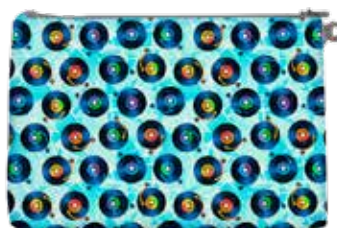

(C) 7358-93 1/4 yard (0.23 m)
(D) 7362-18 1/2 yard (0.46 m)

Zipper Pouch Fabric Requirements

- (A) 7361-17 1/4 yard (0.23 m)
(B) 7359-22 1/4 yard (0.23 m)
(C) 7364-22 1/4 yard (0.23 m)
(D) 1351-Denim+ 1/4 yard (0.23 m)
(E) 7360-08 1/4 yard (0.23 m)
(F) 7358-93 1/4 yard (0.23 m)
(G) 7363-78 1/4 yard (0.23 m)

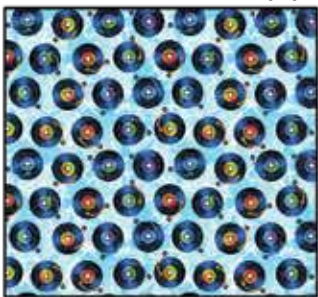

Tote Cutting

Tote Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (7359-22 Stars – Pink), cut:

- (1) 5" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 5" x 15 ½" strips.
- (2) 3 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (4) 3 ½" x 15 ½" strips.

Fabric B (1351-Navy Just Color! – Navy), cut:

- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (4) 1 ½" x 15 ½" strips.
- (2) 4" x WOF strips

Fabric C (7358-93 Stadium Mew-sic Legends – Multi), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (2) 6 ½" x 15 ½" strips.

Fabric D (7362-18 Drum Kit – Blue/Red), cut:

- (1) 15 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (2) 15 ½" x 16" strips.

Fusible Fleece, cut:

- (2) 15 ½" x 16" strips
- (2) 1" x WOF strips

Tote Sewing

Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Tote Assembly

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 15 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) 6 ½" x 15 ½" Fabric C strip. Sew (1) 3 ½" x 15 ½" Fabric A strip to the top of the newly sewn strip and (1) 5" x 15 ½" Fabric A strip to the bottom of the newly sewn strip to make (1) Unit 1 rectangle (Fig. 1). Repeat to make a second Unit 1 rectangle.

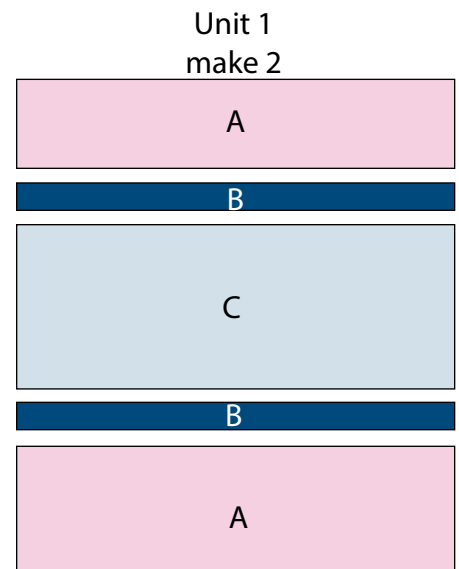

2. Following the manufacturer's instructions to press (1) 15 ½" x 16" piece of fusible fleece to the wrong side of (1) Unit 1 rectangle to make (1) Unit 2 rectangle (Fig. 2). Quilt as desired. Repeat to make a second Unit 2 rectangle.

3. Place the (2) Unit 2 rectangles, right sides together. Sew down each short side and across the bottom to make (1) Unit 3 rectangle (Fig. 3).

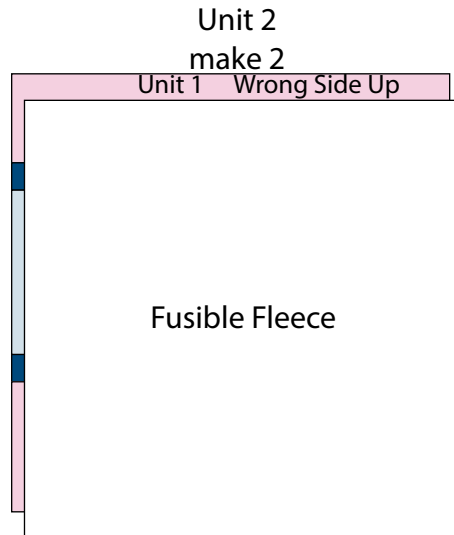

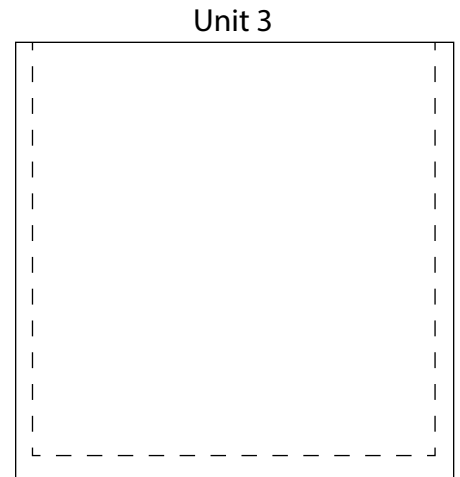

4. Measure in from the left side and up from the bottom 1 ½" and draw a box. Repeat with the bottom right corner (Fig. 4).

