Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (6244-11 Geofetti Hexis- Bright Multi):

- Fussy cut (9) 6 ½" squares, each centered on a hexagon.

Fabric B (1351-Onyx Just Color! – Onyx), cut:

- (1) 4 ¼" x WOF strip, sub-cut (9) 4 ¼" squares. Cut the squares across (both diagonals to make (36) 4 ¼" triangles.
- (12) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (252) 2" squares.

Fabric C (1351-Pigment White Just Color! – Pigment White), cut:

- (1) 4 ¼" x WOF strip, sub-cut (9) 4 ¼" squares. Cut the squares across (both diagonals to make (36) 4 ¼" triangles.

Fabric D (6243-11 Life Savers – Bright Multi), cut:

- (2) 4 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (18) 4 ¼" squares. Cut the squares across (both diagonals to make (72) 4 ¼" triangles.

Fabric E (6240-11 Circle Stars – White Multi), cut:

- (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (36) 3 ½" squares.

Fabric F (6245-11 Cubes Rising Border – White Multi), cut:

- (3) 12 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (6) 12 ½" x 20 ½" rectangles.

Fabric G (6237-58 Confetti Onion – Purple Multi), cut:

- (2) 4 ½" x 79 ½" LOF strips.

Fabric H (6241-78 Diamonds in the Sky – Royal Multi), cut:

- (2) 6 ½" x 76 ½" LOF strips.

Fabric I (1351-Navy Just Color! – Navy), cut:

- (11) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (6) 2" x 76 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 57 ½" strips.

Fabric J (6239-78 Dimension Planes – Royal Multi), cut:

- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric K (6235-76 Geo Texture – Sea Blue), cut:

- (6) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (72) 2" x 3 ½" strips.

Backing (6236-78 Geo Flower Power – Royal Multi), cut:

- (2) 87" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 73" x 87" to make the back.

Sewing

Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Place (1) 2" Fabric B square on the bottom left corner of (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam (Fig. 2).
2. Follow Figure 3 for the seam direction to add a 2" Fabric B square to the upper right and lower right corners of the $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 4).
3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make (36) Unit 1 squares total.

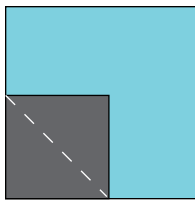

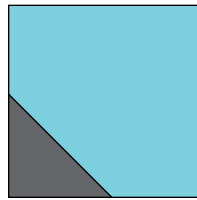

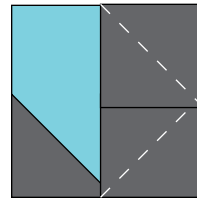

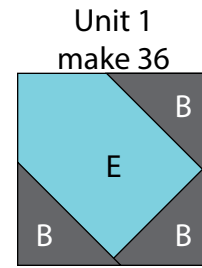

4. Place (1) 2" Fabric B square on the left side of (1) $2" \times 3\frac{1}{2}"$ Fabric K strip, right sides together (Fig. 5). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 5). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance (Fig. 6).
5. Place another 2" Fabric B square on the right side of the $2" \times 3\frac{1}{2}"$ Fabric K strip, right sides together (Fig. 7). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 7). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 2 strip (Fig. 8).
6. Repeat Steps 4-5 to make (72) Unit 2 strips total.

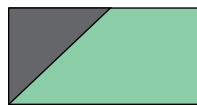

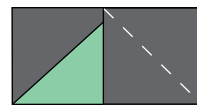

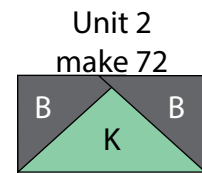

7. Sew (1) 4 ¼" Fabric D triangle and (1) 4 ¼" Fabric C triangle together along short sides to make (1) DC triangle. Sew (1) 4 ¼" Fabric B triangle and (1) 4 ¼" Fabric D triangle together along short sides to make (1) BD triangle. Sew the DC and BD triangles together along their long sides to make (1) 3 ½" Unit 3 square (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (36) Unit 3 squares total.

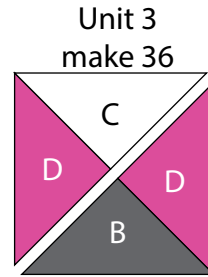

8. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip to each side of (1) Unit 3 square to make (1) Unit 4 strip (Fig. 10). Repeat to make (36) Unit 4 strips total.

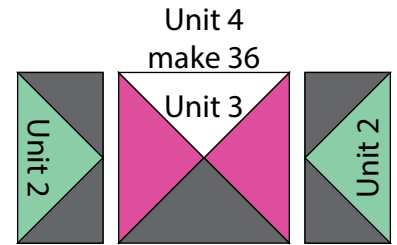

9. Sew (1) Unit 1 square to each end of (1) Unit 4 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 4 strip to each side of (1) 6 ½" Fabric A square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 12 ½" Block One square (Fig. 11). Repeat to make (9) Block One squares total.

