



Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (4711-33 Zig Zag Tex – Cream), cut:

- (3) 4" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 4" squares.
- (1) 4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 2 ¼" x 4" strips.
- (1) 2 ¼" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 2 ¼" squares.

Fabric B (4711-99 Zig Zag Tex – Black), cut:

- (2) 4" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 4" squares.
- (2) 2 ¹/₄" x WOF strips, sub-cut (32) 2 ¹/₄" squares.

Fabric C (4712-32 Quatrefoil - Cream/Pink), cut:

- (4) 4" x WOF strips, sub-cut (32) 4" squares.
- (1) 4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (16) 2 ¼" x 4" strips.
- (1) 2 ¼" x WOF strip, sub-cut (16) 2 ¼" squares.

Fabric D (4712-37 Quatrefoil - Cream/Blue), cut:

- (3) 4" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 4" squares.
- (1) 4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (16) 2 ¼" x 4" strips.
- (2) 2 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (20) 2 ¼" squares and (4) 2 ¼" x 4" strips.

Fabric E (4713-33 Butterfly Blocks - Cream), cut:

• (5) 6 ¹/₂" x WOF strips, sub-cut (26) 6 ¹/₂" squares.

Fabric F (4714-25 Medallion – Fuchsia), cut:

- (2) 4" x WOF strips, sub-cut (15) 4" squares.
- (3) 4" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 4" x 7 1/2" strips.
- (2) 2 ¹/₄" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 2 ¹/₄" squares.

Fabric G (4714-77 Medallion – Blue), cut:

- (3) 4" x WOF strips, sub-cut (21) 4" squares.
- (4) 4" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 4" x 7 1/2" strips.
- (1) 2 ¼" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 2 ¼" squares.

Fabric H (4715-17 Mini Butterfly Toss – Blue), cut:

- (3) 4" x WOF strips, sub-cut (22) 4" squares.
- (1) 4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4" x 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

Fabric I (4715-33 Mini Butterfly Toss - Cream), cut:

• (2) 4" x WOF strips, sub-cut (14) 4" squares.

Fabric J (4715-99 Mini Butterfly Toss – Black), cut:

- (1) 4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (10) 4" squares.
- (3) 2 ¹/₄" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 2 ¹/₄" squares.

Fabric K (4716-37 Butterfly Damask – Cream/Blue), cut:

• (1) 4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (1) 4" square and (8) 2 ¹/₄" squares.

Fabric L (4716-35 Butterfly Damask - Cream/Fuchsia), cut:

- (1) 4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (6) 4" squares.
- (1) 2 ¼" x WOF strip, sub-cut (16) 2 ¼" squares.

Cutting - Continued

Fabric M (1351- Aegean Blue - Just Color! - Aegean Blue), cut:

- (1) 4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (10) 4" squares.
- (1) 2 ¹/₄" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 2 ¹/₄" x 4" strips and (4) 2 ¹/₄" squares.
- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 74 ½" strips.
- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 70 ½" strips.

Fabric N (1351-Lipstick Just Color! – Lipstick), cut:

- (1) 4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (10) 4" squares.
- (1) 4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4" x 7 ½" strips.

Fabric O (1351-Mint Just Color! – Mint), cut:

• (1) 4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 4" squares.

Fabric P (1351-Orange Just Color! - Orange), cut:

• (1) 4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4" squares.

Fabric Q (1351-Red Delicious Just Color! - Red Delicious), cut:

- (1) 4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4" squares.
- (1) 2 ¹/₄" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 2 ¹/₄" x 4" strips.
- (1) 2 ¼" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 2 ¼" squares.

Fabric R (1351-Sunshine Just Color! - Sunshine), cut:

• (1) 4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (6) 4" squares.

Fabric S (1351-Teal Just Color! - Teal), cut:

- (2) 4" x WOF strips, sub-cut (20) 4" squares.
- (1) 4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4" x 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (1) 4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (12) 2 ¼" x 4" strips.
- (1) 2 ¹/₄" x WOF strip, sub-cut (12) 2 ¹/₄" squares.
- (8) $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric T (4710-33 Butterfly Dreams Patchwork - Cream), cut:

- (1) 4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 4" squares.
- (2) 4" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 4" x 7 ½" strips.

