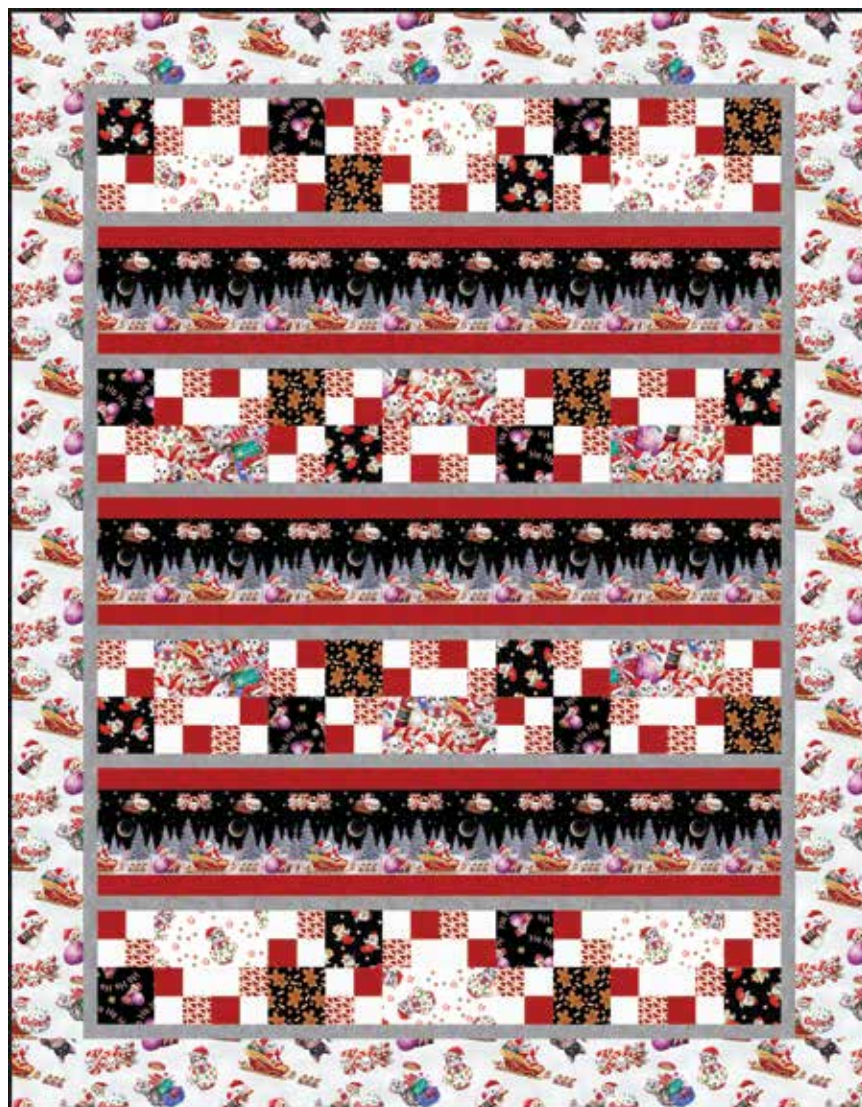

 (G) 7011-88 ..... ⅓ yard  
 (H) 7016-99 ..... 1 ½ yards

(I) 1351-Pewter\*\*... ¾ yard  
 (J) 7015-01..... 2 yards  
 (K) 1351-Onyx\*\*..... ⅝ yard\*  
 (L) 7013-88 ..... ⅔ yard

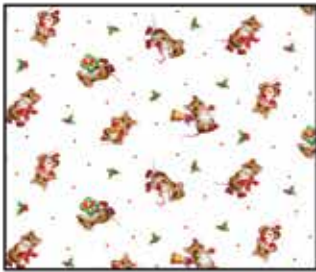

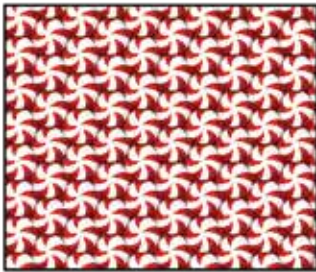

## Cutting

### Cutting Instructions

*Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.*

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

**Fabric A (7008-99 Tossed Cats – Black), cut:**

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 4 ½" squares.

**Fabric B (7010-99 Kitten with Gift Sack – Black), cut:**

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 4 ½" squares.

**Fabric C (7012-99 Ginger Cat Cookie – Black), cut:**

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 4 ½" squares.