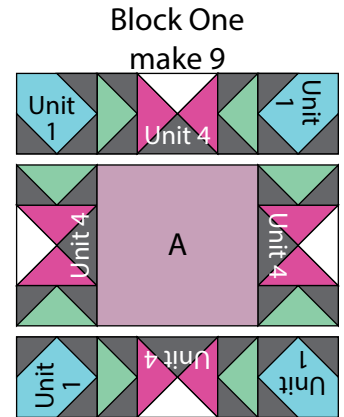

10. Sew (1) 2" x 76 ½" Fabric I strip to each side of (1) 6 ½" x 76 ½" Fabric H strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 5 strip (Fig. 12). Repeat to make a second Unit 5 strip.

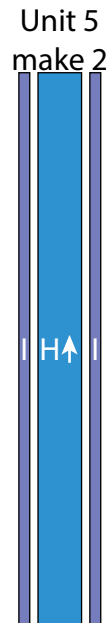

11. Sew together (3) Unit 1 squares and (2) 12 ½" x 20 ½" Fabric F strips, end to end and alternating them from top to bottom, to make Column 1 (Fig. 13). Repeat to make Column 2 and Column 3.

12. Sew together the (3) Columns from Step 11 and the (2) Unit 5 strips, lengthwise and alternating them from left to right, to make the 54 ½" x 76 ½" Center Block.

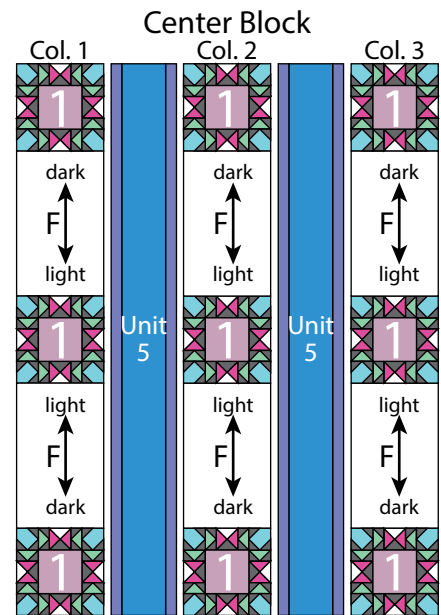

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

13. Sew (1) 2" x 76 ½" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 57 ½" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

14. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 79 ½" Fabric G strip to each side of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

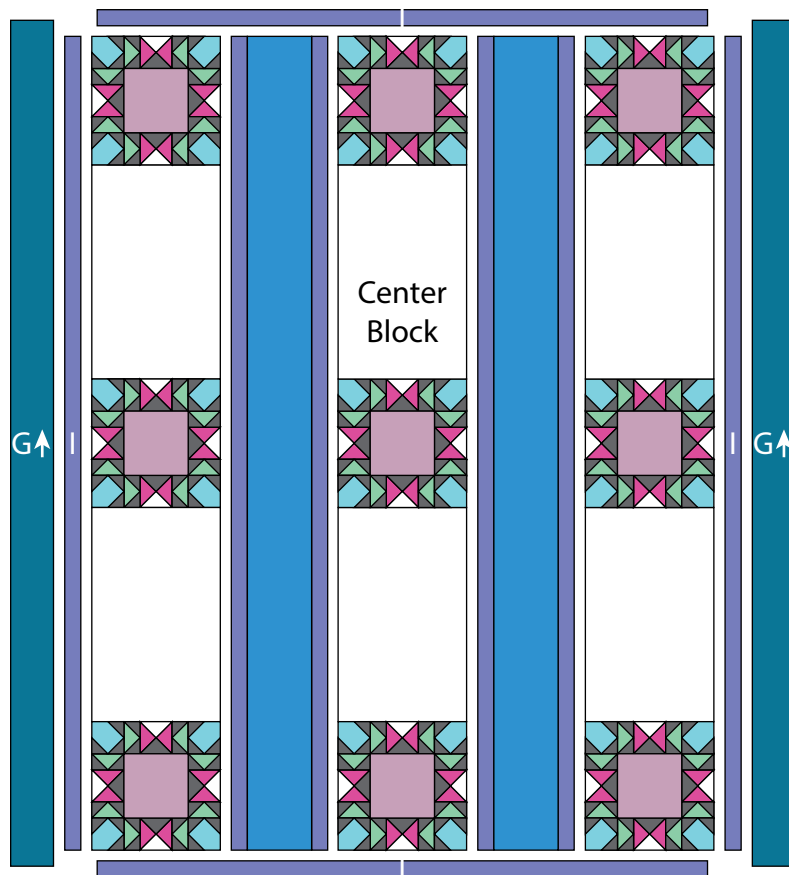
Layering, Quilting and Finishing

15. Press the quilt top and 73" x 87" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

16. Cut the ends of the (8) Fabric J binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

17. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