5. Cut out each corner on the drawn line as shown in Figure 4 to make the Outer Bag.

6. Open the cut bottom on the Outer Bag and align the bottom seam with the side seam to align and pin the two cut edges (Fig. 5). Sew the two edges together to make a box corner. Repeat with the other bottom corner on the outer bag.

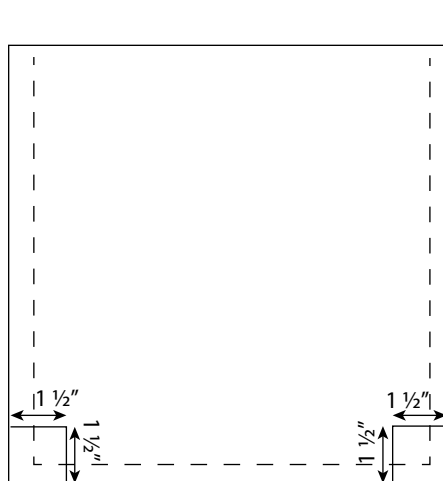

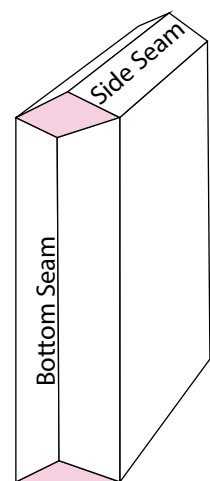
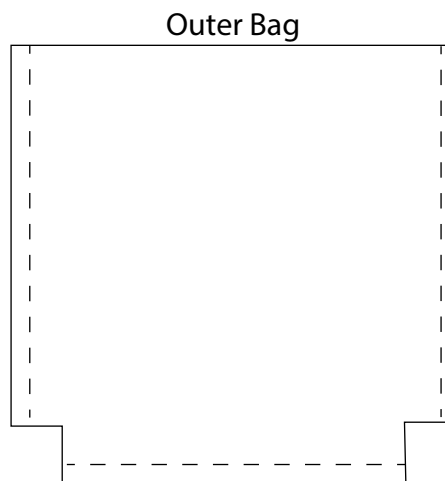

7. Place (2) 15 ½" x 16" Fabric D pieces, right sides together. Sew down each short side and across the bottom, leaving a 4" opening for turning to make the lining (Fig. 6).

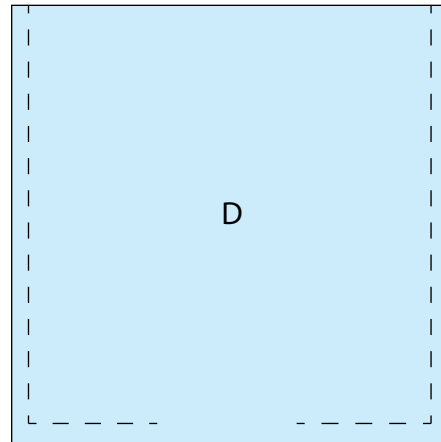

8. Repeat Steps 5-6 to cut the bottom corners of the lining (Fig. 7).

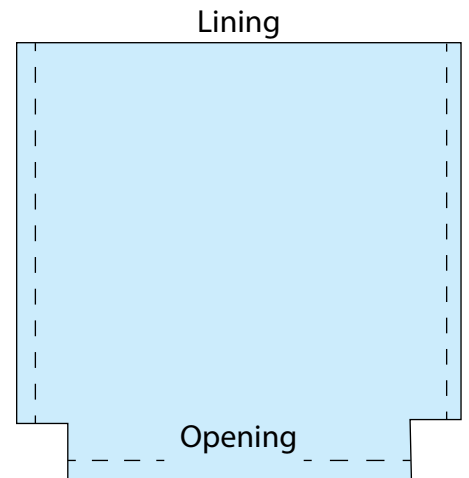

9. Repeat Step 7 with the Lining to make a Box Bottom on the lining.

10. Fold (1) 4" x WOF Fabric B strip in half lengthwise and press (Fig. 8). Open the folded fabric and fold each long edge to the creased centerline and press (Fig. 9).

