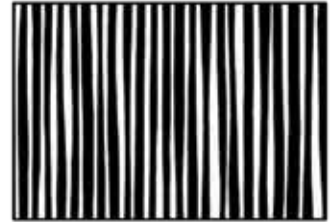

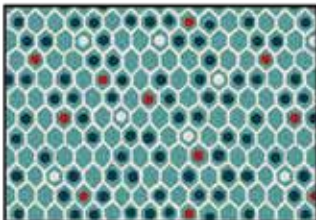

## Runner Cutting

### Runner Cutting Instructions

*Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.*

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

#### **Fabric A (7185-78 4-Inch Blocks – Teal-Red):**

- Fussy cut (3) 4 ½" squares, each centered on a block.

#### **Fabric B (7190-39 Diagonal Words – Off-White), cut:**

- (1) 1 ¾" x WOF strip, sub-cut (6) 1 ¾" x 4 ½" strips.
- (1) 1 ¾" x WOF strip, sub-cut (6) 1 ¾" x 7" strips.

#### **Fabric C (7188-39 Irregular Stripe – Off-White), cut:**

- (1) 1 ¼" x WOF strip, sub-cut (6) 1 ¼" x 6" strips.
- (2) 1 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (6) 1 ¼" x 7 ½" strips.
- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### **Fabric D (7196-39 Outline Chickens – Off-White), cut:**

- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (6) 1 ½" x 7 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (6) 1 ½" x 9 ½" strips.

#### **Fabric E (7192-71 Eggs – Blue Teal), cut:**

- (1) 2" x WOF strip, sub-cut (16) 2" squares.

#### **Fabric F (White-Sugar Peppered Cottons – White Sugar), cut:**

- (2) 1 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 1 ¼" squares.

#### **Fabric G (7195-91 Hen Scratches – Charcoal), cut:**

- (1) 2" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 2" squares.

#### **Fabric H (7189-76 Ombre Dot – Teal), cut:**

- (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 1 ½" x 9 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 35 ½" WOF strips.

#### **Fabric I (Deep Space-98 Peppered Cottons – Deep Space), cut:**

- (1) 1 ¼" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 1 ¼" x 11 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ¼" x 37" WOF strips.

#### **Fabric J (7187-39 Newsprint – Off-White), cut:**

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 3 ½" x 13" strips.
- (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3 ½" x 43" strips.

#### **Backing (7194-39 Stitched Feathers – Off-White), cut:**

- (1) 51" x 27" WOF strip for the back.

## Runner Sewing

Sew using a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

### Runner Block Assembly

**Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.**

1. Sew (1)  $1\frac{3}{4}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square. Sew (1)  $1\frac{3}{4}$ " x 7" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 6" x 6"**. Repeat to make (3) Unit 1 squares total.

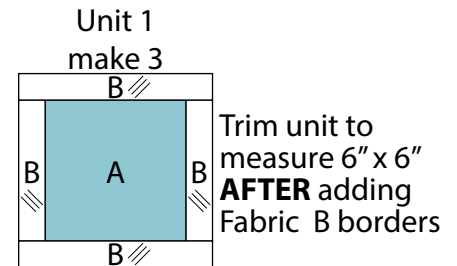

2. Sew (1)  $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square. Sew (1)  $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $7\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 square to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (3) Unit 2 squares total.

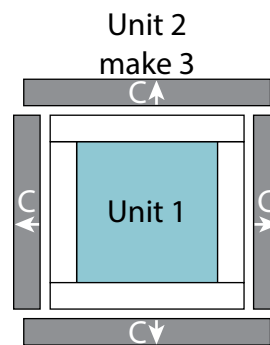

3. Sew (1)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $7\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to each side of (1) Unit 2 square. Sew (1)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $9\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 2 square to make (1)  $9\frac{1}{2}$ " Block One square. Repeat to make (3) Block One squares total.

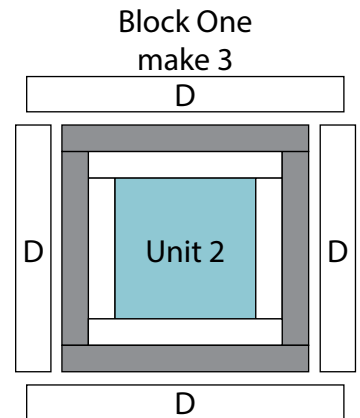

4. Place (1)  $1\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric F square on the bottom left corner of (1) 2" Fabric E square, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam (Fig. 5).

