
(2) 30" pieces of ¼" cotton cord for EACH drawstring bag Piecing and sewing thread Quilting and sewing supplies

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Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (5963-9 Stain Removal Instructions - White), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 6 ½" x 12 ½" strips.
- (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 5 ½" x 12 ½" strips.
- (1) 2" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 2" x 13" strips.

Fabric B (5959-99 Large Tossed Clothespins - Black), cut:

• (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 4 ½" x 12 ½" strips.

Fabric C (5956-9 Tossed Underwear - Light Gray), cut:

• (1) 12 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 12 ½" x 15 ½" rectangles for Drawstring Bag Version #1.

Fabric D (5955-90 Tossed Irons - Light Gray), cut:

• (1) 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips and (2) 2" x 13" strips.

Fabric E (5964-90 Check - Black and White), cut:

• (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 1 ½" x 12 ½" strips.

Fabric F (5962-99 Laundry Symbols - Black), cut:

• (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 5 ½" x 12 ½" strips.

Fabric G (5960-93 Small Tossed Clothespins - Warm Gray), cut:

• (1) 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles for Drawstring Bag Version #2.

Fabric H (5954-99 Cotton Plant - Black), cut:

- (1) 12 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 12 ½" x 15 ½" rectangles.
- (1) 2" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 2" x 13" strips.

Fabric I (5953-99 Large Floral - Black), cut:

• (1) 12 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 12 ½" x 15 ½" rectangles for Drawstring Bag Version #3.

Sewing

Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Bag Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Unit 1

- 1. Sew (1) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A strip to the top of the 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric A strip to the bottom of the Fabric B strip to make (1) Unit 1 rectangle (Fig. 1). Repeat to make a second Unit 1 piece.
- 2. Fold in the short end of (1) 2" x 13" Fabric A strip a ¼" and then a second ¼" and press. Sew the fold in place to create a finished edge. Repeat with the other short end of the strip to make (1) Unit 2 strip (Fig. 2). Repeat to make a second Unit 2 strip.
- 3. Fold each Unit 2 strip in half lengthwise, wrong sides together and press (Fig. 3). Repeat with the other Unit 2 strip.






- 4. Align the raw edges of the Unit 2 strip with the top edge and on the right side of the Unit 1 rectangle. Pin the Unit 2 in place. Sew the Unit 2 strip to Unit 1 rectangle to make the drawstring channel (Fig. 4). Repeat with the second Unit 2 strip and remaining Unit 1 rectangle to make the Outer Bag Front and Outer Bag Back rectangles.
- 5. Place the Outer Bag Front and Outer Bag Back rectangles, right sides together. Sew down the long sides and across the bottom to make the Outer Bag (Fig. 5). Turn the outer bag right side out.
- 6. Place (2) 12 ½" x 15 ½" Fabric C rectangles right sides together. Sew down the long sides and across the bottom, leaving a 3" opening at the bottom for turning to make the Lining (Fig. 6). Leave the lining inside out.







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- 7. Slide the Outer Bag into the Lining right sides together. Make sure the draw string channels are folded down in between the layers. Align raw edges on the Outer Bag, drawstring channels and Lining at the top and pin the layers together (Fig. 7).
- 8. Sew around the top of the pieces to make the drawstring bag. Turn the bag right side out through the opening in the lining and press. Topstitch the opening closed.
- 9. Slide the lining into the bag.




- 10. Slide (1) 30" piece of cord into each drawstring channel (Fig. 8). Tie the two ends together on each side to create the draw string for the bag.
- 11. Repeat Steps 1-10 and refer to Figure 9 for fabric identification and placement to make (1) Drawstring Bag Version #2.
- 12. Repeat Steps 1-10 and refer to Figure 10 for fabric identification and placement to make (1) Drawstring Bag Version #3.