**Fabric D (7009-01 Kitten in a Cup – White), cut:**

- (2) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (6) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

**Fabric E (1351-Pigment White Just Color! – Pigment White), cut:**

- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips.

**Fabric F (1351-Red Delicious Just Color! – Red Delicious), cut:**

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips.
- (7) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (6) 2" x 48 ½" strips.

**Fabric G (7011-88 Starlight Mint – Red), cut:**

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips.

**Fabric H (7016-99 Border Stripe – Black), cut:**

- (3) 6 ½" x 48 ½" LOF strips.

**Fabric I (1351-Pewter Just Color! – Pewter), cut:**

- (7) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (6) 1 ½" x 48 ½" strips.
- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 65 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 50 ½" strips.

**Fabric J (7015-01 Tossed Characters – White), cut:**

- (2) 5 ½" x 67 ½" LOF strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 5 ½" x 60 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.

**Fabric K (1351-Onyx Just Color! – Onyx), cut:**

- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

**Fabric L (7013-88 Packed Cats – Red), cut:**

- (2) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (6) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

**Backing (7007-01 Mice with Red Boots – White), cut:**

- (2) 85" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 68" x 85" to make the back.

## Sewing

Sew using a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

### Block Assembly

**Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.**

1. Sew 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF Fabric E strip to the left side of (1) 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF Fabric F strip lengthwise to make (1) Stripe Set 1 (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (3) Strip Set 1's total.

2. Cut the (3) Strip Set 1's into (48) 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 1 strips (Fig. 2).

3. Sew 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF Fabric E strip to the left side of (1) 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF Fabric G strip lengthwise to make (1) Stripe Set 2 (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (3) Strip Set 2's total.

4. Cut the (3) Strip Set 2's into (48) 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 2 strips (Fig. 4).

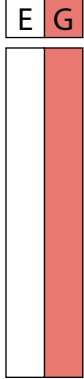

5. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to the top of (1) Unit 2 strip lengthwise to make (1) 4  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 3 square (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (48) Unit 3 squares total.

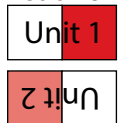

6. Sew together (1) 4  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square, (2) Unit 3 squares and (1) 4  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B square, in that order from left to right, to make the top row (Fig. 6).

7. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to each end (1) 4  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 8  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to make the bottom row (Fig. 6).

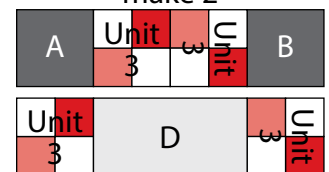

8. Sew together the (2) rows from Steps 6-7 lengthwise to make (1) 8  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 16  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Block One rectangle (Fig. 6).

9. Repeat Steps 6-8 to make a second Block One rectangle.

10. Repeat Steps 6-8 and refer to Figures 7-13 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (2) Block Two rectangles, (1) Block Three rectangle, (1) Block Four rectangle, (1) Block Five rectangle, (2) Block Six rectangles, (2) Block Seven rectangles and (1) Block Eight rectangle.

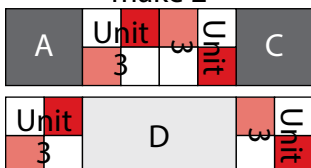

Block Three

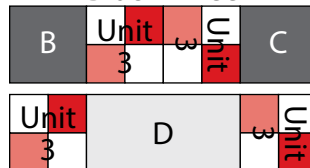

Block Four

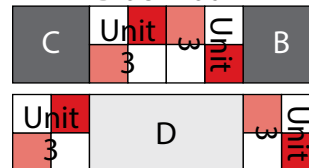

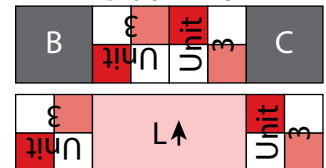

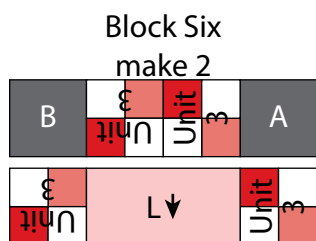

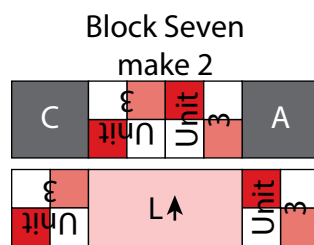

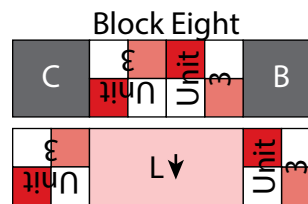

11. Sew (1) 2" x 48 1/2" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) 6 1/2" x 48 1/2" Fabric H strip lengthwise. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 48 1/2" Fabric I strip to the top and bottom of the newly sewn strip lengthwise to make (1) 11 1/2" x 48 1/2" Block Nine strip (Fig. 14). Repeat to make (3) Block Nine strips total.