Fabric U (1351-Onyx Just Color! - Onyx), cut:

- (2) 8 ¹/₂" x WOF strips, sub-cut (52) 1 ¹/₂" x 8 ¹/₂" strips.
- (2) 6 ¹/₂" x WOF strips, sub-cut (52) 1 ¹/₂" x 6 ¹/₂" strips.

Backing (4710-33 Butterfly Dreams Patchwork - Cream), cut:

• (2) 82" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 82" x 82" to make the back.

Sewing

Sew using a ¹/₄" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.


Block Assembly

1. Place (1) 2 ¼" Fabric B square on the left side of (1) 2 ¼" x 4" Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 2). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance.

2. Place another 2 ¼" Fabric B square on the right side of the 2 ¼" x 4" Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 4).

3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make (12) Unit 1 strips total.

4. Repeat Steps 1-2 and refer to Figure 5 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (4) Unit 2 strips.



Note: Pay attention to the orientation of the units when constructing the quilt blocks.


5. Sew (1) 2 ¹/₄" Fabric D square to each end of (1) Unit 1 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of (1) 4" Fabric B square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together to make (1) Unit 3 square (Fig. 6). Repeat to make (3) Unit 3 squares total. *Note: The Unit 3 squares will be used in Block One, Block Nine and Block Twelve.*

Unit 3 make 3 Unit 4 DUnit 1 DUnit 2 D

6. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric D square to each end of (1) Unit 2 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip to each side of (1) 4" Fabric J square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together to make (1) Unit 4 square (Fig. 7).

7. Sew (1) 4" Fabric J square to the left side of (1) 4" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 4" Fabric A square to the left side of (1) 4" Fabric J square. Sew the (2) rows together lengthwise to make (1) Unit 5 square (Fig. 8). Repeat to make a second Unit 5 square. *Note: The Unit 5 blocks will be used in Block One and Block Nineteen*.


8. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric U strip to each side of (1) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric U strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric E square. Trim the block to measure 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (1) Unit 6 square (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (26) Unit 6 squares total.



9. Place (1) 4" Fabric D square on the left side of (1) 4" x 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip, right sides together (Fig. 10). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 10). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 11). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.


10. Place another 4" Fabric D square on the right side of the 4" x 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip, right sides together (Fig. 12). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 12). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 7 strip (Fig. 13).

11. Repeat Steps 9-10 to make (8) Unit 7 strips total. *Note: (4) Unit 7 strips will be used in Block Two and (4) Unit 7 strips will be used in Block Fourteen.* Unit 7



12. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to the left side of (1) Unit 6 square to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 6 square to the left side of (1) Unit 5 square to make the bottom row. Sew the (2) rows together lengthwise to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 14).

13. Sew (1) 4" Fabric F square to each end of (1) Unit 7 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 7 strip to each side of (1) Unit 4 block to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 15).













Fig. 23 **Block Fourteen** Unit 7 D






Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) NOTE: Pay attention to the block orientations when assembling the Center Block rows.

NOTE: Puy attention to the block orientations when assembling the center block rows

15. Sew together Block One through Block Five, in numerical order, to make Row One.

16. Sew together Block Six through Block Ten, in numerical order, to make Row Two.

17. Sew together Block Eleven through Block Fifteen, in numerical order, to make Row Three.

18. Sew together Block Sixteen through Block Twenty, in numerical order, to make Row Four.

- 19. Sew together Block Twenty-One through Block Twenty-Five, in numerical order, to make Row Five.
- 20. Sew together the (5) Rows, in numerical order, to make the Center Block.

21. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ x 70 $\frac{1}{2}$ Fabric M strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ x 74 $\frac{1}{2}$ Fabric M strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.


Layering, Quilting and Finishing

22. Press the quilt top and 82" x 82" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

23. Cut the ends of the (8) Fabric S binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

24. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
