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Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (4675-89 24" Block - Red/Gray):

• Fussy cut (6) 11" squares each centered on a block.

Fabric B (1351-Onyx Just Color! - Onyx), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 2" x 11" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 2" x 14" strips.
- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric C (4676-90 Scottie Dog Allover - Gray), cut:

• (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (6) 4 ½" squares.

Fabric D (4678-44 Stars - Beige), cut:

• (6) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 1 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

Fabric E (4679-89 Small Bias Buffalo Check - Black/Red), cut:

• (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

Fabric F (4684-89 Small Blocks with Cars and Trucks – Red):

• Fussy cut (24) 3" squares each centered on a block.

Fabric G (Charcoal-14 Peppered Cottons - Charcoal), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 2" x 3" strips.
- (7) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 2" x 6" strips.

Fabric H (4683-88 Snowflakes - Red), cut:

- (3) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 58 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (3) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 50 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (3) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $48\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 38 ½" WOF strips.

Fabric I (4682-89 Cars and Trucks Stripe - Gray), cut:

- (2) 4 ½" x 50 ½" LOF strips.
- (2) 4 ½" x 38 ½" LOF strips.

Fabric I (4677-44 Mistletoe - Beige), cut:

• (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4 ½" squares.

Backing (4680-90 Tossed Dogs - Gray), cut:

• (2) 58" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 58" x 70" to make the back.


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Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

- 1. Sew (1) 2" x 11" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 11" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2" x 14" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square. Trim the block to measure 12 ½" square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.
- 2. Sew (1) 2" x 3" Fabric G strip to each side of (1) 3" Fabric F square. Sew (1) 2" x 6" Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric F square. Trim the unit to measure $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (24) Unit 1 squares total.
- 3. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric E strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (24) Unit 2 squares total.
- 4. Sew (1) Unit 1 square to each side of (1) Unit 2 square to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to each side of (1) 4 ½" Fabric C square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (6) Block Two squares total.



Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

- 5. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Two square to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Three.
- 6. Sew (1) Block Two square to each side of (1) Block One square to make Row Two. Repeat to make Row Four.
- 7. Sew the (4) rows together in numerical order to make the Center Block.
- 8. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 48 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 38 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 9. Sew (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x 50 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the sewn strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.


10. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 58 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to the each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 50 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

Layering, Quilting and Finishing

11. Press the quilt top and 58" x 70" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

- 12. Cut the ends of the (6) Fabric B binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.
- 13. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
