

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# Cutting

#### **Cutting Instructions**

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

#### Fabric A (5917-33 Rainbow Medallion - Cream):

- Fussy cut (8) 4 ½" squares, each centered on a medallion.
- (5) 1 34" x WOF strips, sub-cut (18) 1 34" x 10" strips.
- (6) 1 ¾" x WOF strips, sub-cut (18) 1 ¾" x 12 ½" strips.

#### Fabric B (5919-77 Wildflower Allover - Royal), cut:

- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (128) 2 ½" squares.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 2" x 8 ½" strips.
- (6) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 2" x 11 ½" strips.
- (1) 1 ¼" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 1 ¼" x 8 ½" strips. (1) 1 ¼" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 1 ¼" x 10" strips.
- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### Fabric C (5923-55 Mini Wildflowers - Fuchsia), cut:

- (4) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (32) 4 ½" squares.
  (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (32) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.
- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (64) 2 ½" squares.

#### Fabric D (5916-17 Tiny Butterflies - Aqua), cut:

• (4) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (32) 4 ½" squares.

#### Fabric E (1351-Cream Just Color! - Cream), cut:

- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (128) 2 ½" squares.
- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (64) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

#### Fabric F (1351-Forest Just Color! -Forest), cut:

• (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (32) 2 ½" squares.

#### Fabric G (5922-77 Butterfly Ombre Stripe - Royal Blue), cut:

• (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 4 ½" squares.

#### Fabric H (5919-17 Wildflower Allover - Aqua), cut:

• (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (128) 2 ½" squares.

#### Fabric I (5916-77 Tiny Butterflies - Royal Blue), cut:

- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (32) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.
- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (64) 2 ½" squares.

#### Fabric J (5923-44 Mini Wildflowers - Yellow), cut:

• (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (32) 2 ½" squares.

#### Fabric K (5914-77 Butterfly Blocks -Royal):

• Fussy cut (8) 8 ½" squares, each centered on a block.

#### Fabric L (1351-Grass Just Color! - Grass), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 60 ½" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 63 ½" strips.

#### Fabric M (5920-17 Butterfly Border Stripe - Aqua), cut:

• (4) 9 ½" x 85" LOF strips.

#### Fabric N (5915-11 Medium Butterfly Allover - Rainbow Multi), cut:

• (1) 8 ½" square.

#### Backing (5919-11 Wildflower Allover - Rainbow/Multi), cut:

• (3) 89" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 89" x 89" to make the back.




Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

#### **Block Assembly**

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

- 1. Sew (1) 2" x 8 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 8 ½" Fabric K square. Sew (1) 2" x 11 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric K square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). **Trim the unit to measure 10" x 10"**. Repeat to make (8) Unit 1 squares total.
- 2. Sew (1) 1  $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 10" Fabric A strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square. Sew (1) 1  $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 12  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (8) Block One squares total.
- 3. Sew (1) 1  $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 8  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 8  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric N square. Sew (1) 1  $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 10" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric N square to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 3).
- 4. Sew (1) 1  $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 10" Fabric A strip to each side of the Unit 2 square. Sew (1) 1  $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 12  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 2 square to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 4).



- 5. Place (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B square on the top left corner of (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square, right sides together (Fig. 5). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 5). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam (Fig. 6).
- 6. Follow Figure 7 for the seam direction to add a 2 ½" Fabric B square to each of the remaining corners of the 4 ½" Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 3 square (Fig. 8).
- 7. Repeat Steps 5-6 to make (8) Unit 3 squares total.






8. Repeat Steps 5-6 and refer to Figures 9-11 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (8) Unit 4 squares, (32) Unit 5 squares and (32) Unit 6 squares.







- 9. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric B square on the left side of (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 12). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 12). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance (Fig. 13).
- 10. Place another 2 ½" Fabric B square on the right side of the 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 14). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 14). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 7 strip (Fig. 15).
- 11. Repeat Steps 9-10 to make (32) Unit 7 strips total.

12. Repeat Steps 9-10 and refer to Figures 16-18 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (32) of each unit strip for Unit 8 through Unit 10.

- 13. Sew (1) Unit 7 strip to the top of (1) Unit 8 strip lengthwise with the Fabric C segments touching to make (1) 4 ½" Unit 11 square (Fig. 19). Repeat to make (32) Unit 11 squares total.
- 14. Sew (1) Unit 9 strip to the top of (1) Unit 10 strip lengthwise with the Fabric I segments touching to make (1) 4 ½" Unit 12 square (Fig. 20). Repeat to make (32) Unit 12 squares total.





- 15. Sew (1) Unit 5 square to each side of (1) Unit 11 square to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 11 square to each side of (1) Unit 3 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 12 1/2" Block Three square (Fig. 21). Repeat to make (8) Block Three squares total.
- 16. Sew (1) Unit 6 square to each side of (1) Unit 12 square to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 12 square to each side of (1) Unit 4 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 12 1/2" Block Four square (Fig. 22). Repeat to make (8) Block Four squares total.
- 17. Sew together (1) Block Three square, (1) Block Four square, (1) Block One square, (1) Block Four square and (1) Block Three square, in that order from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 23).
- 18. Repeat Step 17 and refer to Figure 23 for component identification, placement and orientation to make Row Two through Row Five.
- 19. Sew together the (5) Rows from Steps 17-18, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the Center Block (Fig. 23).







## **Quilt Top Assembly**

## (Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

- 20. Sew 2" x 60 ½" Fabric L strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 63 ½" Fabric L strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 21. Center (1) 9 ½" x 85" Fabric M strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ¼" from the top edge of the block and stop a ¼" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.
- 22. Repeat Step 21 to sew (1) 9 ½" x 85" Fabric M strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start 1/4" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 24).
- 23. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 24), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.



## Layering, Quilting and Finishing

24. Press the quilt top and 89" x 89" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

## **Binding**

- 25. Cut the ends of the (8) Fabric B binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.
- 26. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