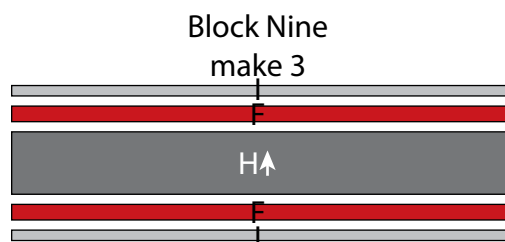

12. Sew together (1) Block One rectangle, (1) Block Two rectangle and (1) Block Three rectangle, end to end and in that order from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 15).

13. Repeat Step 12 and refer to Figure 15 for component identification, placement and orientation to make Row Two, Row Three and Row Four.

14. Sew together the (4) Rows from Steps 12-13 in numerical order and (3) Block Nine strips, lengthwise and alternating them from top to bottom, to make the 48 1/2" x 65 1/2" Center Block (Fig. 15).

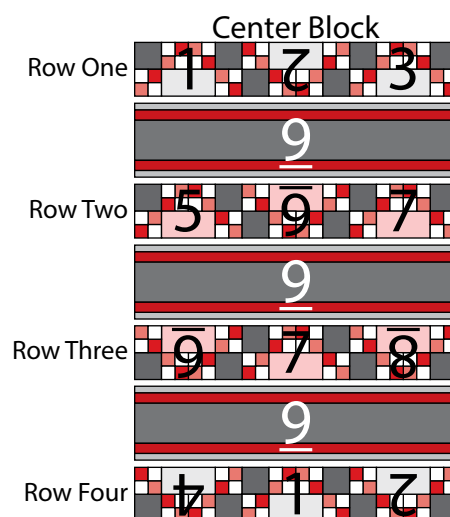

## Quilt Top Assembly

*(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)*

15. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 65 1/2" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 50 1/2" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

16. Sew (1) 5 1/2" x 67 1/2" Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 1/2" x 60 1/2" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

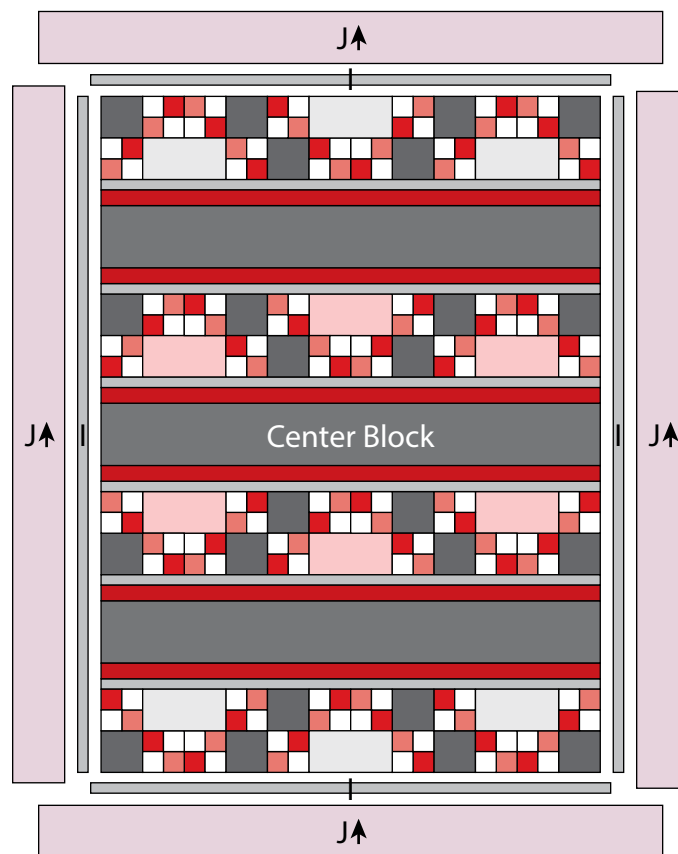
## Layering, Quilting and Finishing

17. Press the quilt top and 68" x 85" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

## Binding

18. Cut the ends of the (7) Fabric K binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

19. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
