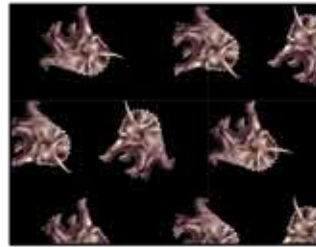

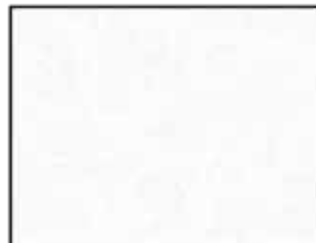

Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (6079-11 Border Stripe – Sky Blue):

- Fussy cut (3) 9 ½" x 48 ½" LOF strips, each centered on a stripe.

Fabric B (1351-Stone Just Color! – Stone), cut:

- (7) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (6) 1 ½" x 48 ½" strips.
- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 65 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 50 ½" strips.

Fabric C (6070-33 Fossil Texture Tonal – Tan), cut:

- (2) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 4 ½" squares.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric D (6077-33 Brachiosaurus Valley – Tan), cut:

- (2) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (6) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

Fabric E (1351-Pigment White Just Color! – Pigment White), cut:

- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (96) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric F (6072-99 Triceratops Tossed Allover – Black), cut:

- (2) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 4 ½" squares.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric G (1351-Onyx Just Color! – Onyx), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 2 ½" squares.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric H (1351-Camel Just Color! – Camel), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric I (6075-99 Dinosaurs Tossed Allover – Black), cut:

- (2) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (6) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

Fabric J (6076-99 Dinosaur Collage – Black), cut:

- (2) 5 ½" x 67 ½" LOF strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 5 ½" x 60" WOF strips, piece as needed.

Backing (6073-11 Pterodactyl Tossed Allover – Sky Blue), cut:

- (2) 85" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 68" x 85" to make the back.

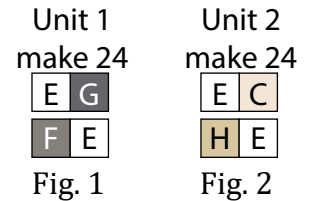
Sewing

Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

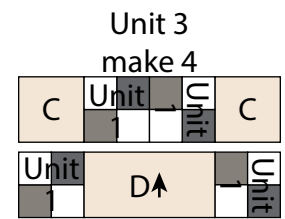
1. Sew (1) 2 ½" Fabric E square to the left side of (1) 2 ½" Fabric G square to make the top row. Sew (1) 2 ½" Fabric F square to the left side of (1) 2 ½" Fabric E square to make the bottom row. Sew together the (2) rows lengthwise to make (1) 4 ½" Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (24) Unit 1 squares total.



2. Repeat Step 1 and refer to Figure 2 for fabric identification and placement to make (24) Unit 2 squares.

3. Sew together (1) 4 ½" Fabric C square, (2) Unit 1 squares and (1) 4 ½" Fabric C square, in that order from left to right, to make the top row (Fig. 3).

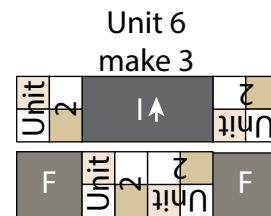
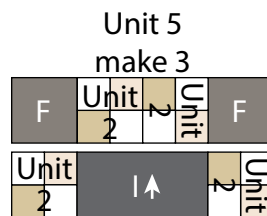
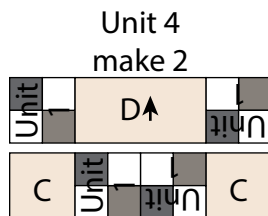
4. Sew Unit 1 square to each end of (1) 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric D strip to make the bottom row (Fig. 3).



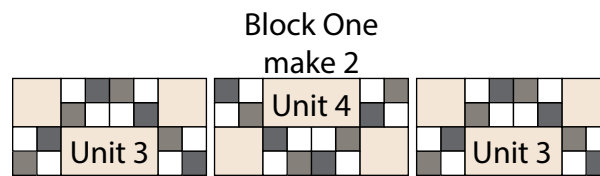
5. Sew together the (2) rows from Steps 3-4 lengthwise to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 3).

6. Repeat Steps 3-5 to make (4) Unit 3 strips total.

7. Repeat Steps 3-5 and refer to Figures 4-6 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (2) Unit 4 strips, (3) Unit 5 strips and (3) Unit 6 strips.



8. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to each end of (1) Unit 4 strip to make (1) Block One strip (Fig. 7). Repeat to make a second Block One strip.



9. Repeat Step 8 and refer to Figures 8-9 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (1) Block Two strip and (1) Block Three strip.

