## Cutting

### Cutting Instructions

*Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.*

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

#### **Fabric A (5545P-67 Bunny Meadow Banner – Emerald):**

- Fussy cut (1) 22 ½" x 42 ½" rectangle centered on the panel.

#### **Fabric B (1351-Royal Just Color! – Royal), cut:**

- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (16) 2 ½" squares.
- (2) 2" x 42 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.
- (2) 2" x 25 ½" WOF strips.
- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 1 ½" x 9 ½" strips.
- (6) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 1 ½" x 11 ½" strips.

#### **Fabric C (5537-11 Bunny Toile de Joy – Blue):**

- Fussy cut (8) 7 ½" squares, each centered on a bunny.

#### **Fabric D (5542-76 Dancing Butterflies – Teal):**

- Fussy cut (4) 4" x WOF strips, sub-cut (32) 4" squares.

#### **Fabric E (5543-66 Plaid Carrot Texture – Spring Green), cut:**

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 2 ½" squares.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 2" x 7 ½" strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### **Fabric F (5539-76 Floral – Teal), cut:**

- (4) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 6 ½" x 67 ½" strips.
- (3) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 6 ½" x 59 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 2 ½" squares.

#### **Fabric G (1351-Pigment White Just Color! – Pigment White), cut:**

- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (52) 2 ½" squares.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 64 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 47 ½" strips.

#### **Fabric H (5544-66 Blocks – Spring Green):**

- Fussy cut (8) 9 ½" squares, each centered on a bunny block.

#### **Backing (5541-9 Critters Tossed Allover – Off-White), cut:**

- (2) 87" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 67" x 87" to make the back.

## Sewing

Sew using a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

### Block Assembly

**Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.**

1. Sew (1)  $2'' \times 42\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric B strip to each side of the  $22\frac{1}{2}'' \times 42\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric A panel. Sew (1)  $2'' \times 25\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel to make the Center Block (Fig. 1).

**Trim the block to measure  $24\frac{1}{2}'' \times 44\frac{1}{2}''$ .**

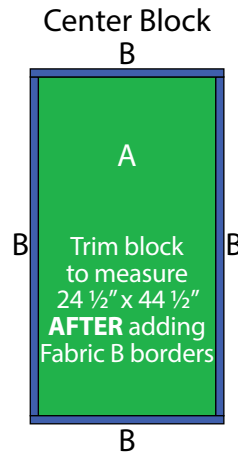

2. Sew (1)  $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 9\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric B strip to each side of (1)  $9\frac{1}{2}'' \times 9\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric H square. Sew (1)  $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 11\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric H square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 2). **Trim the block to measure  $10\frac{1}{2}'' \times 10\frac{1}{2}''$ .** Repeat to make (8) Block One squares total.

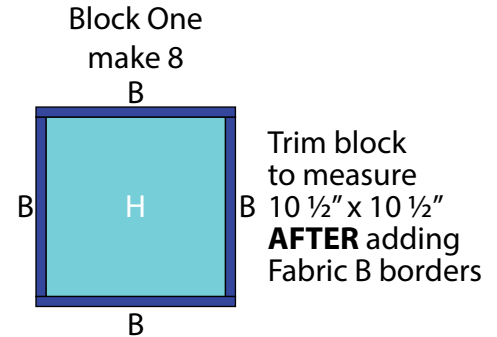

3. Follow Figure 3 and sew together (5)  $2\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric G squares, (2)  $2\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric E squares, (2)  $2\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric B squares and (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric F square into a  $2 \times 5$  matrix to make (1) Block Two rectangle. Repeat to make (4) Block Two rectangles total.

4. Follow Figure 4 and sew together (8)  $2\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric G squares, (4)  $2\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric E squares, (2)  $2\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric B squares and (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric F square into a  $3 \times 5$  matrix to make (1) Block Three rectangle. Repeat to make (4) Block Three rectangles total.

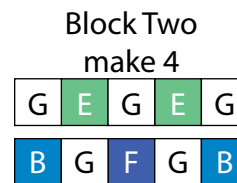

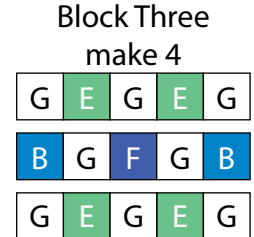

5. Place (1)  $4''$  Fabric D square on the top left corner of (1)  $7\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric C square, right sides together (Fig. 5). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 5). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle  $\frac{1}{4}''$  away from the sewn seam (Fig. 6).

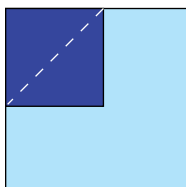

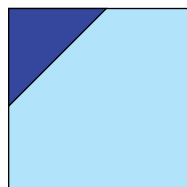

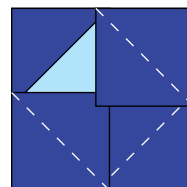

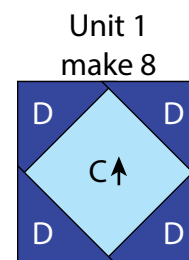

6. Follow Figure 7 for the seam direction to add a  $4''$  Fabric D square to each of the remaining corners of the  $7\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric C square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 8).

7. Repeat Steps 5-6 to make (8) Unit 1 squares total.

8. Sew (1) 2" x 7 ½" Fabric E strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square to make (1) Block Four rectangle (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (4) Block Four rectangles total.

