Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (5902-73 Circles - Light Gray Blue), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (3) 4 ½" squares.
- (1) 2 \%" x WOF strip, sub-cut (12) 2 \%" squares.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric B (5901-19 Textured Geo - Light Blue), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (3) 4 ½" squares.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.
- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (60) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric C (White Sugar-9 Peppered Cottons – White Sugar), cut:

- (1) 2 \%" x WOF strip, sub-cut (12) 2 \%" squares.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (12) 2 ½" squares.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 61 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 52 ½" strips.

Fabric D (5910-11 Cross-Hatch Texture - Light Blue), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (3) 4 ½" squares.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric E (5909-11 Small Lattice - Light Blue), cut:

- (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares and (6) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (1) 2 \%" x WOF strip, sub-cut (12) 2 \%" squares.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (6) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.
- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (52) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric F (5908-91 Large Floral Texture - Gray Salt), cut:

- (1) 2 %" x WOF strip, sub-cut (12) 2 %" squares.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (12) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric G (5905-11 Linear Texture – Light Blue), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4 ½" squares.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (32) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric H (Stonewash-79 Peppered Cottons - Stonewash), cut:

- (2) 2 \%" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 2 \%" squares.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.
- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric I (5907-90 Brushstroke Texture – Smoky Gray), cut:

- (2) 2 \%" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 2 \%" squares.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (16) 2 ½" squares.
- (3) 1" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1" x 60 ½" strips.
- (3) 1" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1" x 49 ½" strips.

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4 ½" squares.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (32) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric K (5907-77 Brushstroke Texture – Midnight), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (1) 4 ½" square and (6) 2 %" squares.
- (1) 2 \%" x WOF strip, sub-cut (10) 2 \%" squares.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.
- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (56) 2 ½" squares.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric L (Aluminum-60 Peppered Cottons - Aluminum), cut:

- (2) 2 \%" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 2 \%" squares.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (16) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric M (5900-97 Small Floral Texture - Charcoal/Navy), cut:

- (2) 2 \%" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 2 \%" squares.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.
- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric N (Granite-10 Peppered Cottons - Granite), cut:

- (1) 2 %" x WOF strip, sub-cut (12) 2 %" squares.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (12) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric O (5902-79 Circles - Midnight/Charcoal), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4 ½" x 2 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 %" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 2 %" squares.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric P (True Taupe-99 Peppered Cottons - True Taupe), cut:

- (1) 2 %" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 2 %" squares.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric Q (Tweed-37Peppered Cottons - Tweed), cut:

- (1) 2 %" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 2 %" squares.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips and (4) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric R (5911-79 Woven Strips - Multi), cut:

- (4) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 64 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (4) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 62 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

Backing (5901-97 Textured Geo - Charcoal/Navy), cut:

• (2) 70" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 70" x 82" to make the back.



Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

- 1. Place (1) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square on the left side of (1) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance (Fig. 2).
- 2. Place another $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square on the right side of the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 4).




Fig. 27 Fig. 28

5. Place (1) 2 %" Fabric A square on top of (1) 2 %" Fabric C square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 26). Sew 1/4" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 26). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 27) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the halfsquare triangles to measure 2 ½" square to make (1) Unit 23A square and (1) Unit 23B square (Fig. 28). Repeat to make (6) of each square.














(Fig. 37). Repeat to make (6) of each square.










Fig. 35 Fig. 37

Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 35). Sew 1/4" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 35). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 36) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 2 ½" square to make (1) Unit 30A square and (1) Unit 30B square





Repeat to make (3) Unit 45 squares total.

- 13. Sew together (1) Unit 45 square, (1) Unit 33 square and (1) Unit 46 square, in that order from left to right, to make the top row (Fig. 68).
- 14. Sew (1) Unit 34 square to each side of (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square to make the middle row (Fig. 68).
- 15. Sew together (1) Unit 47 square, (1) Unit 33 square and (1) Unit 48 square, in that order from left to right, to make the bottom row (Fig. 68).
- 16. Sew together the (3) rows from Steps 13-15 lengthwise to make (1) 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Block One square (Fig. 68).




19. Follow Figure 75 and sew together the (20) Blocks into a 4×5 matrix to make the $48 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $60 \frac{1}{2}$ " Center Block.

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

20. Sew 1" x 60 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1" x 49 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

- 21. Sew (1) $2" \times 61 \frac{1}{2}"$ Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $2" \times 52 \frac{1}{2}"$ Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 22. Sew (1) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 64 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric R strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 62 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric R strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.




Layering, Quilting and Finishing

23. Press the quilt top and 70" x 82" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

- 24. Cut the ends of the (7) Fabric K binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.
- 25. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