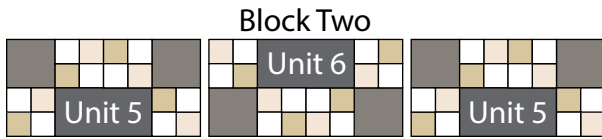

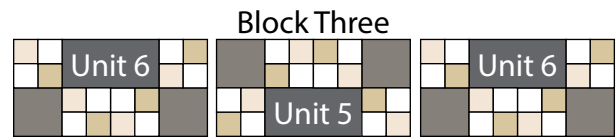

10. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 48 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) 9 1/2" x 48 1/2" Fabric A strip lengthwise to make (1) Block Four strip (Fig. 10). Repeat to make (3) Block Four strips total.

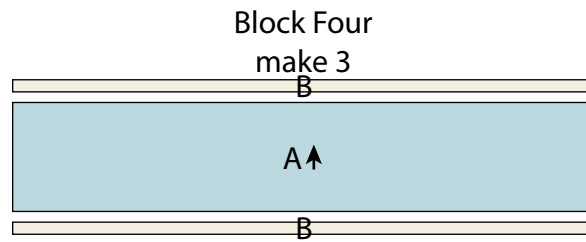

11. Sew together (1) Block One strip, (1) Block Four strip, (1) Block Two strip, (1) Block Four strip, (1) Block Three strip, (1) Block Four strip and (1) Block One strip, lengthwise and in that order from top to bottom, to make the 48 1/2" x 65 1/2" Center Block.

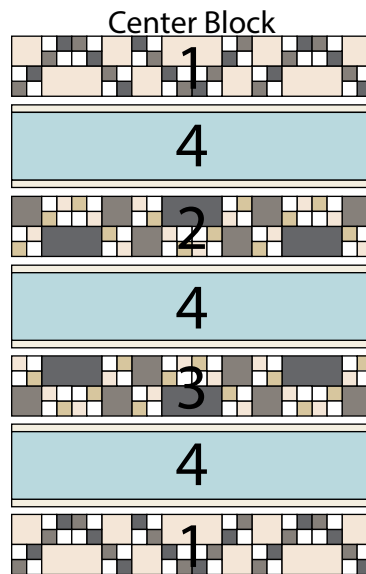

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

12. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 65 1/2" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 50 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

13. Sew (1) 5 1/2" x 67 1/2" Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 1/2" x 60 1/2" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

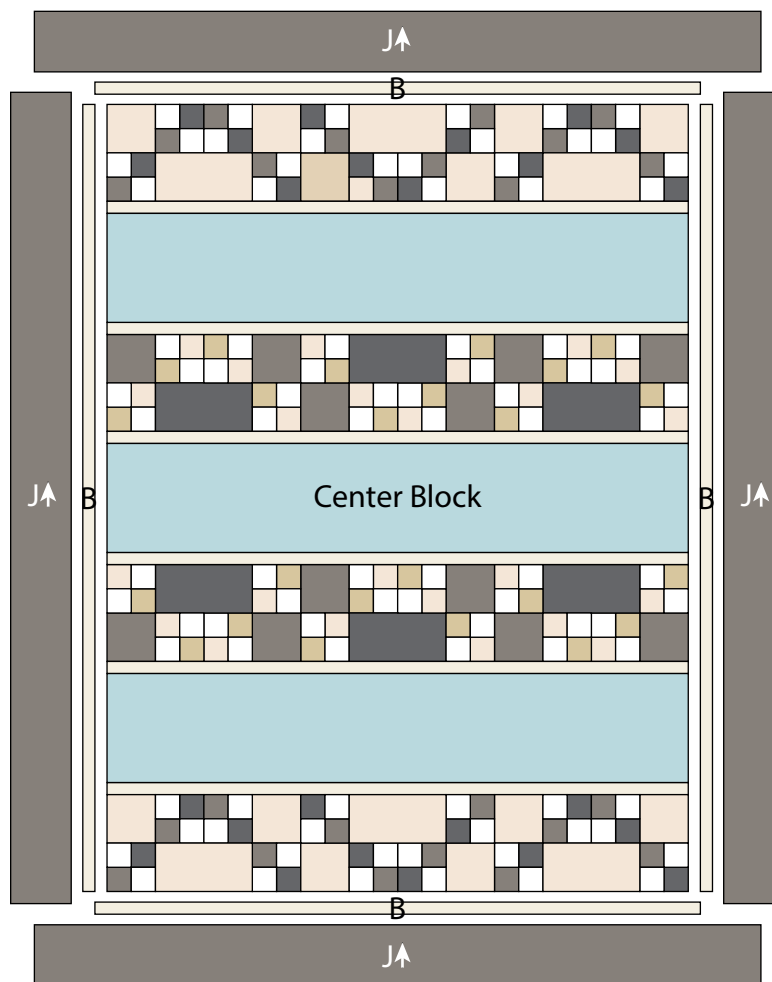
Layering, Quilting and Finishing

14. Press the quilt top and 68" x 85" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

15. Cut the ends of the (7) Fabric G binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

16. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