9. Sew (1) 2" x 7 ½" Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) Unit 1 square to make (1) Block Five rectangle (Fig. 10). Repeat to make (4) Block Five rectangles.

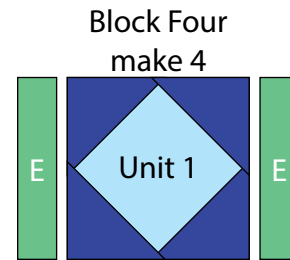

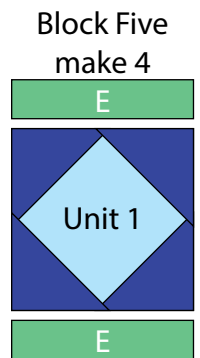

10. Sew (1) Block Three rectangle to the top and to the bottom of (1) Block One square. Sew (1) Block Four rectangle to the top and to the bottom of the newly sewn strip. Sew (1) Block Two rectangle to the top and to the bottom of the newly sewn strip to make (1) Side Border (Fig. 11). Repeat to make a second Side Border.

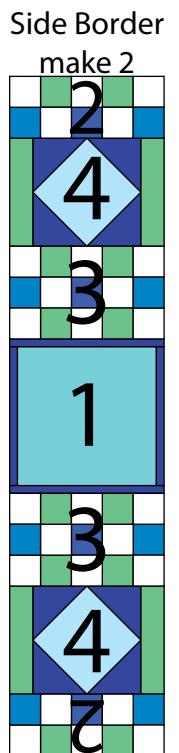

11. Sew together (3) Block One squares and (2) Block Five rectangles, lengthwise and alternating them from left to right, to make the Top Border (Fig. 12). Repeat to make the Bottom Border.

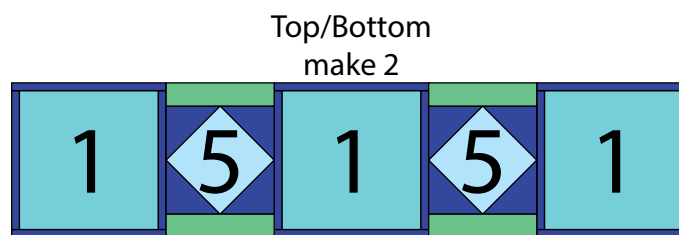

## Quilt Top Assembly

*(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)*

12. Sew (1) Side Border to each side of the Center Block. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and bottom of the Center Block.

13. Sew (1) 2" x 64 ½" Fabric G strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 47 ½" Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

14. Sew (1) 6 ½" x 67 ½" Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 6 ½" x 59 ½" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.



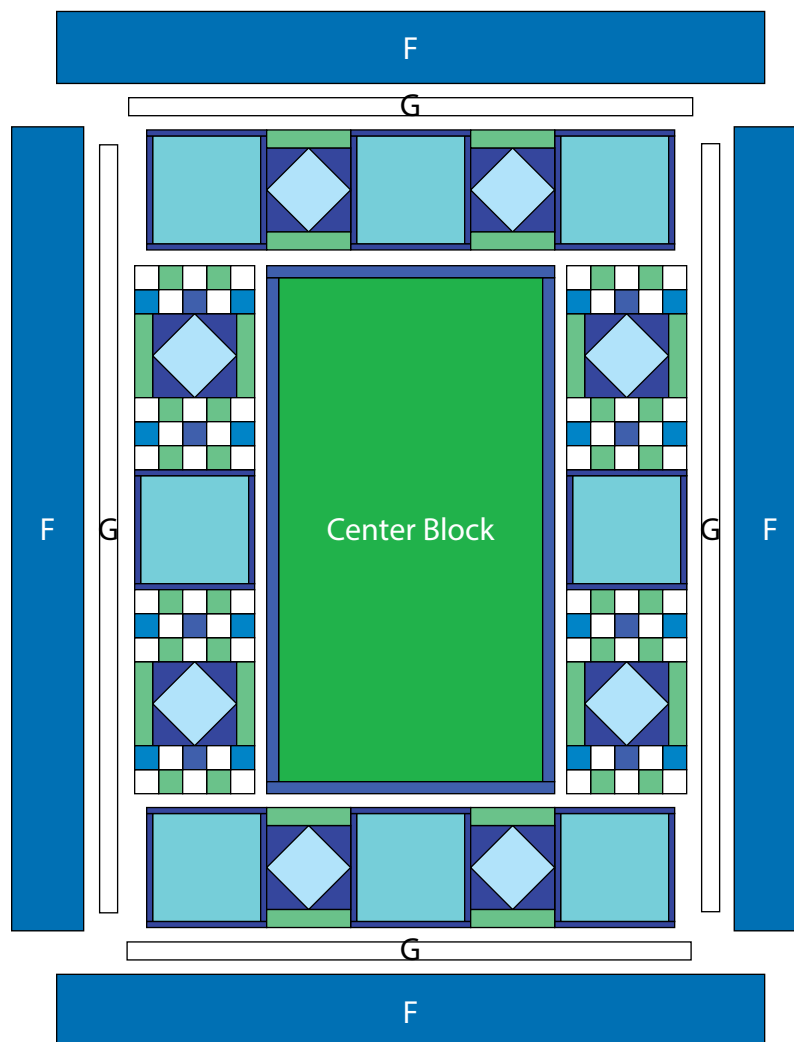
## Layering, Quilting and Finishing

15. Press the quilt top and 67" x 87" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

## Binding

16. Cut the ends of the (7) Fabric E binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

17. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
