fig. 18).

## Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)
10. Sew (1) 2" x $301 / 2 "$ Fabric M strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x $331 / 2 "$ Fabric M strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

## Layering, Quilting and Finishing

11. Press the quilt top and $41^{\prime \prime} \times 41^{\prime \prime}$ backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

## Binding

12. Cut the ends of the (4) Fabric C binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.
13. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