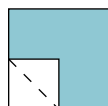

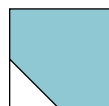

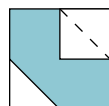

5. Follow Figure 6 for the seam direction to add a  $1\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric F square to the upper right corner of the 2" Fabric E square to make (1) Unit 3 square (Fig. 7).

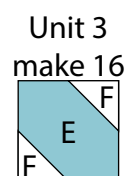

6. Repeat Steps 4-5 to make (16) Unit 3 squares total.

7. Repeat Steps 4-5 and refer to Figure 8 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (8) Unit 4 squares.



8. Sew together (4) Unit 3 squares into a 2 x 2 matrix to make (1) 3 ½" Unit 5 square (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (4) Unit 5 squares total.

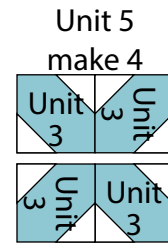

9. Sew together (4) Unit 4 squares into a 2 x 2 matrix to make (1) 3 ½" Unit 6 square (Fig. 10). Repeat to make a second Unit 6 square.

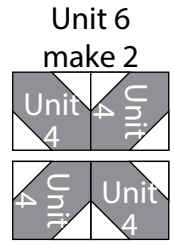

10. Sew (1) Unit 5 square to the top and to the bottom of (1) Unit 6 square to make (1) 3 ½" x 9 ½" Block Two strip (Fig. 11). Repeat to make a second Block Two strip.

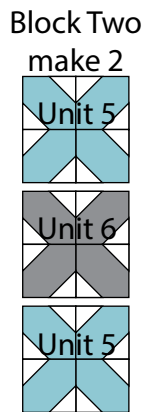

11. Sew together (1) Block One square, (1) Block Two strip, (1) Block One square, (1) Block Two strip and (1) Block One square, in that order from left to right, to make the 33 ½" x 9 ½" Runner Center Block (Fig. 12).

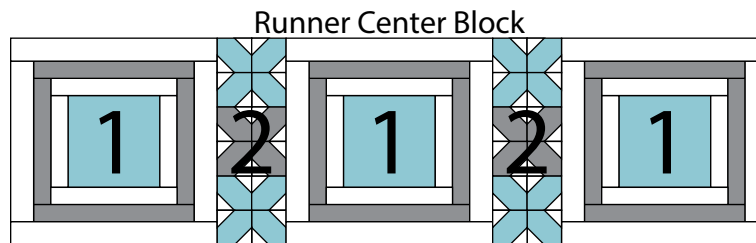

## Runner Assembly

*(Follow the Runner Layout while assembling.)*

12. Sew 1 ½" x 9 ½" Fabric H strip to each end of the Runner Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 35 ½" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Runner Center Block.

13. Sew (1) 1 ¼" x 11 ½" Fabric I strip to each end of the Runner Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ¼" x 37" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Runner Center Block.

14. Sew (1) 3 ½" x 13" Fabric J strip to each end of the Runner Center Block. Sew (1) 3 ½" x 43" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Runner Center Block to make the runner top.

## Runner Layering, Quilting and Finishing

15. Press the runner and 51" x 27" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed runner (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

