

- (G) 7228-90 3/4 yard
- (H) 7231-90 1/2 yard

- (I) 7223-68 2 1/8 yards
- Backing
- 7226-68 5 1/8 yards





Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (7222-68 Animal Blocks – Multi):

- Fussy cut (6) 10 ½" squares, each centered on a block.

Fabric B (1351-Burgundy Just Color! – Burgundy), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 2" x 10 ½" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 2" x 13 ½" strips.
- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 69 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 53 ½" strips.
- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric C (7227-69 Forest Scene – Green/Gray), cut:

- (2) 6 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 6 ½" squares.

Fabric D (Lake-00 Peppered Cottons – Lake), cut:

- (8) 3 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (96) 3 ½" squares.

Fabric E (7230-09 Animal Tracks – Gray), cut:

- (8) 3 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 3 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (4) 3 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (40) 3 ½" squares.

Fabric F (7225-88 Snow Birds – Red), cut:

- (2) 3 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (10) 3 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 3 ½" squares.

Fabric G (7228-90 Tossed Animals – Gray), cut:

- (3) 6 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (17) 6 ½" squares.

Fabric H (7231-90 Birch Stripe – Gray), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 66 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 51 ½" strips.

Fabric I (7223-68 Tossed Greenery – Multi), cut:

- (2) 6 ½" x 71 ½" LOF strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 6 ½" x 65 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.

Backing (7226-68 Winter Berries – Multi), cut:

- (2) 91" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 73" x 91" to make the back.


Sewing

Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) $2'' \times 10 \frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric B strip to each side of (1) $10 \frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric A square. Sew (1) $2'' \times 13 \frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure $12 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 12 \frac{1}{2}''$.** Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.



2. Place (1) $3 \frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric D square on the left side of (1) $3 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 6 \frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric E strip, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance (Fig. 3).

3. Place another $3 \frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric D square on the right side of the $3 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 6 \frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric E strip, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 5).

4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (48) Unit 1 strips total.

5. Repeat Steps 2-3 and refer to Figure 6 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (10) Unit 2 strips.









6. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of (1) $6 \frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric G square to make (1) $6 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 12 \frac{1}{2}''$ Block Two rectangle (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (17) Block Two rectangles total.



7. Sew (1) $3 \frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric E square to each end of (1) Unit 2 strip to make (1) $3 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 12 \frac{1}{2}''$ Block Three strip (Fig. 8). Repeat to make (10) Block Three strips total.



8. Sew together (1) 3 ½" Fabric F square, (1) Unit 1 strip, (1) Block Three strip, (1) Unit 1 strip, (1) Block Three strip, (1) Unit 1 strip and (1) 3 ½" Fabric F square, in that order from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 9). Repeat to make Row Nine.

9. Sew together (1) Unit 1 strip, (1) 6 ½" Fabric C square, (1) Block Two rectangle, (1) 6 ½" Fabric C square, (1) Block Two rectangle, (1) 6 ½" Fabric C square and (1) Unit 1 strip, in that order from left to right, to make Row Two (Fig. 9). Repeat to make Row Four, Row Six and Row Eight.

10. Sew together (1) Block Three strip, (1) Block Two rectangle, (1) Block One square, (1) Block Two rectangle, (1) Block One square, (1) Block Two rectangle and (1) Block Three strip, in that order from left to right, to make Row Three. Repeat to make Row Five and Row Seven.

11. Sew together the (9) Rows from Steps 8-10, lengthwise and in numerical order from the top to bottom, to make the 48 ½" x 66 ½" Center Block (Fig. 9).



Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

12. Sew (1) 2" x 66 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 51 ½" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

13. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 69 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 53 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

14. Sew (1) 6 ½" x 71 ½" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 6 ½" x 65 ½" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.


Layering, Quilting and Finishing

15. Press the quilt top and 73" x 91" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

16. Cut the ends of the (8) Fabric B binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

17. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
