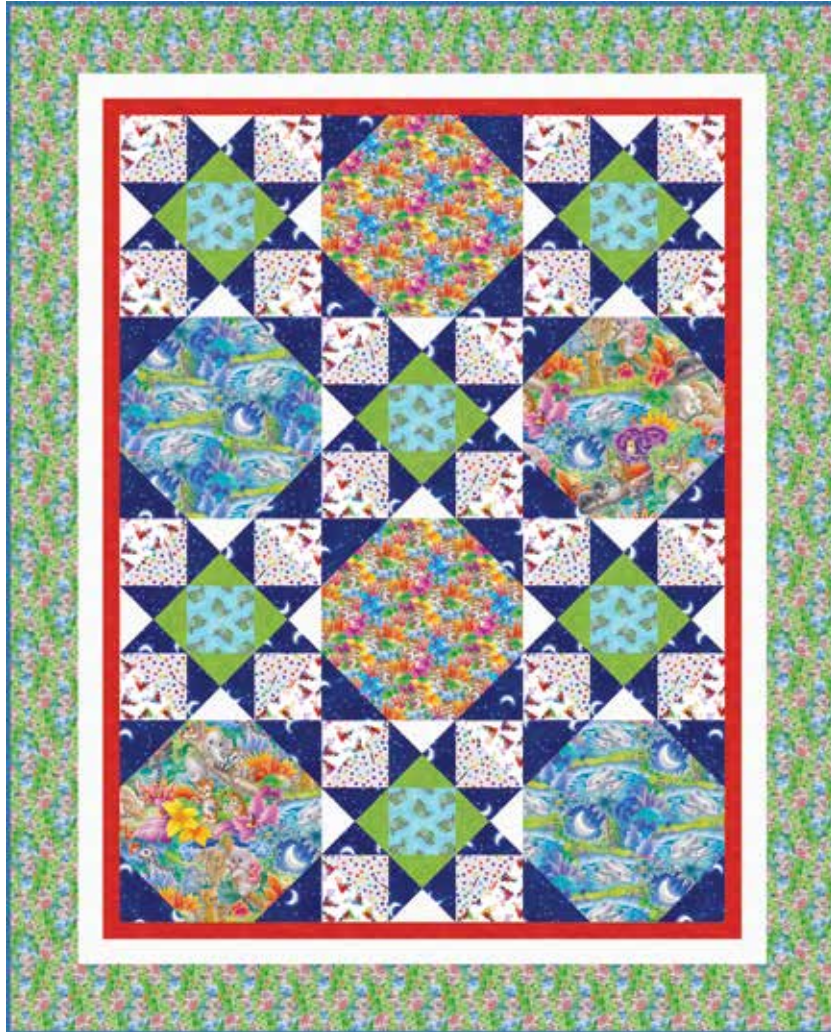

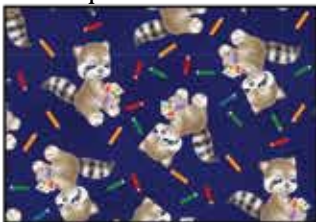

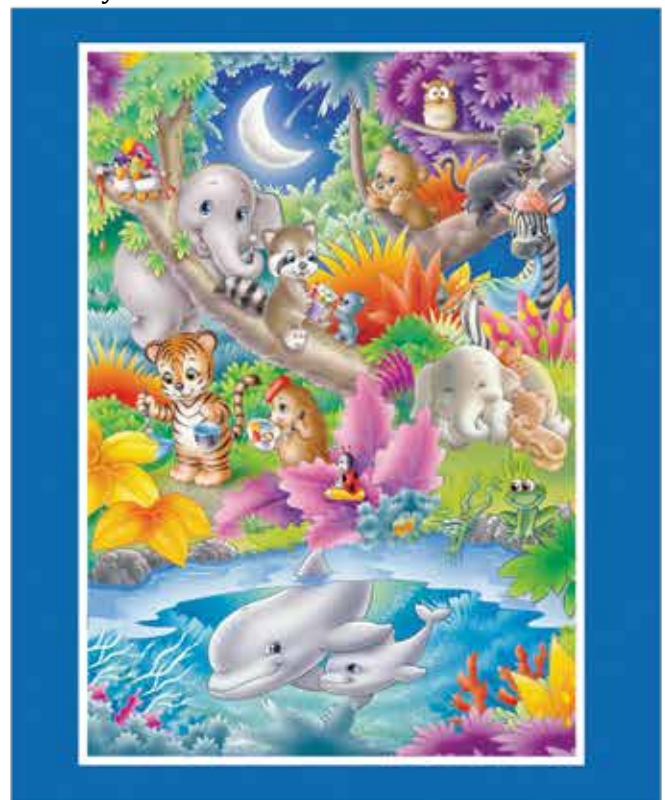

Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (6817-16 Tiger Painting a Flower – Multi), cut:

- (1) 12 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 12 ½" squares.

Fabric B (6812-78 Tossed Moon – Navy), cut:

- (2) 5 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 5 ¼" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (48) 5 ¼" triangles.
- (3) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 4 ½" squares.

Fabric C (6816-17 Swimming Dolphin – Cyan), cut:

- (1) 12 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 12 ½" squares.

Fabric D (6819-16 Collage – Multi), cut:

- (1) 12 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 12 ½" square.

Fabric E (6815-11 Tossed Frog – Aqua), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (6) 4 ½" squares.

Fabric F (1351-Grass Just Color! – Grass), cut:

- (1) 5 ¼" x WOF strip, sub-cut (6) 5 ¼" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (24) 5 ¼" triangles.

Fabric G (6821-35 Elephant Foot Prints – Gray), cut:

- (2) 4 ⅞" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 4 ⅞" squares.

Fabric H (6814-01 Tossed Ladybug on Pencil – White), cut:

- (2) 4 ⅞" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 4 ⅞" squares.

Fabric I (1351-Pigment White Just Color! – Pigment White), Cut:

- (1) 5 ¼" x WOF strip, sub-cut (6) 5 ¼" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (24) 5 ¼" triangles.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 50 ½" strips.
- (2) 2" x 41 ½" WOF strips.

Fabric J (1351-Red Just Color! – Red), cut:

- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 48 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 38 ½" WOF strips.

Fabric K (6813-66 Koala Climbing Tree – Sage), cut:

- (2) 4 ½" x 53 ½" LOF strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 4 ½" x 49 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.

Fabric L (1351-Denim Just Color! – Denim), cut:

- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Backing (6818-35 Tossed Elephant – Gray), cut:

- (2) 57" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 57" x 69" to make the back.

Sewing

Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Place (1) $4\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric G square on top of (1) $4\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric H square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 1). Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 1). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (2) Unit 1 squares (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (24) Unit 1 squares total.

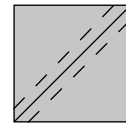

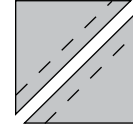

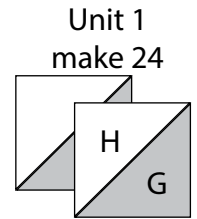

2. Refer to Figure 4 and sew together (2) $5\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric B triangles, (1) $5\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric I triangle and (1) $5\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric F triangle to make (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 2 square. Repeat to make (24) Unit 2 squares total.

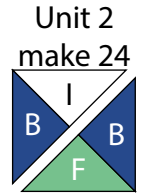

3. Sew (1) Unit 1 square to each side of (1) Unit 2 square to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to each side of (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Block One square (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.

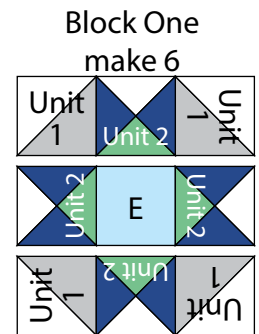

4. Place (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B square on the top left corner of (1) $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square, right sides together (Fig. 6). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 6). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam (Fig. 7).

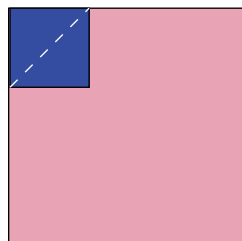

5. Follow Figure 8 for the seam direction to add a 4 ½” Fabric B square to each of the remaining corners of the 12 ½” Fabric A square to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 9).

6. Repeat Steps 4-5 to make (2) Block Two squares total.



7. Repeat Steps 4-5 and refer to Figures 10-11 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (2) Block Three squares and (2) Block Four squares.

