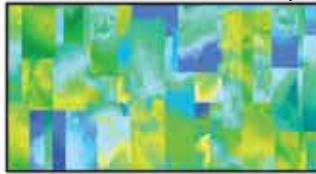

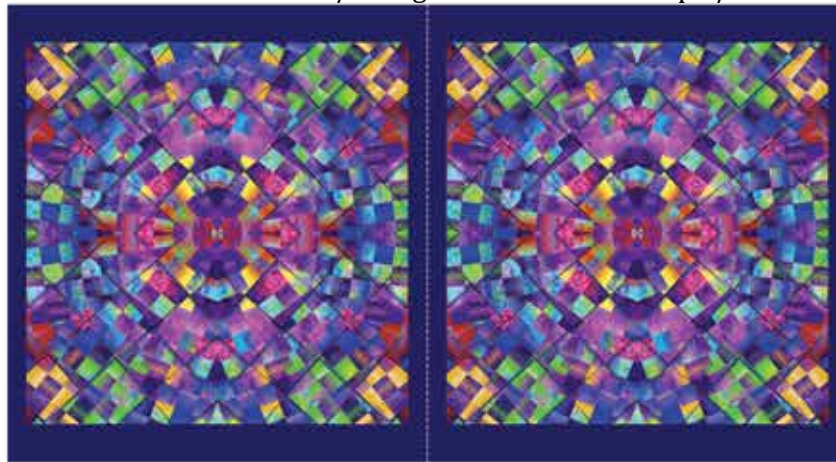

Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (5441-79 Confetti Blooms – Royal/Multi):

- Fussy cut (32) 5 ½" squares, each centered on a block.

Fabric B (1351-Royal Just Color! – Royal), cut:

- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips.
- (10) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (64) 1 ½" x 5 ½" strips.
- (13) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (64) 1 ½" x 7 ½" strips.
- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric C (5440-11 Triangulation – White/Multi), cut:

- (3) 6 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (40) 6 ½" x 3" strips.
- (7) 3" x WOF strips, sub-cut (40) 3" x 6 ½" strips.

Fabric D (5439-79 Confetti Flowers – Royal/Multi):

- Fussy cut (49) 3" squares, each entered on a flower.

Fabric E (1351-Grape Just Color! – Grape), cut:

- (2) 13 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (4) 13 ¼" squares and (2) 8 ⅝" squares. Cut the 13 ¼" squares across both diagonals to make (16) 13 ¼" triangles. *Note: You will only use (14) 13 ¼" triangles.*

Fabric F (5443-57 Splash – Royal/Teal), cut:

- (8) 7 ½" x WOF strips.

Backing (5440-79 Triangulation – Royal/Multi), cut:

- (2) 90" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 78" x 90" to make the back.

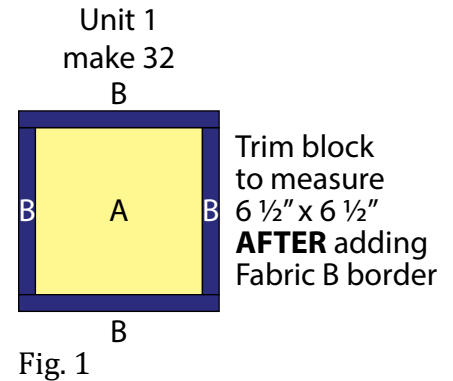
Sewing

Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of (1) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $7\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). Trim the unit to measure $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ ". Repeat to make (32) Unit 1 squares total.

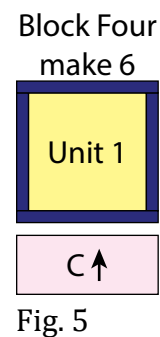
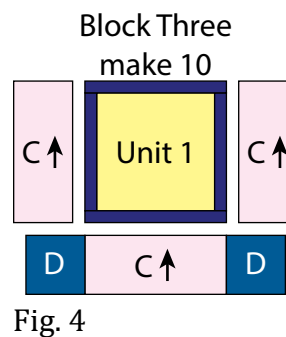
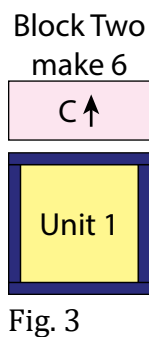
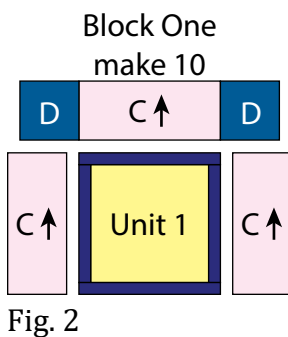


2. Sew (1) 3 " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square. Sew (1) 3 " Fabric D square to each end of (1) 3 " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip. Sew the newly sewn strip to the top of the Unit 1 square to make (1) Block One rectangle (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (10) Block One rectangles total.

