



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## **Cutting**

#### **Cutting Instructions**

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

#### Fabric A (4581-9 Mason Jar - White), cut:

- (1)14 ½" x 18 ½" WOF strip.
- See instructions to cut (5) threads.

#### Fabric B (4579-88 Sewing Essentials - Red), cut:

- See instructions to cut (1) mannequin. *CUT FIRST*
- See instructions to cut (1) piece of cloth.
- See instructions to cut (4) threads.

#### Fabric C (Bright Kiwi-64 Peppered Cottons - Bright Kiwi), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x 18 ½" WOF strip.
- See instructions to cut (9) threads.
- See instructions to cut (2) buttons.

#### Fabric D (Carbon-23 Peppered Cottons - Carbon), cut:

• See instructions to cut (1) sewing machine and (1) sewing machine handle.

#### Fabric E (Oyster-35 Peppered Cottons – Oyster), cut:

- (2) 11 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (4) 11 ½" x 15 ½" strips.
- (1) 11 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 11 ½" x 20 ½" strips.
- (1) 5 ¼" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 5 ¼" squares.
- (2) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (14) 4 ½" squares.
- See instructions to cut (1) set of sewing machine accents (wheel, spacer, knob, needle and plate).

#### Fabric F (Flame-16 Peppered Cottons - Flame), cut:

- See instructions to cut (3) threads.
- See instructions to cut (4) buttons.
- See instructions to cut (1) small thread for the sewing machine.

#### Fabric G (Ink-45 Peppered Cottons - Ink), cut:

- See instructions to cut (48) large spools.
- See instructions to cut (2) stands.
- See instructions to cut (1) small spool for the sewing machine.

#### Fabric H (4583-78 Pinwheel Dressmaker - Navy), cut:

- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (4) 1 ½" x 20 ½" strips.
- (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 1 ½" x 18 ½' strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (4) 1 ½" x 16 ½" strips.
- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 12 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (4) 1 ½" x 11 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 10 ½" strips.
- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### Fabric I (4575P-88 Crafty Panel - Red):

• Fussy cut (6) 9 ½" squares, each centered on a small panel.

#### Fabric J (True Cheddar-36 Peppered Cottons - True Cheddar), cut:

- (4)  $1\frac{1}{2}$  x WOF strips, sub-cut (12)  $1\frac{1}{2}$  x  $11\frac{1}{2}$  strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 9 ½" strips.
- See instructions to cut (4) threads
- See instructions to cut (4) buttons.

## **Cutting - Continued**

#### Fabric K (4577-99 Sewing Machine Allover - Black), cut:

• (1) 5 ¼" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 5 ¼" squares.

#### Fabric L (Lagoon-78 Peppered Cottons - Lagoon), cut:

- See instructions to cut (4) buttons.
- See instructions to cut (5) threads.

#### Fabric M (4584-11 Pin Cushion - Light Blue), cut:

- See instructions to cut (1) mannequin.
- See instructions to cut (4) threads.

#### Fabric N (4582-76 Scallops - Multi), cut:

• See instructions to cut (8) threads.

#### Fabric O (4580-9 Sewing Kit - White), cut:

• See instructions to cut (6) threads.

#### Fabric P (4578-78 Border Stripe - Navy):

- Fussy cut (2) 10 ½" x 92" LOF strips, each starting at the top of the scissors.
- Fussy cut (2) 10 ½" x 68" LOF strips, each starting at the top of the scissors.

#### Backing (4576-99 Bookshelf - Black), cut:


• (2) 96" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 72" x 96" to make the back.

## **Sewing**

Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

#### **Block Assembly**


- 1. Sew (1)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $9\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to each side of (1)  $9\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I square. Sew (1)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $11\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric I square. Trim the block to measure  $10\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (1) Unit 1 block (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (6) Unit 1 blocks total.
- 2. Sew (1)  $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x  $10 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 block. Sew (1)  $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x  $12 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 block to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.



