Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Large Pouch

Fabric A (6300-77 Big Dot – Dark Blue), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

Fabric B (6306-44 Pencil Stripe – Yellow), cut:

- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 2 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

Fabric C (6304-44 Tossed Crayons – Yellow), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 6 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

Fusible Fleece:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 6 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

Medium Pouch

Fabric D (6307-88 Mini Geo – Red), cut:

- (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 1 ½" x 7 ½" strips.

Fabric E (6303-1 Notebooks and Pencils – White), cut:

- (1) 3" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 3" x 7 ½" strips.

Fabric F (6307-17 Mini Geo – Light Blue), cut:

- (1) 4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 4" x 7 ½" strips.

Fusible Fleece:

- (1) 4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 4" x 7 ½" strips.

Small Pouch

Fabric G (6298-78 Rulers – Multi), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 3 ½" x 5 ½" strips.

Fabric H (6302-16 Words – Aqua), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 3 ½" x 5 ½" strips.

Fusible Fleece:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 3 ½" x 5 ½" strips.

Sewing

Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Pouch Assembly

1. Sew (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A strip to the top of (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to make Unit 1 rectangle (Fig. 1). Repeat to make a second Unit 1 rectangle.

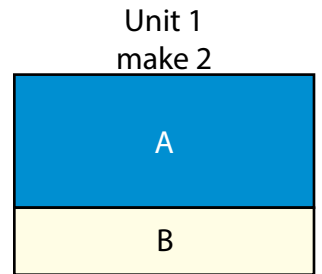

2. Press one $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " piece of Fusible Fleece to the wrong side of each Unit 1 rectangle and quilt as desired.

3. Place (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip on a flat surface, right side up. Align the 8" zipper with the top edge of the Fabric C strip, right side up as shown in Figure 2.

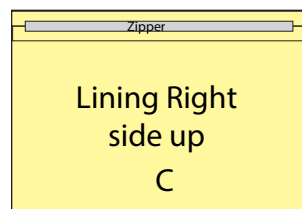

4. Place (1) Unit 1 rectangle, right side down on the zipper, with the Fabric A edge at the top (Fig. 3).

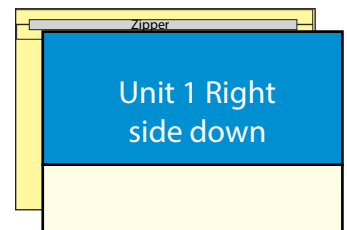

5. Using a zipper foot, sew the three layers together (Fig. 4). Flip the sewn unit right side out (Fig. 5).

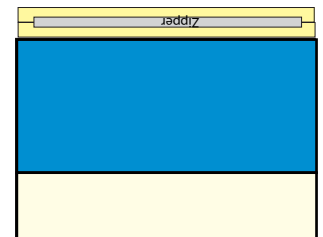

6. Place the second $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip on a flat surface, Place the other side of the zipper on top of the Fabric C piece right side up, aligning the top edges (Fig. 6). Place the second Unit 1 piece on top (Fig. 7).

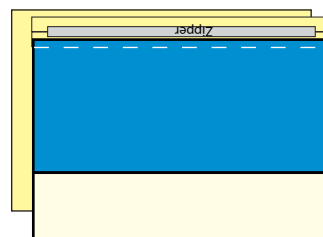

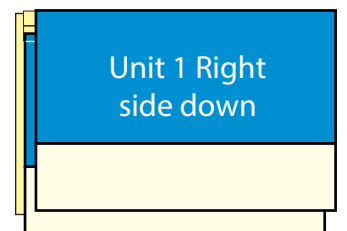

7. Using a zipper foot, sew the three layers together (Fig. 8). Flip the sewn unit right side out.

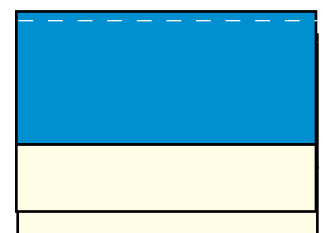

8. Flip the sewn unit right side out so there is a Unit 1 and a Fabric C piece on each side of the zipper. Topstitch through the layers to finish the zipper (Fig. 9).

9. Unzip the zipper halfway to create an opening for turning. Flip the Unit 1 rectangles, right side together and the Fabric C pieces right sides together, aligning the edges on both halves and pin (Fig. 10).

10. Stitch around the Unit 1 side and Fabric C sides, leaving a 2" to 3" opening on the Fabric C side for turning (Fig. 11).

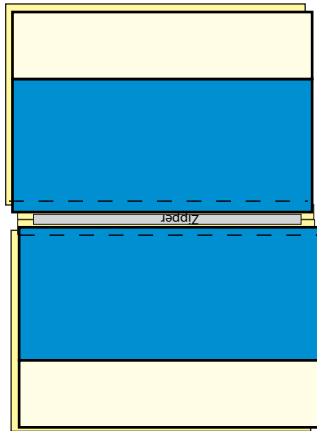

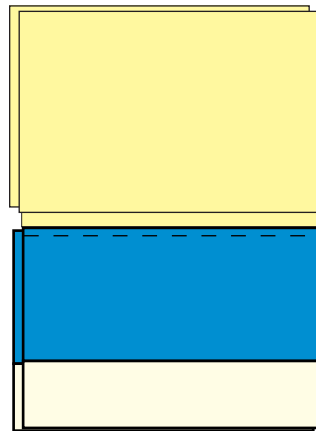

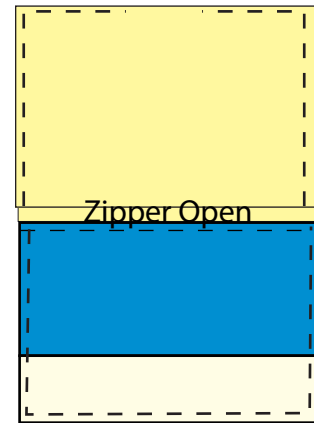

11. Turn the zipper pouch right side out through the opening in the Fabric C side and through the open zipper. Stitch the lining opening closed and push the Fabric C side into the zipper pouch to complete the Large Pouch.

12. Repeat Steps 1-11 with (2) 1 1/2" x 7 1/2" Fabric D strips, (2) 3" x 7 1/2" Fabric E strips, (2) 4" x 7 1/2" Fabric F lining strips, (2) 4" x 7 1/2" fusible fleece strips and the 7" zipper to make the Medium Pouch.

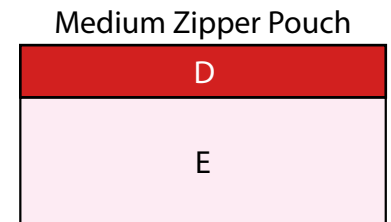

13. Repeat Steps 1-11 with (2) 3 1/2" x 5 1/2" Fabric G strips, (2) 3 1/2" x 5 1/2" Fabric H lining strips, (2) 3 1/2" x 5 1/2" Fusible Fleece strips, and the 3" zipper to make the Small Pouch.

Small Zipper Pouch

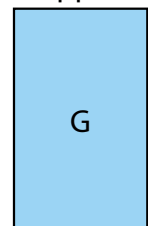
