## Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted. WOF $=$ Width of Fabric $\bullet$ LOF $=$ Length of Fabric

Fabric A (4746P-98 Panel - Black):

- Fussy cut (1) $22 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 421 / 22^{\prime \prime}$ panel.

Fabric B (1351-Burgundy Just Color! - Burgundy), cut:

- (2) 2 " x $421 / 2$ " WOF strips, piece as needed.
- (2) 2 " x $25 \frac{1}{2 \prime}$ " WOF strips.
- (6) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric C (4756-44 Cracked Texture - Ecru), cut:

- (3) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ x $441 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips.
- (2) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 26 \frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips.

Fabric D (4754-86 Diagonal Stripe - Multi), cut:

- (3) $21 / 4$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $21 / 41$ x $461 / 2$ " strips.
- (2) $21 / 4 " \times 30 "$ WOF strips.

Fabric E (4755-99 Christmas Lights - Black), cut:

- (3) $51 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $5 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 50$ " strips.
- (2) $51 / 2 " \times 40$ " WOF strips.

Fabric F (4751-98 Scenic Stripe - Multi), cut:

- (2) $43 / 4$ " x 72 " LOF strips.
- (2) $43 / 4$ " x 52" LOF strips.

Backing (4750-48 Packed Snowmen - Multi), cut:

- (2) 76 " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 48 " x 68 " to make the back.

Sew using a $1 \nmid 4$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

## Block Assembly

1. Sew (1) 2 " $\times 421 / 2 "$ Fabric B strip to each side of (1) $221 / 2 " \times 421 / 2 "$ Fabric A panel. Sew (1) $2^{\prime \prime} \times 251 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). Trim the block to measure $241 / 2 "$ x $441 / 2$ ".

## Quilt Top Assembly

## (Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

2. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $44 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 26 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
3. Sew (1) $21 / 4$ " $\times 461 / 2 "$ Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $21 / 4 " \times 30 "$ Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
4. Sew (1) $51 / 2 " \times 50 "$ Fabric E strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $51 / 2 " \times 40^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
5. Center (1) $43 / 4 " \times 72$ " Fabric F strip on one side of the Center Block. Start sewing the strip a $1 / 4$ " from the top edge of the Center Block and stop a $1 / 4$ " from the bottom edge. DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS. Repeat with the opposite side.
6. Repeat Step 5 to sew (1) $43 / 4 " \times 52^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric F strip to the top and (1)
$43 / 4 " \mathrm{x} 52$ " Fabric F strip to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start $1 / 4$ " away from each end of the Center Block.
7. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal wrong side together . This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 2).
8. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 2) draw a 45-degree line out to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the


Fig. 2 excess fabric leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.

## Layering, Quilting and Finishing

9. Press the quilt top and $56^{\prime \prime} \times 76^{\prime \prime}$ backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

## Binding

10. Cut the ends of the (6) Fabric B binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.
11. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place


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