3. Sew (1) 3 " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the top of (1) Unit 1 square to make (1) Block Two rectangle (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (6) Block Two rectangles total.

4. Sew (1) 3 " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square. Sew (1) 3 " Fabric D square to each end of (1) 3 " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip. Sew the newly sewn strip to the bottom of the Unit 1 square to make (1) Block Three rectangle (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (10) Block Three rectangles total.

5. Sew (1) 3 " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the bottom of (1) Unit 1 square to make (1) Block Four rectangle (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (6) Block Four rectangles total.



6. Sew (1) $13\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric E triangle to each side of (1) Block One rectangle. Sew (1) $8\frac{5}{8}$ " Fabric E triangle to the top of the Block One rectangle to make Row One.

7. Sew (1) Block One rectangle to each side of (1) Block Two rectangle. Sew (1) $13\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric E triangle to each end of the newly sewn strip to make Row Two.

8. Sew together (3) Block One rectangles and (2) Block Two rectangles, alternating them from left to right. Sew (1) $13\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric E triangle to each end of the newly sewn strip to make Row Three.

9. Sew together (4) Block Ones rectangles and (3) Block Two rectangles, alternating them from left to right. Sew (1) $13\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric E triangle to the left end of the newly sewn strip to make Row Four.

10. Sew together (9) 3" Fabric D squares and (8) 3" x 6 1/2" Fabric C strips, end to end and alternating them from left to right. to make Row Five.
11. Sew together (4) Block Threes rectangles and (3) Block Four rectangles, alternating them from left to right. Sew (1) 13 1/4" Fabric E triangle to the right end of the newly sewn strip to make Row Six.
12. Sew together (3) Block Three rectangles and (2) Block Four rectangles, alternating them from left to right. Sew (1) 13 1/4" Fabric E triangle to each end of the newly sewn strip to make Row Seven.
13. Sew (1) Block Three rectangle to each side of (1) Block Four rectangle. Sew (1) 13 1/4" Fabric E triangle to each end of the newly sewn strip to make Row Eight.
14. Sew (1) 13 1/4" Fabric E triangle to each side of (1) Block Three rectangle. Sew (1) 8 5/8" Fabric E triangle to the bottom of the Block Three rectangle to make Row Nine.
15. Sew the (9) Rows together, in numerical order, to make (1) Unit 2 piece.