## Runner Binding

16. Cut the ends of the (4) Fabric C binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

17. Sew the binding to the front of the runner, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.

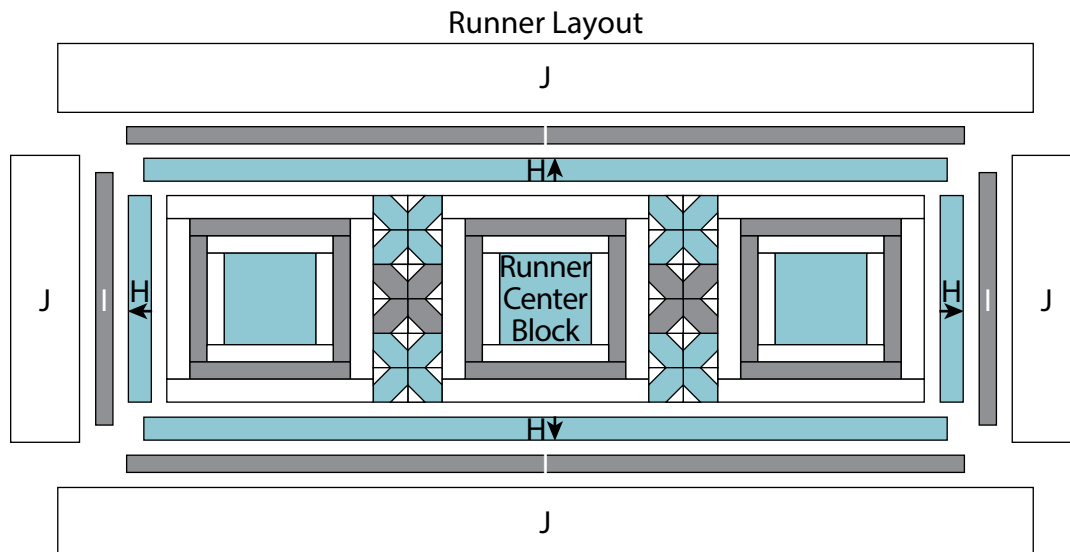

## Place Mat Cutting

### Place Mat Cutting Instructions

*Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.*

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

#### **Fabric A (7185-78 4-Inch Blocks – Teal-Red):**

- Fussy cut (6) 4 ½" squares, each centered on a block.

#### **Fabric B (7190-39 Diagonal Words – Off-White), cut:**

- (2) 1 ¾" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ¾" x 4 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ¾" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ¾" x 7" strips.

#### **Fabric C (7188-39 Irregular Stripe – Off-White), cut:**

- (2) 1 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ¼" x 6" strips.
- (3) 1 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ¼" x 7 ½" strips.

#### **Fabric D (7196-39 Outline Chickens – Off-White), cut:**

- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 7 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 9 ½" strips.

#### **Fabric E (7192-71 Eggs – Blue Teal), cut:**

- (3) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 2" squares.

#### **Fabric F (White-Sugar Peppered Cottons – White Sugar), cut:**

- (5) 1 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (144) 1 ¼" squares.

#### **Fabric G (7195-91 Hen Scratches – Charcoal), cut:**

- (2) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 2" squares.

#### **Fabric H (Deep Space-98 Peppered Cottons – Deep Space), cut:**

- (3) 1 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ¼" x 9 ½" strips.
- (4) 1 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ¼" x 14" strips.

#### **Fabric I (7186-78 Tossed Feathers – Teal-Red), cut:**

- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 11" strips.
- (6) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 16" strips.
- (10) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### **Backing (7191-78 Diagonal Plaid – Teal-Red), cut:**

- (3) 17" x WOF strips, sub-cut (6) 17" x 20" rectangles for the backs.

## Place Mat Sewing

Sew using a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

### Place Mat Block Assembly

**Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.**

18. Sew (1)  $1\frac{3}{4}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square. Sew (1)  $1\frac{3}{4}$ " x 7" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 7 square (Fig. 14). **Trim the block to measure 6" x 6"**. Repeat to make (6) Unit 7 squares total.

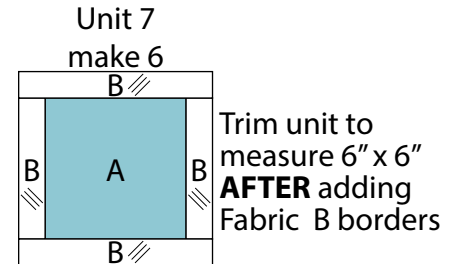

19. Sew (1)  $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 7 square. Sew (1)  $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $7\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 7 square to make (1) Unit 8 square (Fig. 15). Repeat to make (6) Unit 8 squares total.

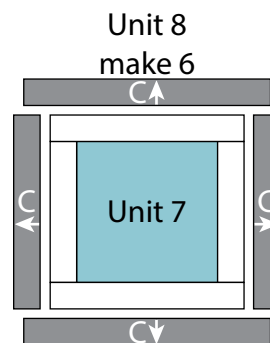

20. Sew (1)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $7\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to each side of (1) Unit 8 square. Sew (1)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $9\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 8 square to make (1)  $9\frac{1}{2}$ " Block Three square. Repeat to make (6) Block Three squares total.

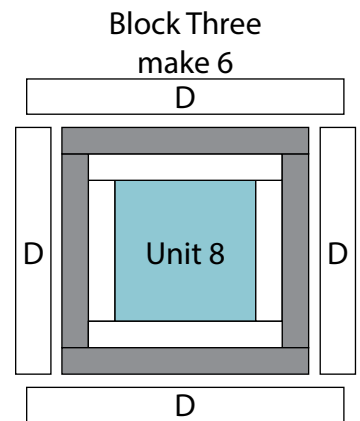

21. Place (1)  $1\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric F square on the bottom left corner of (1) 2" Fabric E square, right sides together (Fig. 17). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 17). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam (Fig. 18).