11. Fold the pressed fabric in half again and press to make (1) 1 ¼" x WOF strip (Fig. 10). Slide (1) 1" Fusible Fleece strip into the folded tube and trim as needed. Top stitch down both long sides 1/8" in from the edge to make (1) Strap. (Fig. 11). Trim the Strap to the desired length. Repeat to make a second Strap.

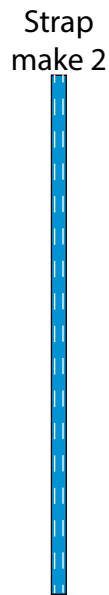

12. Align one short end of (1) Strap the front of the Outer Bag 1 ½" from each corner and pin in place. Repeat with the second Strap and Outer Bag back. (Fig. 12).

13. Slide Outer Bag with the Straps into the Lining, right sides together. Make sure the Straps are between the Lining and Outer Bag. Align the raw edges on the Lining with the raw edges on the Outer Bag and pin the layers together (Fig. 13). Sew the layers together around the top edge to make the Bag.

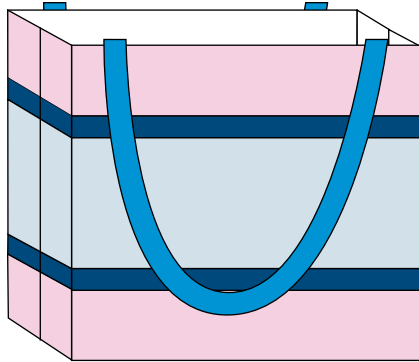

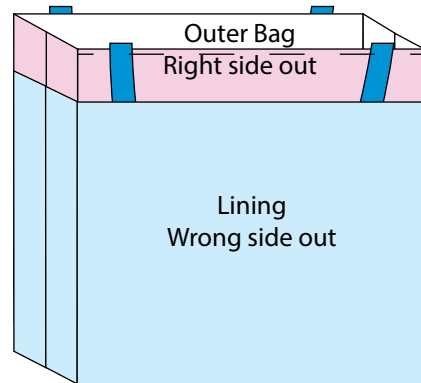

14. Turn the Bag right side out through the opening in the Lining. Turn in the raw edges at the opening a ¼" and press. Topstitch the opening closed (Fig. 14).

15. Push the Lining into the Bag and press to complete.

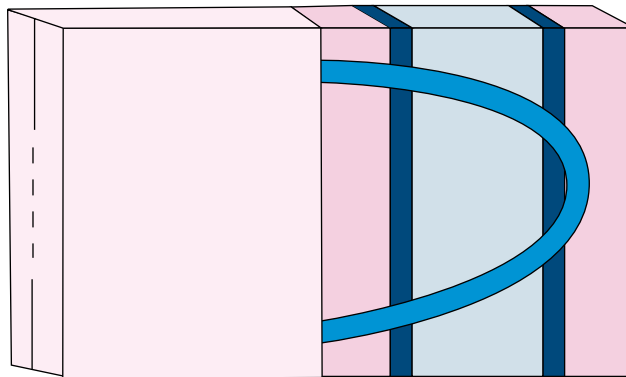

Zipper Pouch Cutting

Zipper Pouch Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (7361-17 LP Records – Blue), cut:

- (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 5 ½" x 7 ½" strips.

Fabric B (7359-22 Stars – Pink), cut:

- (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 5 ½" x 7 ½" strips.

Fabric C (7364-22 Words – Pink), cut:

- (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 5 ½" x 7 ½" strips.

Fabric D (1351-Denim Just Color! – Denim), cut:

- (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 5 ½" x 7 ½" strips.

Fabric E (7360-08 Lightning Bolts – White), cut:

- (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 5 ½" x 7 ½" strips.

Fabric F (7358-93 Stadium Mew-sic Legends – Multi), cut:

- (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 5 ½" x 7 ½" strips.

Fabric G (7363-78 Electric Guitars – Dark Blue), cut:

- (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 5 ½" x 7 ½" strips.

Fabric H (7362-18 Drum Kit – Blue/Red), cut:

- (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 5 ½" x 7 ½" strips.

Fusible Fleece, cut:

- (2) 5 ½" x 7 ½" strips for each zipper pouch.

Zipper Pouch Sewing

Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Zipper Pouch Assembly

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components.

Optional: You can use a washout glue stick to hold the zipper to the fabric before sewing.

16. Press (1) 5 ½" x 7 ½" strip of Fusible Fleece to the wrong side of each 5 ½" x 7 ½" Fabric A strip and quilt as desired.

17. Place (1) 5 ½" x 7 ½" Fabric B strip on a flat surface right side up. Center and align (1) 8" zipper with the top edge of the 7 ½" edge of the Fabric B strip, both pieces right side up (Fig. 15).