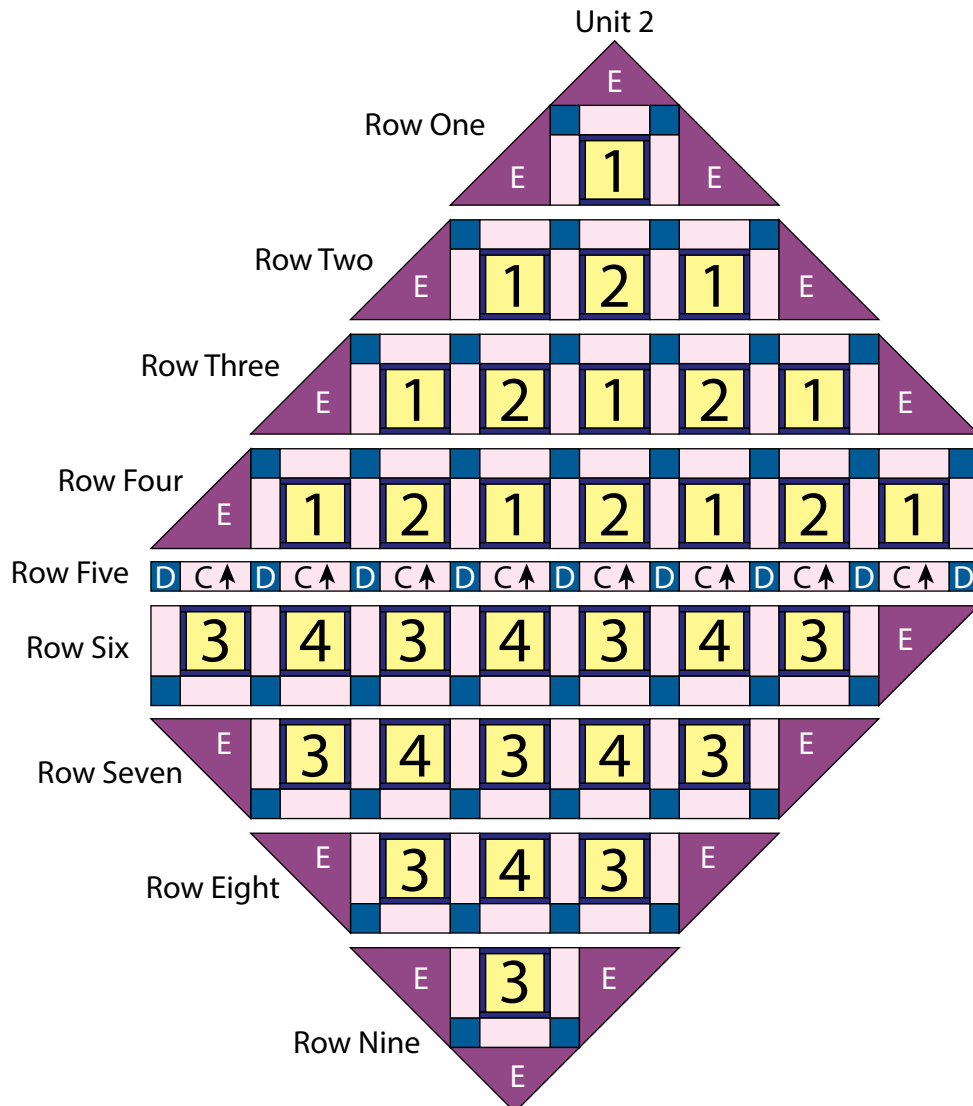

16. Sew (1) 8 5/8" Fabric E triangle to each side of the Unit 2 piece as shown in Figure 7 to make the Center Block.

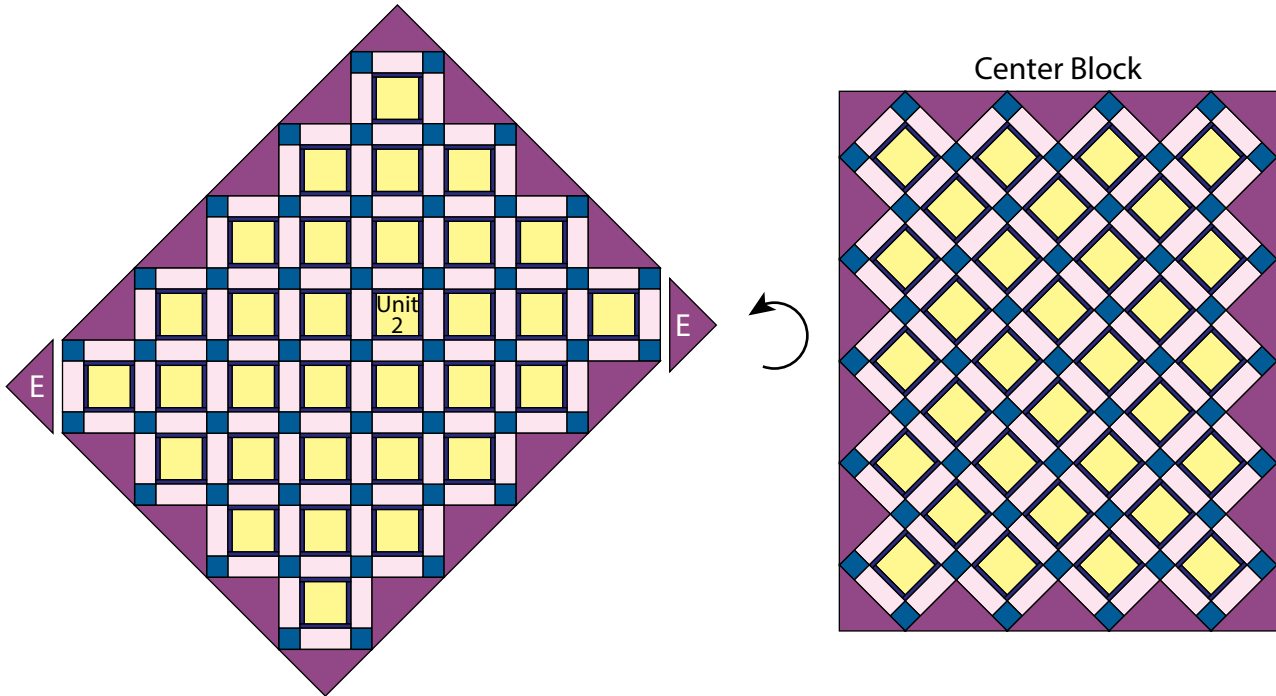

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

17. Sew (4) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric B strips together end to end with diagonal seams and trim the seams to 1/4". Measure the sides of the Center Block and cut (2) strips to that length. Sew (1) strip to each side of the Center Block.

18. Sew (3) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric B strips together end to end with diagonal seams and trim the seams to 1/4". Measure the top and bottom of the Center Block. Cut (2) strips to that length and sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