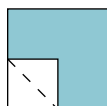

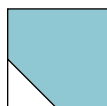

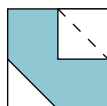

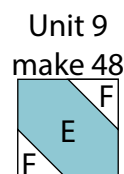

22. Follow Figure 19 for the seam direction to add a  $1\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric F square to the upper right corner of the 2" Fabric E square to make (1) Unit 9 square (Fig. 20).

23. Repeat Steps 21-22 to make (48) Unit 9 squares total.

24. Repeat Steps 21-22 and refer to Figure 21 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (24) Unit 10 squares.

25. Sew together (4) Unit 9 squares into a 2 x 2 matrix to make (1) 3 ½" Unit 11 square (Fig. 22). Repeat to make (12) Unit 11 squares total.

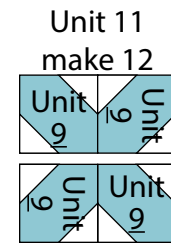

26. Sew together (4) Unit 10 squares into a 2 x 2 matrix to make (1) 3 ½" Unit 12 square (Fig. 23). Repeat to make (6) Unit 12 squares total.

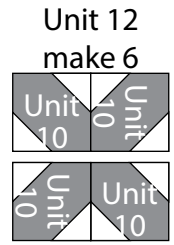

27. Sew (1) Unit 11 square to the top and to the bottom of (1) Unit 12 square to make (1) 3 ½" x 9 ½" Block Four strip (Fig. 24). Repeat to make (6) Block Two strips total.

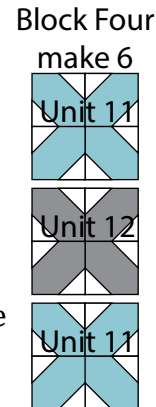

## Place Mat Assembly

*(Follow the Place Mat Layout while assembling.)*

28. Sew (1) Block Four strip to the right side of (1) Block Three square to make (1) Place Mat Center Block (Fig. 25). Repeat to make (6) Place Mat tops total.

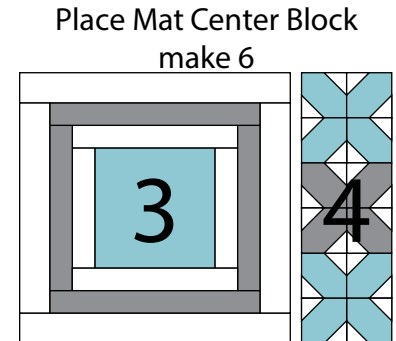

29. Sew (1) 1 ¼" x 9 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of (1) Place Mat Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ¼" x 14" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Place Mat Center Block (Fig. 26).

30. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 11" Fabric I strip to each side of the Place Mat Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 16" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Place Mat Center Block to make (1) Place Mat top (Fig. 26).

31. Repeat Steps 29-30 to make (6) Place Mat tops total.

## Place Mat Layering, Quilting and Finishing

32. Press the place mats and 17" x 20" backings well. Layer backings (wrong side up), batting, pressed place mats (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

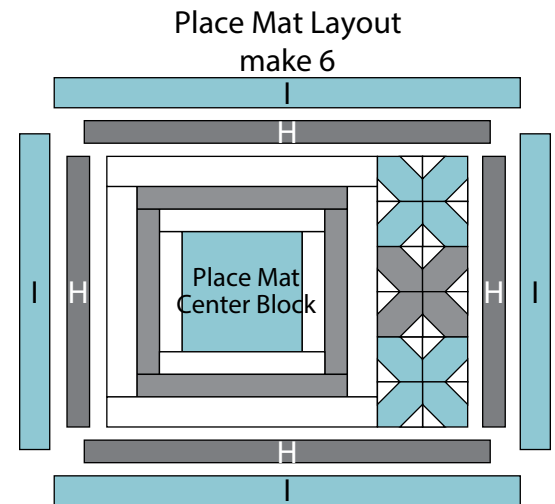

## Place Mat Binding

33. Cut the ends of the (10) Fabric I binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together. Cut the strip onto (6) equal lengths.

34. Sew the binding to the front of the place mats, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
