Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (4663-33 24" Block - Orange):

• Fussy cut (6) 10 3/4" squares each centered on a block.

Fabric B (1351-Orange Just Color! - Orange), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 2" x 10 ¾" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 2" x 13 3/4" strips.

Fabric C (4668-44 Candy - Light Gold), cut:

- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 2 ½" x 12 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 2 ½" x 20 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 2 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

Fabric D (4666-33 Cheeky Village - Orange), cut:

• (2) 5 ½" x 60 ½" LOF strips.

Fabric E (1351-Onyx Just Color! - Onyx), cut:

- (6) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (4) 1 ½" x 60 ½" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 60 1/2" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 53 ½" strips.

Fabric F (4665-99 Stars – Dark Gray), cut:

• (1) 8 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (5) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

Fabric G (4667-33 Dots - Orange), cut:

• (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (3) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

Fabric H (4664-99 Small Pumpkin Faces - Dark Gray), cut:

• (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (3) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

Fabric I (4667-99 Dots - Black), cut:

- (1) 7" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 7" squares.
- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.
- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric J (4669-33 Large Pumpkin Faces - Orange), cut:

• (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (3) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

Fabric K (4668-90 Candy – Gray), cut:

• (1) 8 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (5) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

Fabric L (4671-33 Candy Corn - Orange), cut:

• (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

Fabric M (4665-33 Stars - Orange), cut:

• (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

Fabric N (4670-49 Cheekyville Stripe – Multi), cut:

- (2) 7" x 63 ½" LOF strips.
- (2) 7" x 53 ½" LOF strips.

Backing (4671-99 Candy Corn - Black), cut:


• (2) 74" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 74" x 84" to make the back.

Sewing


Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly


- 1. Sew (1) $2" \times 10^{-3}$ 4" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 10^{-3} 4" Fabric A block (Orange Background). Sew (1) $2" \times 13^{-3}$ 4" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A block. Trim the block to measure 12^{-1} 4" square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (3) Block One squares total.
- 2. Sew (1) 2" x 10 $\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 10 $\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric A block (Gray Background). Sew (1) 2" x 13 $\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A block. Trim the block to measure 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (3) Block Two squares total.




- 3. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric G strip to the top of (1) 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric H strip lengthwise. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric F strip to the top of the sewn strip lengthwise. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the new strip to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 3).
- 4. Repeat Step 3 and refer to Figures 4-5 for fabric identification and location to make (1) Unit 2 square and (1) Unit 3 square.




5. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric M strip to the top of (1) 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric I strip lengthwise. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the sewn strip to make (1) Unit 4 rectangle (Fig. 6).



- 6. Follow figure 7 and sew (5) assorted $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $8 \frac{1}{2}$ " strips together lengthwise. Sew (1) $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $20 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of the sewn strip to make (1) Unit 5 rectangle (Fig. 7).
- 7. Repeat Step 5 and refer to Figure 8 for fabric identification and location to make (1) Unit 6 rectangle.
- 8. Repeat Step 3 and refer to Figures 9-11 for fabric identification and location to make (1) Unit 7 square, (1) Unit 8 square and (1) Unit 9 square.



- 9. Sew together (1) Unit 1 square, (1) Block One square, (1) Unit 2 square, (1) Block Two square and (1) Unit 3 square, in that order, to make Column One (Fig. 12).
- 10. Sew together (1) Unit 4 rectangle, (1) Block Two square, (1) Unit 5 rectangle, (1) Block One square and (1) Unit 6 rectangle, in that order, to make Column Two (Fig. 13).
- 11. Sew together (1) Unit 7 square, (1) Block One square, (1) Unit 8 square, (1) Block Two square and (1) Unit 9 square, in that order, to make Column Three (Fig. 14).
- 12. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 60 ½" Fabric E strip to each side of (1) 5 ½" x 60 ½" Fabric D strip to make (1) Column Two. Repeat to make (1) Column Four. The arrow represents to the direction of the fabric print.

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top. Note: The arrows on the Fabric N strips denote fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric orientation when adding the Fabric N borders.)

13. Sew the (5) Columns together in numerical order to make the Center Block.


- 14. Sew (1) 2" x 60 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 53 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 15. Sew (1) 7" x 63 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric N strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 7" Fabric I square to each end of (1) 7" x 53 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric N strip to make the top border. Repeat to make the bottom border. Sew the borders onto the Center Block to make the quilt top.

Layering, Quilting and Finishing

16. Press the quilt top and 74" x 84" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

- 17. Cut the ends of the (8) Fabric I binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.
- 18. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