19. Sew (4) 7 1/2" x WOF Fabric F strips together end to end with diagonal seams and trim the seams to 1/4". Measure the sides of the Center Block and cut (2) strips to that length. Sew (1) strip to each side of the Center Block.

20. Sew (4) 7 1/2" x WOF Fabric F strips together end to end with diagonal seams and trim the seams to 1/4". Measure the top and bottom of the Center Block. Cut (2) strips to that length and sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

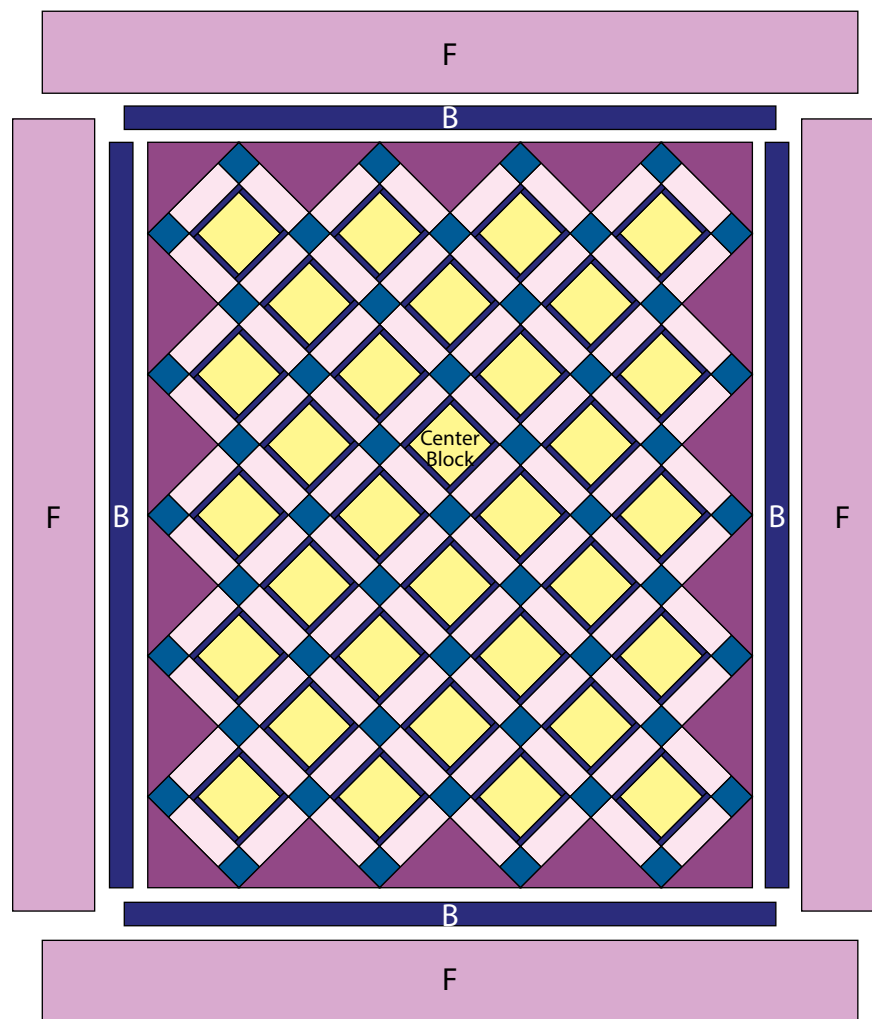
Layering, Quilting and Finishing

21. Press the quilt top and 78" x 90" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

22. Cut the ends of the (8) Fabric B binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

23. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
