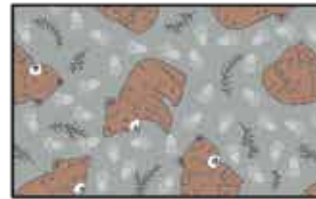

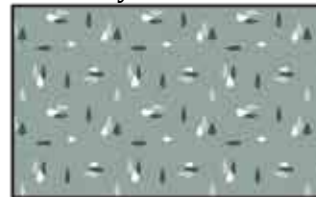

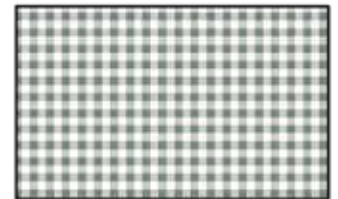

Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (6718-77 Floral – Navy), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.
- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 3 ½" squares.

Fabric B (6710-66 Tossed Bears – Green), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

Fabric C (6716-66 Small Trees – Green), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (3) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.
- (5) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric D (6720-6 Small Check – Green), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

Fabric E (6722-66 Tossed Bunnies – Green), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

Fabric F (6717-90 Forest Friends in Rows – Multi), cut:

- (2) 3 ½" x 44 ½" LOF strips.
- (2) 3 ½" x 34 ½" LOF strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (1) 8 ½" x 4 ½" WOF strip.

Fabric G (6719-66 Ferns – Green), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x 8 ½" WOF strip.
- (2) 1 ½" x 42 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.
- (2) 1 ½" x 34 ½" WOF strips.

Fabric H (6712-77 Tossed Foxes – Navy), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (3) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

Fabric I (6714-90 Mushrooms – Gray), cut:

- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (31) 2 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

Fabric J (6715-30 Footprints – Terra Cotta), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (20) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric K (White Sugar-9 Peppered Cottons – White Sugar), cut:

- (6) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 4 ½" squares.

Backing (6711-40 Tossed Animals on Cream – Multi), cut:

- (2) 48" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 48" x 58" to make the back.

Sewing

Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

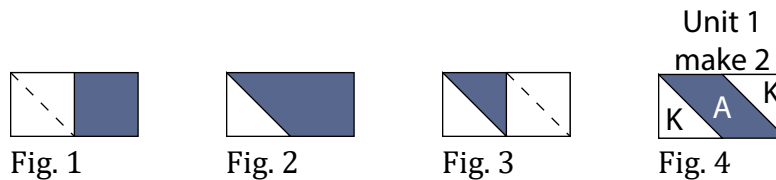
Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

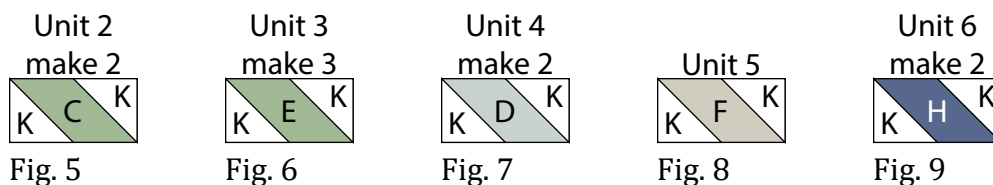
1. Place (1) 4 ½" Fabric K square on the left side of (1) 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric A strip, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig. 2).

2. Place another 4 ½" Fabric K square on the right side of the 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric A strip, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 4).

3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make a second Unit 1 strip.



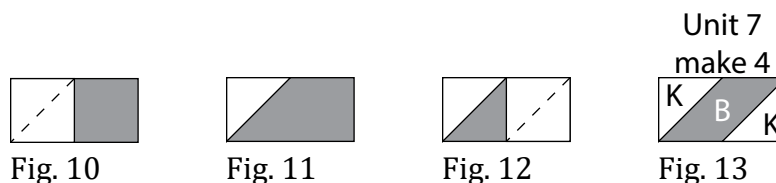
4. Repeat Steps 1-2 and refer to Figures 5-9 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (2) Unit 2 strips, (3) Unit 3 strips, (2) Unit 4 strips, (1) Unit 5 strip and (2) Unit 6 strips.



5. Place (1) 4 ½" Fabric K square on the left side of (1) 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric B strip, right sides together (Fig. 10). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 10). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig. 11).

6. Place another 4 ½" Fabric K square on the right side of the 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric B strip, right sides together (Fig. 12). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 12). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 7 strip (Fig. 13).

7. Repeat Steps 5-6 to make (4) Unit 7 strips total.



8. Repeat Steps 5-6 and refer to Figures 14-19 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (2) Unit 8 strips, (2) Unit 9 strips, (1) Unit 10 strip, (1) Unit 11 strip, (1) Unit 12 strip and (1) Unit 13 strip.

