Cutting Requirements

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted. WOF=Width of Fabric. Seam allowance is ¼".

Fabric A 2880-11 Wildflower Bird Sky Blue

- (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips, recut into: (24) 3 ½" squares
- (3) 5" circles from template

Fabric B 2880-50 Wildflower Bird Lilac

• (4) 3 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles

Fabric C 2880-58 Wildflower Bird Purple

• (4) 3 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles

Fabric D 2880-77 Wildflower Bird Navy

- (7) 4 ½" x WOF strips, pieced into:
 - (2) 4 ½" x 62 ½" outer border sides
 - (2) 4 ½" x 60 ½" outer border top and bottom

Fabric E 2881-17 Wildflower Mono Sky Blue

• (4) 3 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles

Fabric F 2881-66 Wildflower Mono Green

• (4) 3 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles

Fabric G 2881-58 Wildflower Mono Purple

• (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips pieced together end to end with diagonal seams for binding

Fabric H 2881-77 Wildflower Mono Navy

- (5) 6 ½" x WOF strips, recut into:
 - (10) 6 ½" squares
 - (40) 6 ½" x 3 ½" rectangles
- (4) 3 ½" x WOF strips, recut into:
 - (40) 3 ½" squares

Fabric I 2882-05 Medallion Lt. Lilac

- (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips, recut into:
 - (24) 3 ½" squares
- (6) 1 ½" x WOF strips, pieced into:
 - (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 60 $\frac{1}{2}$ " inner side border strip
 - (1) 1 ½" x 50 ½" inner border bottom strip
- (3) 5" circles from template

Fabric J 2882-06 Medallion Lt. Green

- (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips, recut into:
 - (32) 3 ½" squares
- (6) 1 ½" x WOF strips, pieced into:
 - (1) 1 ½" x 60 ½" inner border side strip
 - (1) 1 ½" x 50 ½" inner border top strip
- (4) 5" circles from template

Fabric K 2882-77 Medallion Navy

- (2) 3 ½" x WOF strips, recut into:
 - (12) 3 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles

Fabric L 2883-55 Raindrops Purple

• (2) 3 ½" x WOF strips, recut into: (8) 3 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles

Fabric M 2883-66 Raindrops Green

• (4) 3 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles

Fabric N 2883-77 Raindrops Blue

• (4) 3 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles

Fabric O 2884-55 Abalone Texture Purple

• (4) 3 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles

Fabric P 2884-77 Abalone Texture Navy

• (4) 3 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles

Fabric Q 1549 Midnight

• (20) 2 ½" x WOF strips, recut into: (320) 2 ½" squares

Fabric R 1549 Sprout

• (2) 3 ½" x WOF strips, recut into: (8) 3 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles

Fabric S 1549 Garden

• (4) 3 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles

Fabric T 1549 Fire

• (4) 3 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles

Fabric U 1549 Daffodil

• (4) 3 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles

Fabric V 1549 Plum

• (4) 3 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles

Fabric W 1549 Rose

• (4) 3 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles


Star Blocks

Flying Geese Unit

1. Draw a line from corner to corner on the wrong side of a 3 ½" x 3 ½" **Fabric I** square. Place right sides together, on end of a 3 ½" x 6 ½" **Fabric H** rectangle. Sew on the drawn line. Trim ¼" from seam and press. Repeat on the other end of the rectangle. Trim. Make four flying geese units.



- 2. Sew one flying geese unit to opposite sides of a 6 ½" x 6 ½" **Fabric H** square.
- 3. Sew a 3 ½" x 3 ½" **Fabric H** square to each side of the two remaining flying geese units. Sew to the top and bottom of the block, Make *three blocks* with **Fabric I** and **Fabric H**.




4. Using your preferred method of applique, add the corresponding applique circle to the center of the block. If you choose needle turn applique, add a seam allowance to the circles.

5. Using the same method, make *three blocks with Fabric A* and *H* and four blocks with Fabric J and H, for a total of 10 blocks. They measure 12 ½" x 12 ½" unfinished.



Sew 1 ½" x 60 ½" **Fabric J** strip to the right side of the quilt. Sew 1 ½" x 60 ½" **Fabric I** strip to the left side of the quilt. Sew 1 ½" x 50 ½" **Fabric J** strip to the top of the quilt.

Sew 1 ½ x 50 ½ **Fabric J** strip to the top of the quilt. Sew 1 ½" x 50 ½" **Fabric I** strip to the bottom of the quilt.

Diamond Blocks

1. Using the flying geese method described above, sew a 2 ½" **Fabric Q** square to each corner of an assorted 3 ½" x 6 ½" rectangle. Trim. Make 80 diamond units.



2. Join eight diamond units together as shown to make one block. Make 10 blocks. They measure 12 ½" x 12 ½" unfinished.

Quilt Top

Using the quilt picture as a guide, arrange the blocks in five rows of four blocks in each row. Press seams in opposite directions.

Borders:

Cut sizes are given for the borders. However, your quilt top measurements may vary slightly, so measure your quilt top through the middle in both directions and adjust sizes as necessary. Press border seams toward the borders.

Refer to the picture of the quilt for fabric placement.

Outer Border

Sew 4 ½" x 62 ½" **Fabric D** strips to each side. Sew 4 ½" x 60 ½" **Fabric D** strips to the top and bottom.

Layering, Quilting and Finishing

Piece backing to make (1) 72" x 80" backing piece. Press quilt top and backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

Cut the ends of **Fabric G** (7) 2 ½" binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew together end to end to make one continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back and hand stitch in place.