- 3. Place (1) 5  $\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric K square on top of (1) 5  $\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric E square, right side together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 3). Sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 3). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 4) to make (2) half-square triangles (Fig. 4). Trim the blocks to measure  $\frac{47}{8}$ " square.
- 4. Place (1) half-square triangle from Step 3 on top of another half-square triangle, right sides together. Make sure the center seam is going in the same direction on both half-square triangles and the Fabric E triangle in the top block is opposite from the Fabric E triangle in the bottom block (Fig. 6).
- 5. Draw a diagonal line across the top half-square triangle from Step 4 so that it goes through the sewn seam. Sew ¼" away from both sides of the drawn line (Fig. 7). Cut on the drawn line. Trim the blocks to measure 4 ½" square to make (2) Unit 2 blocks (Fig. 8).
- 6. Repeat Steps 3-5 to make (16) Unit 2 blocks total.













- 7. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about 1/8" outside the drawn lines.
- 8. Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.
- 9. Refer to Figure 9 to arrange and press (1) Fabric L button onto (1) 4 ½" Fabric E square.
- 10. Finish the raw edges of each shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to make (1) Unit 3 block.
- 11. Repeat Steps 9-10 to make (4) Unit 3 blocks total.
- 12. Repeat Steps 9-10 and use Figures 10-12 for fabric identification and location to make (4) Unit 4 blocks,
- (4) Unit 5 blocks and (2) Unit 6 blocks.
- 13. Follow Figure 13 and sew (8) Unit 2 blocks and (7) assorted button blocks together into a 3 x 5 matrix to make (1) Block Two square. Repeat to make a second Block Two square.






- 14. Repeat Steps 9-10 and refer to Figure 14 to arrange and press (12) Fabric G large spools and (12) assorted threads onto (1) 11 ½" x 15 ½" Fabric E strip to make (1) Unit 7 block.
- 15. Sew (1)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $11\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to the left side of the Unit 7 block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 16 ½" Fabric H strip to the top of the Unit 7 block to make (1) Block Three rectangle (Fig. 15).





16. Repeat Steps 14-15 refer to Figures 16-21 for component identification and location to make (1) Block Four rectangle, (1) Block Five rectangle and (1) Block Six rectangle.



- 17. Repeat Steps 9-10 and refer to Figure 22 to arrange and press (1) Fabric B mannequin and (1) Fabric G stand onto (1) 11 ½" x 20 ½" Fabric E strip to make (1) Unit 11 block.
- 18. Sew (1)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 20  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to the left side of the Unit 11 block to make (1) Block Seven rectangle (Fig. 23).






- 19. Repeat Steps 17-18 and use Figures 24-25 for component identification and placement to make (1) Block Eight rectangle.
- 20. Sew (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $18\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the bottom of (1) 14 ½" x 18 ½" Fabric A strip lengthwise to make the sewing machine background.
- 21. Repeat Steps 9-10 and refer to Figure 26 to arrange and press the Fabric D sewing machine, Fabric D handle, Fabric E accessories, Fabric B cloth, Fabric F small thread and Fabric G small spool onto the sewing machine background from Step 20 to make (1) Unit 13 block.
- 22. Sew (1) 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 18  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to each side of the Unit 13 block. Sew (1) 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 20  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 13 block to make (1) Block Nine square (Fig. 27).









#### **Quilt Top Assembly**


#### (Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

- 23. Sew (1) Block Three rectangle, (1) Block One square and (1) Block Four rectangle together in that order to make Row One.
- 24. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Two rectangle to make Row Two. Repeat to make Row Four.
- 25. Sew (1) Block Seven rectangle, (1) Block Nine square and (1) Block Eight rectangle together in that order to make Row Three.
- 26. Sew (1) Block Five rectangle, (1) Block One square and (1) Block Six rectangle together in that order to make Row Five.

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- 27. Sew the (5) rows together in numerical order to make the Center Block. Center (1) 10 ½" x 92" Fabric P strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ½" from the top edge of the block and stop a ¼" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.
- 28. Repeat Step 27 to sew (1)  $10 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 68" Fabric P strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 28).

29. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 28), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.




# Layering, Quilting and Finishing

30. Press the quilt top and 72" x 96" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.


#### **Binding**

- 31. Cut the ends of the (8) Fabric H binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.
- 32. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.




Quilt Layout

## 100% Reversed Templates for Fusible Applique









Large Thread Trace 48
