- (F) 5963-9 ½ yard

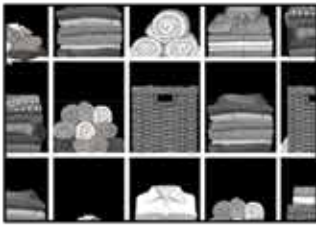

Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (5959-99 Large Tossed Clothespins – Black), cut:

- (1) 13 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 13 ½" x 14 ½" rectangles.

Fabric B (5965-93 Soap Bubbles – Warm Gray), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 4 ½" x 14 ½" strips.

Fabric C (5956-9 Tossed Underwear – Light Gray), cut:

- (1) 14 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 14 ½" x 17 ½" rectangles.

Fabric D (5954-99 Cotton Plant – Black), cut:

- (1) 13 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 13 ½" x 14 ½" rectangles.

Fabric E (5961-9 Mini Ironing Boards Ditsy – Light Gray), cut:

- (1) 14 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 14 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

Fabric F (5963-9 Stain Removal Instructions – White), cut:

- (1) 14 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 14 ½" x 17 ½" strips.

Sewing

Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Bag Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) 13 ½" x 14 ½" Fabric A rectangle to the top of (1) 4 ½" x 14 ½" Fabric B strip to make (1) Unit 1 rectangle (Fig. 1). Repeat to make a second Unit 1 rectangle.

2. Trace the Cloths Pin Template onto a piece of paper and cut out the template.

3. Place the paper template on top of (1) Unit 1 rectangle on the Fabric A side. Center and align the straight edge of the template with the top of the unit (Fig. 2). Trace the template onto the Unit 1 rectangle. Cut on the drawn line to make the Bag Front.

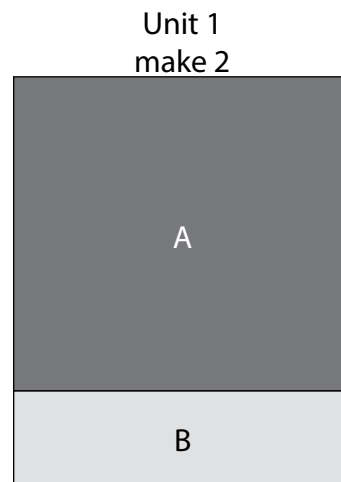

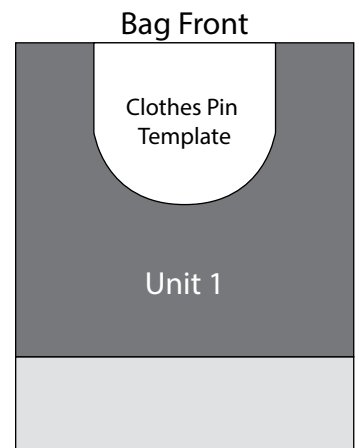

4. Repeat Step 3 with (1) 14 ½" x 17 ½" Fabric C rectangle to make the Lining Front (Fig. 3).

5. Place the Bag Front, right sides together with the remaining Unit 1 rectangle, aligning the raw edges. Sew the two pieces together to make the Outer Bag (Fig. 4). Turn the Outer Bag right side out.

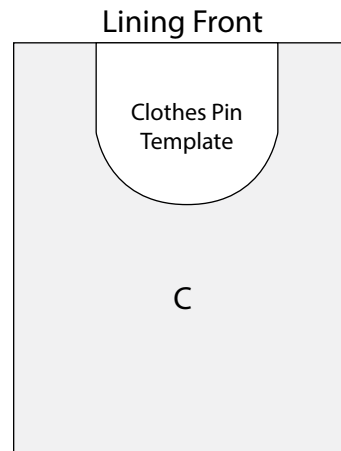

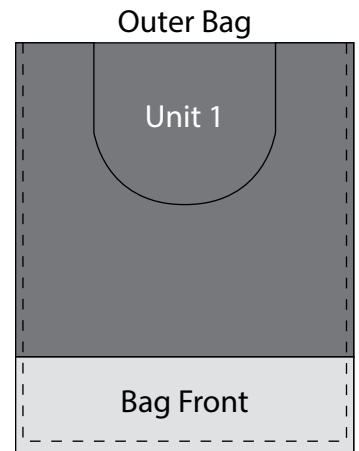

6. Place the Lining Front, right sides together with the remaining 14 ½" x 17 ½" Fabric C rectangle, aligning the raw edges. Sew the two pieces together, leaving a 3" opening for turning to make the Lining (Fig. 5). Leave the Lining inside out.

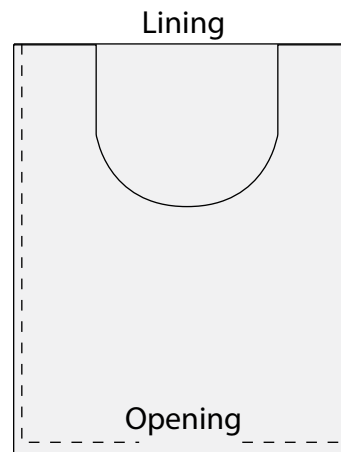

7. Slide the Outer Bag into the Lining right sides together. Align the top edges on the two pieces and pin together. Sew around the top edge (Fig. 6).

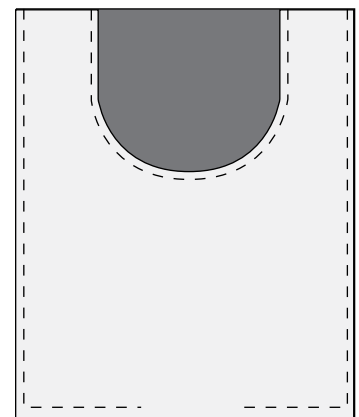

8. Turn the bag right side out through the opening in the Lining and press. Topstitch the opening closed to complete the Clothes Pin Bag Version #1 (Fig. 7).

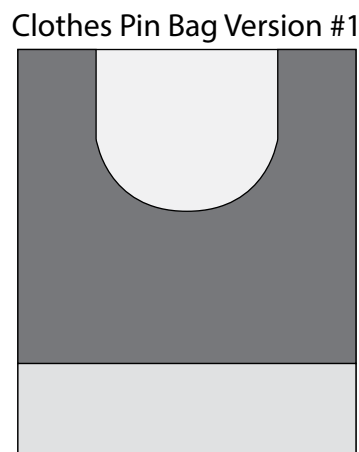

9. Slide a pants hanger into the top of the bag for hanging.

10. Repeat Steps 1-9 to and refer to Figure 8 for fabric identification and placement to make the Clothes Pin Bag Version #2.

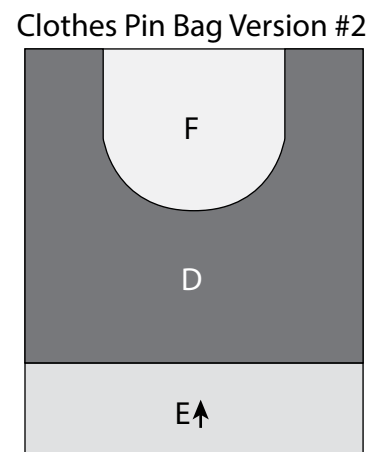
