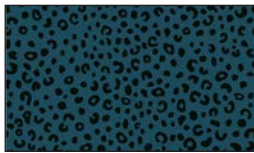

Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of the fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage unless otherwise noted. (WOF = Width of Fabric, LOF = Length of Fabric).

Fabric A (6147-66 Word Pattern - Med. Green), cut:

*(6) 2-1/2" x WOF strips for border 6.

Fabric B (6149-76 Leopard Skin - Dk. Peacock), cut:

*(9) 1-1/2" x WOF strips: (4) for border 2, (5) for border 4.

Fabric C (6152-76 Tossed Tigers - Lt. Blue), cut:

*(1) 6" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 6" squares.

*(5) 2-1/2" x WOF strips for border 3.

Fabric D (Peppered Cottons-49 Peacock), cut:

*(1) 3-1/4" x WOF strip.

*(9) 2-1/2" x WOF strips for binding.

Fabric E (6146-67 Small World Medallion - Dk. Green) and

Fabric G (6153-76 Tossed Toucans - Dk. Peacock), cut:

*(5) 5" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 5" squares.

Fabric F (6150-76 Tossed Mixed Animals - Dk. Peacock), cut:

*(8) 3" x WOF strips for border 9.

Fabric H (6148-17 Raindrops - Blue), cut:

*(2) 3-1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 3-1/4" squares.

*(5) 5" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 5" squares.

Fabric I (6154-16 Tossed Leaves - Aqua), cut:

*(2) 1-7/8" x WOF strips.

*(1) 3-5/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 3-5/8" squares.

*(5) 5" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 5" squares.

Fabric J (6156-76 Blocks - Blue/Green), trim:

*(9) 11-1/2" blocks.

Fabric K (Peppered Cottons-35 Oyster), cut:

*(3) 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (80) 1-1/2" squares.

*(1) 2-1/4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 2-1/4" squares; cut once diagonally. (A)

*(1) 3-5/8" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 3-5/8" squares.

*(4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 11-1/2" strips.

*(5) 1-1/2" x WOF strips for border 5.

*(4) 2" x WOF strips for border 1.

Fabric L (Peppered Cottons-61 Tide Pool), cut:

*(13) 6" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (80) 6" squares, (16)

1-7/8" x 6" strips, (8) 1-7/8" squares, and (4) 2" squares.

*(6) 1-1/2" x WOF strips for border 7.

Block Assembly

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the 3-5/8" Fabric K squares. With right sides together, layer the marked Fabric K squares atop the 3-5/8" Fabric I squares. Stitch 1/4" on each side of the marked line, cut on the drawn line, press each unit open with seams toward dark fabric, and trim dog ears (*figure 1*). Make a total of eight 3-1/4" half-square triangles (HST).

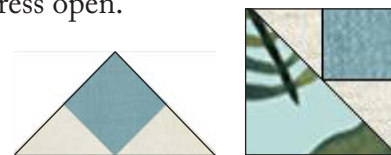


Figure 2 – Make (8) 3-1/4" units.

2. Sew a Fabric K triangle A to adjacent sides of a 1-7/8" Fabric L square. Press open, trim the ears, and repeat to make eight units. Cut the remaining Fabric I squares in half diagonally once. Sew one Fabric I triangle to each unit square/triangle unit to make eight 3-1/4" patches (*figure 2*). Press open.

3. Sew a 1-7/8" Fabric I strip to opposite sides of a 3-1/4" Fabric D strip. Press the seams toward the center. Cross-cut this strip set into sixteen 1-7/8" sections. Sew one 1-7/8" x 6" Fabric L strip to each section

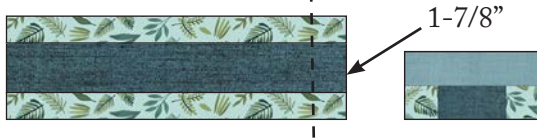


Figure 3 – Make (16) 3-1/4" x 6" units.

to make sixteen 3-1/4" x 6" rectangles (*figure 3*). Press the seams toward the light fabric.

4. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the 3-1/4" Fabric H squares. With right sides together, place one marked Fabric H square on a corner of one 6" Fabric C square and stitch on the drawn line. Repeat with the opposite corner of the same square. Trim seam allowances to 1/4" and press open. Repeat with the other corners (*figure 4*). Make four 6" patches.