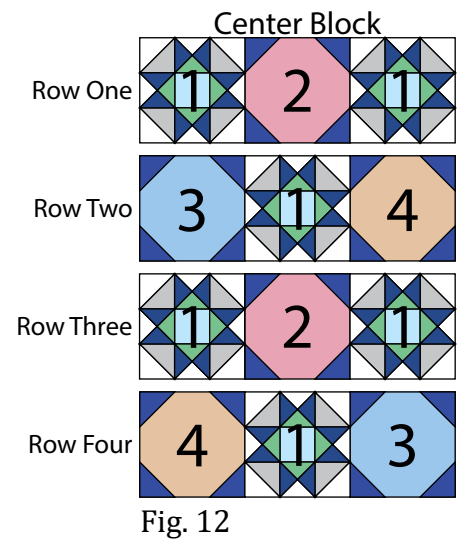


8. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Two square to make Row One (Fig. 12). Repeat to make Row Three.

9. Sew together (1) Block Three square, (1) Block One square and (1) Block Four square, in that order from left to right, to make Row Two (Fig. 12).

10. Sew together (1) Block Four square, (1) Block One square and (1) Block Three square, in that order from left to right, to make Row Four (Fig. 12).

11. Sew together the (4) rows from Steps 8-10, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the 36 ½” x 48 ½” Center Block (Fig. 12).



Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

12. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 48 ½" Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 38 ½" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

13. Sew (1) 2" x 50 ½" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 41 ½" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

14. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 53 ½" Fabric K strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 49 ½" Fabric K strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

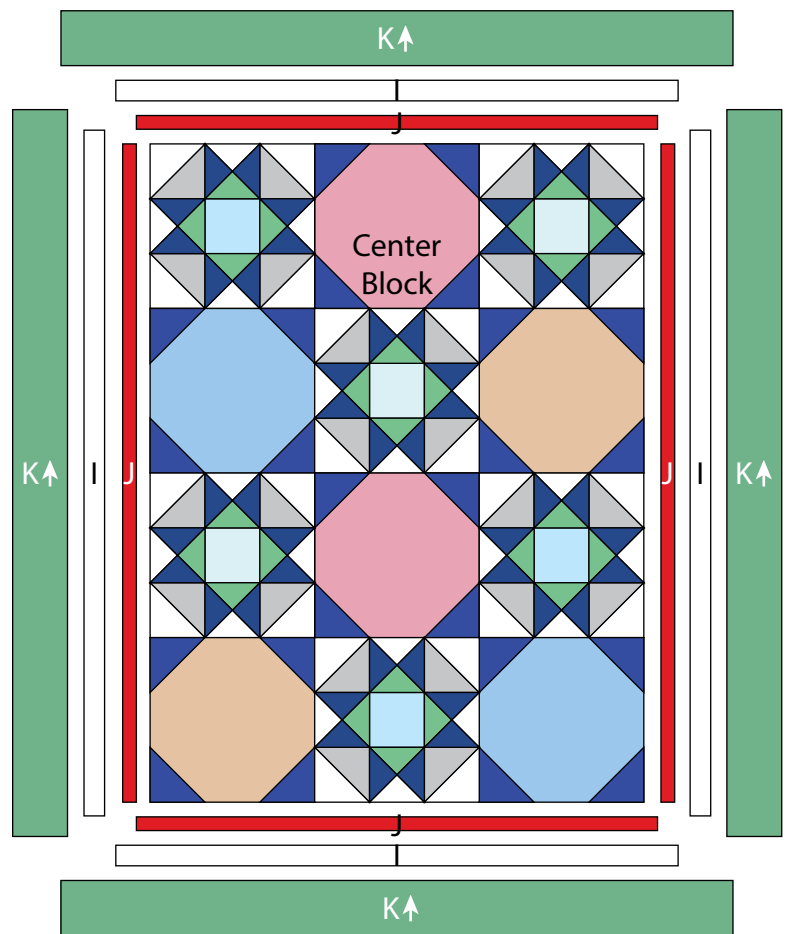
Layering, Quilting and Finishing

15. Press the quilt top and 57" x 69" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

16. Cut the ends of the (6) Fabric L binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

17. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