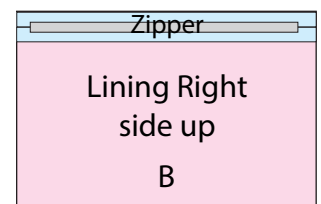

18. Place (1) 5 ½" x 7 ½" Fabric A strip, right side down on the zipper, with the Fabric A edge at the top (Fig. 16).

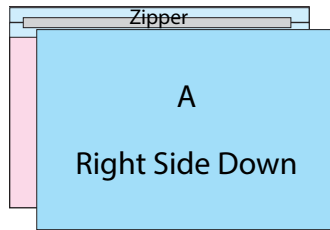

19. Using a zipper foot, sew the three layers together (Fig. 17). Flip the sewn unit right side out (Fig. 18).

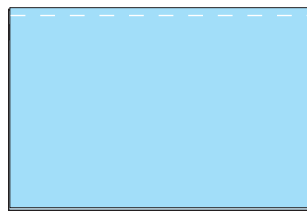

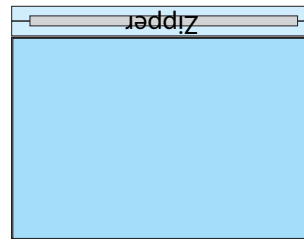

20. Place the second 5 ½" x 7 ½" Fabric B strip on a flat surface. Place the other side of the zipper of the sewn unit on top of the Fabric B strip right side up, aligning the top edges (Fig. 19). Place the second 5 ½" x 7 ½" Fabric A piece on top right side up (Fig. 20).

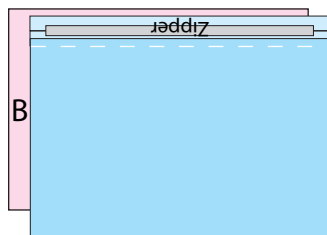

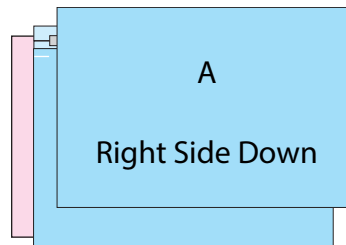

21. Using a zipper foot, sew the three layers together (Fig. 21).

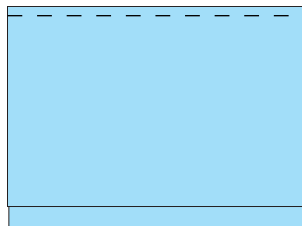

22. Flip the sewn unit right side out so there is a 5 ½" x 7 ½" Fabric A piece and a 5 ½" x 7 ½" Fabric B piece on each side of the zipper. Topstitch through the layers of fabric next to the zipper to finish the edges (Fig. 22).

23. Unzip the zipper halfway to create an opening for turning. Flip the Fabric A pieces, right side together and the Fabric B pieces right sides together, aligning the edges on both halves and pin (Fig. 23).

24. Stitch around the Fabric A side and Fabric B side, leaving a 3" to 4" opening on the Fabric B side for turning (Fig. 24).

25. Turn the zipper pouch right side out through the opening in the Fabric B side and through the open zipper. Stitch the opening closed and push the Fabric B side into the zipper pouch for the lining.

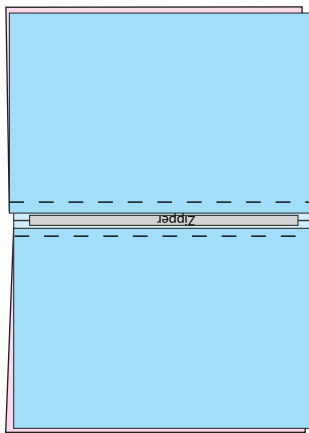

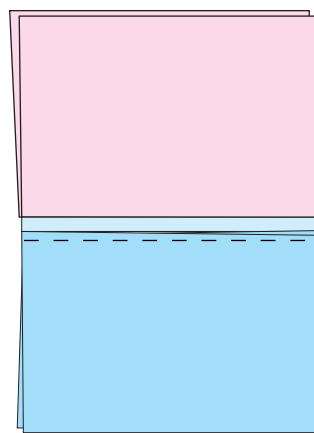

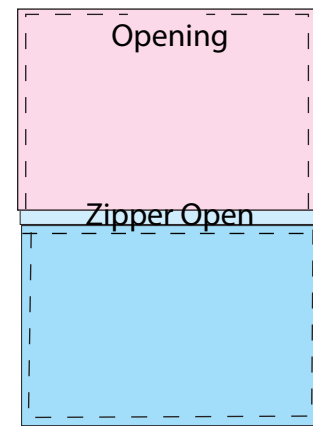

26. Repeat Steps 16-25 with Fabric C as the outer bag and Fabric D as the lining.

27. Repeat Steps 16-25 with Fabric E as the outer bag and Fabric F as the lining.

28. Repeat Steps 16-25 with Fabric G as the outer bag and Fabric H as the lining.