5. Noting fabric orientation, sew a Step 3 unit to opposite sides of a Step 4 patch to make the center rows (*figure 5*). Press the seams away from the center.

6. Noting fabric orientation, sew a Step 1 HST to the left side of one Step 3 unit, and a Step 2 unit to the right side (*figure 6*). Press the seams toward the center. Make four rows of each type.

7. Sew a Step 6 top row and a bottom row to each Step 5 center row to make four 11-1/2" blocks (*figure 7*). Press the seams in one direction.

8. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the 5" Fabric H squares. With right sides together, place one marked Fabric H square on a corner of one 6" Fabric L square and stitch on the drawn line. Sew a 5" Fabric E square to the opposite corner of the same square. Trim seam allowances to 1/4" and press open. Repeat to make forty 6" units. With the Fabric E corner on the bottom left, sew a 1-1/2" Fabric K square to the bottom right corner of each unit (*figure 8*).

9. Repeat Step 8 with the 5" Fabric I and Fabric G squares, and the remaining 6" Fabric L squares. Then, with the Fabric G corner on the bottom right, sew the 1-1/2" Fabric K squares to the top right corner of each unit (*figure 9*).

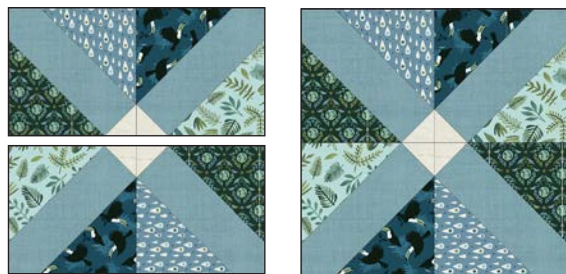


Figure 10 – Make (20) 11-1-2” blocks.

10. Noting fabric orientation, sew one Step 8 to one Step 9 unit and press the open. Repeat to make forty 6" x 11-1/2" rows. Sew the rows together two-by-two to make twenty 11-1/2" blocks (*figure 10, next page*). Press the seams open.

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the quilt diagram and photograph while assembling the quilt top.)

11. Referring to the quilt photo for block placement and color orientation, lay out the 11-1/2” Step 7 blocks, the 11-1/2” Fabric J blocks, and the 2” x 11-1/2” Fabric K sashing strips in three rows, and join the blocks and sashing strips together in each row. Press the seams toward the sashing.

12. To make the horizontal sashing rows, sew together three 2” x 11-1/2” Fabric K strips and two 2” Fabric L cornerstone squares. Repeat to make another strip. Press the seams toward the sashing.

13. Matching adjacent seams, sew block rows and horizontal sashing strips together. Press the seams in one direction.

14. For border 1, trim two 2” Fabric K strips to 36-1/2” length. Sew one strip to each side of the quilt top. Measure the width of the quilt top through the center. Cut two border strips that length and sew one to the top and one to the bottom. Press the seams toward the borders.

15. For border 2, sew four 1-1/2” Fabric B strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Measure the vertical length of the quilt top through the center and cut two border strips that length. Sew one strip to each side of the quilt top. Measure the width of the quilt top through the center. Cut two border strips that

length and sew one to the top and one to the bottom. Press the seams toward the borders.

16. Repeat Step 15 with the five 2-1/2” Fabric C strips to make and add border 3.

17. Repeat Step 15 with the five 1-1/2” Fabric B strips to make and add border 4.

18. Repeat Step 15 with the five 1-1/2” Fabric K strips to make and add border 5.

19. Repeat Step 15 with the six 2-1/2” Fabric A strips to make and add border 6.

20. Repeat Step 15 with the six 1-1/2” Fabric L strips to make and add border 7. The quilt measures 55-1/2” x 55-1/2” up to here.

21. For border 8 and referring to the quilt photo for block placement, arrange five Step 10 blocks for each side of the quilt. Sew blocks together and sew one border strip to each side of the quilt center. Press the seam toward the quilt center.

22. Repeat Step 21 with four 11-1/2” Fabric J blocks and the remaining Step 10 blocks, and sew one border strip to the top and one to the bottom of the quilt center.

