(G) 6123-43 2 ¹/₄ yards

Backing 6121-48 5 ½ yards

Batting 73" x 97" (Recommended: Air Lite® Colour Me 100% Cotton) Piecing and sewing thread Quilting and sewing supplies

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Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (6126P-43 Panel 24 in x 44 in – Multi):

• Fussy cut (1) 22 ¹/₂" x 43 ¹/₂" rectangle, centered on the panel.

Fabric B (6122-33 Packed Dog Treats – Brown), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 43 ½" strips.
- (2) 2" x 25 ½" WOF strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 76 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 55 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (3) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ¹/₂" x 50 ¹/₂" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 32 ½" WOF strips.

Fabric C (6120-43 Tossed Dog Toys - Multi), cut:

- (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3 ½" x 45 ½" strips.
- (2) 3" x 30 ½" WOF strips.

Fabric D (6116-43 10in x 10in Dog Blocks – Multi):

• Fussy cut (10) 8 ¹/₂" x 10 ¹/₂" rectangles, each entered on a block.

Fabric E (Coffee Bean-50 Peppered Cottons – Coffee Bean), cut:

- (5) 2 ¹/₂" x WOF strips, sub-cut (20) 2 ¹/₂" x 10 ¹/₂" strips.
- (7) 2 ¹/₂" x WOF strips, sub-cut (20) 2 ¹/₂" x 11 ¹/₂" strips.
- (8) 2 ¹/₂" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric F (6117-73 Tossed Dog Faces – Multi), cut:

- (1) 9 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 9 ½" x 10 ½" strips.
- (2) 11 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (4) 11 ½" x 12 ½" strips and (2) 10 ½" squares.

Fabric G (6123-43 Dogs Outline – Tan), cut:

- (2) 5 ½" x 79 ½" LOF strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) $5 \frac{1}{2}$ x $65 \frac{1}{2}$ strips, piece as needed.

Backing (6121-48 Diagonal Plaid – Multi), cut:

• (2) 97" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 73" x 97" to make the back.

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Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 43 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of the 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 43 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 2" x 25 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 24 \frac{1}{2}" x 45 \frac{1}{2}".**

2. Sew (1) 2" x 10 ½" Fabric E strip to each side of (1)
8 ½" x 10 ½" Fabric D rectangle. Sew (1) 2" x 11 ½"
Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the
Fabric D rectangle to make (1) Block One rectangle
(Fig. 2). Trim the block to measure 10 ½" x 12 ½".
Repeat to make (10) Block One rectangles total.



Sew together (1) 9 ½" x 10 ½" Fabric F rectangle, (1) Block One rectangle, (1) 10 ½" Fabric F square, (1) Block One rectangle and (1) 9 ½" x 10 ½" Fabric F rectangle, in that order from top to bottom, to make (1) Side Border (Fig. 3). Repeat to make a second Side Border.

4. Sew together (3) Block One rectangles and (2) 11 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric F rectangles, alternating them from left to right, to make the Top Border (Fig. 4). Repeat to make the Bottom Border.



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Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

5. Sew (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ x $45\frac{1}{2}$ Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 3 x $30\frac{1}{2}$ Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

6. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 50 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 32 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

7. Sew (1) Side Border to each side of the Center Block. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

8. Sew (1) $2^n \times 76 \frac{1}{2}^n$ Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $2^n \times 55 \frac{1}{2}^n$ Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

9. Sew (1) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 79 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 65 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

Layering, Quilting and Finishing

10. Press the quilt top and 73" x 97" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

11. Cut the ends of the (8) Fabric E binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

12. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