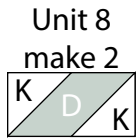

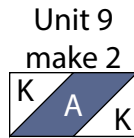

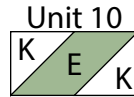

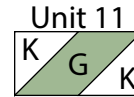

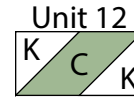

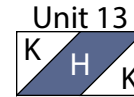

9. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to the top of (1) Unit 7 strip lengthwise to make (1) 8 1/2" Block One square (Fig. 20). Repeat to make a second Block One square.

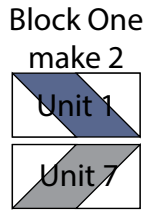

10. Repeat Step 9 and refer to Figures 21-30 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (1) of each block square for Block Two through Block Eleven.

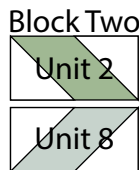

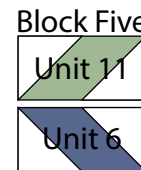

11. Sew together (4) 2 1/2" Fabric J squares and (3) 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" Fabric I strips, end to end and alternating them from left to right, to make (1) Block Twelve strip (Fig. 31). Repeat to make (5) Block Twelve strips total.

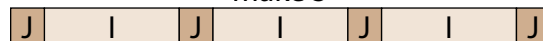

12. Sew together (1) 2 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric I strip, (1) Block One square, (1) 2 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric I strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) 2 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric I strip, (1) Block Three square and (1) 2 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric I strip, lengthwise and in that order from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 32).

13. Repeat Step 12 and refer to Figure 32 for component identification, placement and orientation to make Row Two, Row Three and Row Four.

14. Sew together the (5) Block Twelve strips and (4) Rows from Steps 12-13 in numerical order, lengthwise and alternating them from top to bottom, to make the 32 ½" x 42 ½" Center Block (Fig. 32).

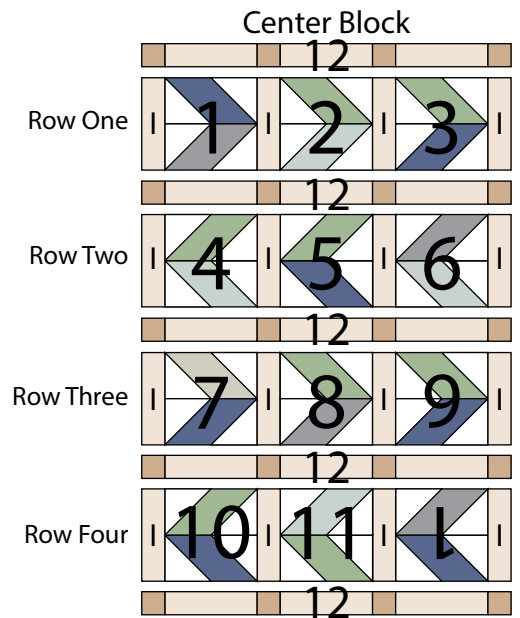

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

15. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 42 ½" Fabric G strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 34 ½" Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

16. Sew (1) 3 ½" x 44 ½" Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block.

17. Sew (1) 3 ½" Fabric A square to each end of (1) 3 ½" x 34 ½" Fabric F strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

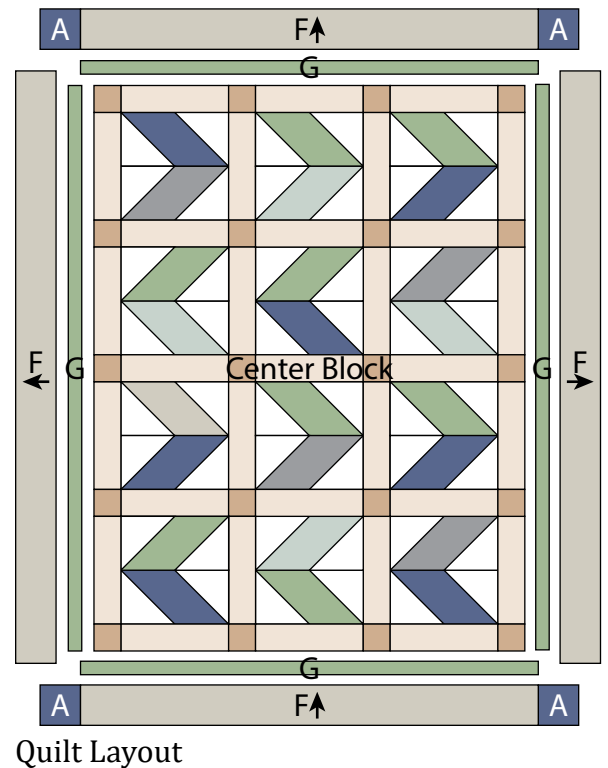
Layering, Quilting and Finishing

18. Press the quilt top and 48" x 58" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

19. Cut the ends of the (5) Fabric C binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

20. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