Layering, Quilting, and Finishing

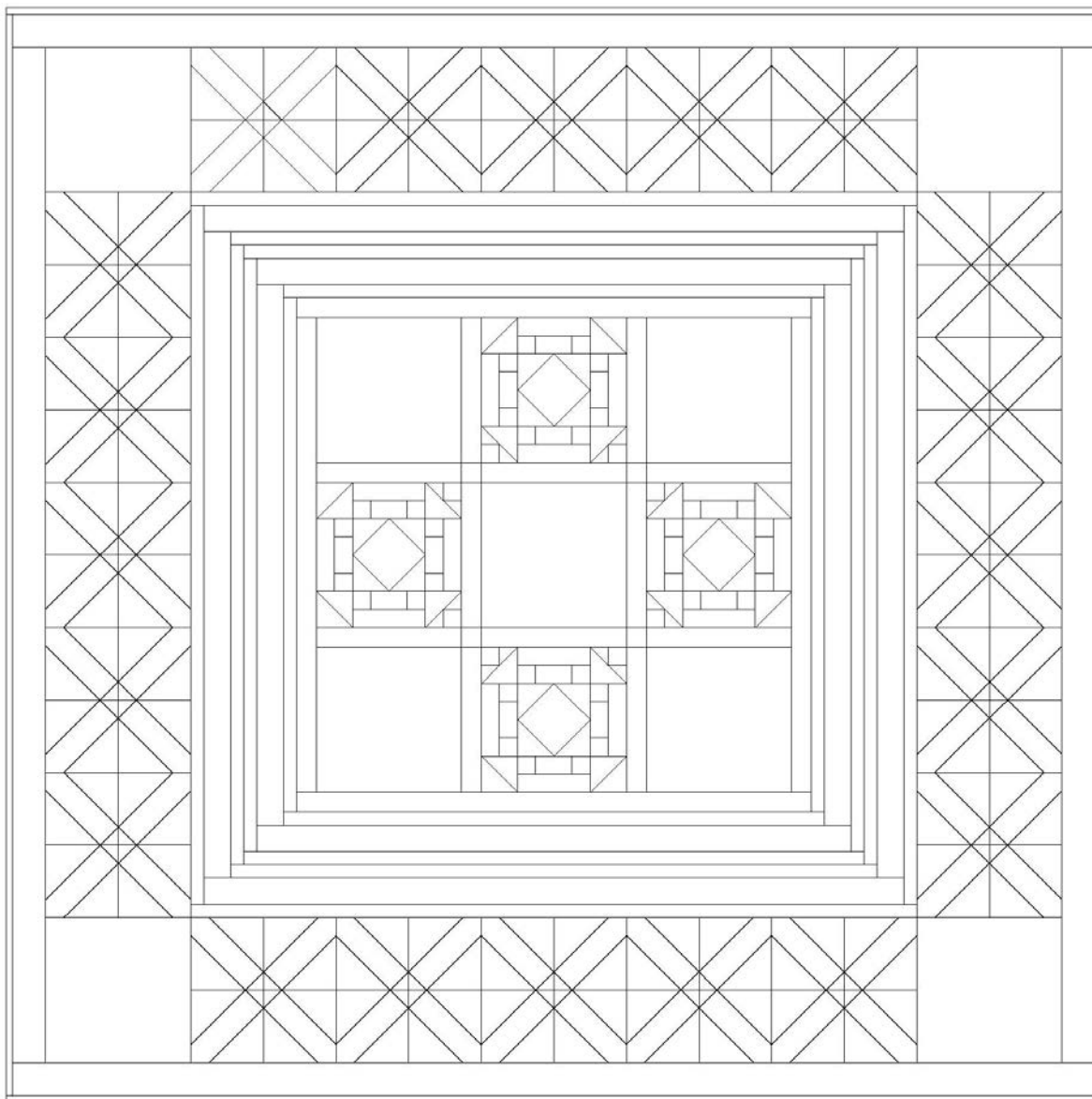
23. Create a quilt sandwich with the batting between the quilt top and the backing. Pin or baste layers together, mark quilting design, and quilt by hand or machine. When quilting is complete, remove pins or basting and trim batting and backing even with raw edges of the quilt top.

Binding

24. Join the nine 2-1/2” Fabric D binding strips together end to end using a diagonal seam to make one

long strip. Fold in half lengthwise and press. Sew binding to the edges of the quilt top, mitering corners, and overlapping ends. Fold binding to the back of the quilt and stitch it in place by hand to finish.
