## **Quilt Cutting**

#### **Quilt Cutting Instructions**

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

#### Fabric A (6651P-78 Panel 24 in x 44 in – Multi):

• Fussy cut (1) 22 ½" x 40 ½" rectangle, centered on the panel.

#### Fabric B (6643-97 Stars & Streamers – Multi), cut:

- (2) 3" x 25 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 2" x 40 ½" WOF strips.
- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### Fabric C (6648-87 Tossed Gifts & Balloons - Multi), cut:

• (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4 ½" squares.

#### Fabric D (6646-70 Tossed Confetti - White), cut:

- (34) Template 1 triangles.
- (34) Template 3 triangles.

#### Fabric E (6644-78 Tossed Cakes - Multi), cut:

• (6) Template 2 triangles.

#### Fabric F (6645-97 Tossed Birthday Candles - Multi), cut:

• (6) Template 2 triangles.

#### Fabric G (1351-Sunshine Just Color! - Sunshine), cut:

• (6) Template 2 triangles.

#### Fabric H (6646-87 Tossed Confetti - Multi), cut:

• (6) Template 2 triangles.

#### Fabric I (6647-98 Tossed Party Hats - Multi), cut:

• (6) Template 2 triangles.

#### Fabric J (1351-Lime Just Color! - Lime), cut:

• (4) Template 2 triangles.

#### Fabric K (6643-70 Stars & Streamers - White), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 52 1/2" strips.
- (2)  $2'' \times 35 \frac{1}{2}'' \times WOF$  strips.

#### Fabric L (6649-97 Border Stripe - Multi), cut:

- (2)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x 71" (length of fabric) LOF strips.
- (2)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x 51" LOF strips.

#### Backing (6642-78 Packed Balloons - Multi), cut:

• (2) 75" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 55" x 75" to make the back.


## **Quilt Sewing**

Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

#### **Quilt Block Assembly**

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 40 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the 22 ½" x 40 ½" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 3" x 25 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure** 24 ½" x 44 ½".



- 2. Place (1) Fabric D Template 1 triangle on top of (1) Fabric J Template 2 triangle, right sides together, aligning the left sides (Fig. 2). Sew the (2) triangles together along the left side. Press the smaller triangle open.
- 3. Place (1) Fabric D Template 3 triangle on top of the Fabric J Template 2 triangle, right sides together, aligning the right sides (Fig. 3). Sew the (2) triangles together along the right side. Press the smaller triangle open to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 4). Trim the block to measure  $4\frac{1}{2}$  square.
- 4. Repeat to make (4) Unit 1 squares total.





4. Repeat Steps 2-3 and refer to Figures 5-9 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (6) of each unit square for Unit 2 through Unit 6.





- 5. Refer to Figure 10 and sew together (11) assorted Unit squares to make the Left Side Border.
- 6. Refer to Figure 11 and sew together (11) assorted Unit squares to make the Right Side Border.



- 7. Sew together (6) assorted Unit squares. Sew (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Top Border (Fig. 12).
- 8. Sew together (6) assorted Unit squares. Sew (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Bottom Border (Fig. 13).





#### **Ouilt Top Assembly**

#### (Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

- 9. Sew the Left Side Border and Right Side Border to the left and to the right sides of the Center Block.
- 10. Sew the Top Border and the Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 11. Sew (1)  $2" \times 52 \frac{1}{2}"$  Fabric K strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1)  $2" \times 35 \frac{1}{2}"$  Fabric K strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 12. Center (1)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x 71" Fabric L strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the top edge of the block and stop a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

- 13. Repeat Step 12 to sew (1)  $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 51" Fabric L strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 14).
- 14. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 14), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.



#### **Quilt Layering, Quilting and Finishing**

15. Press the quilt top and 55" x 75" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

#### **Quilt Binding**

- 16. Cut the ends of the (6) Fabric B binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.
- 17. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.



## **Place Mat Cutting**

#### **Place Mat Cutting Instructions**

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

#### Fabric A (6650-98 9.5 in x 9.5 in Blocks - Multi):

• Fussy cut (8) 9 ½" squares, each centered on a block.

#### Fabric B (1351-Sunshine Just Color! - Sunshine), cut:

- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 1 ½" x 9 ½" strips.
- (6) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 1 ½" x 11 ½" strips.

#### Fabric C (6642-78 Packed Balloons - Multi), cut:

• (2) 10 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 10 ½" x 3 ½" strips.

#### Fabric D (6646-87 Tossed Confetti - Multi), cut:

- (8) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 1 ½" x 16 ½" strips.
- (13) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### Backing (6648-87 Tossed Gifts & Balloons - Multi, cut:

• (4) 16" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 16" x 20" rectangles for the backs.


## **Place Mat Sewing**

Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

#### **Place Mat Assembly**

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

18. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 9 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 9 ½" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 11 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 7 square. **Trim the unit to measure 10** ½" x **10** ½". Repeat to make (8) Unit 7 squares total.



19. Sew (1)  $3 \frac{1}{2}$ " x  $10 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 7 square. Sew (1)  $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x  $16 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 7 square to make (1) Place Mat top (Fig. 17). Repeat to make (8) Place Mat tops total.



#### Place Mat Layering, Quilting and Finishing

20. Press the place mat tops and (8) 16" x 20" backings well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed place mat tops (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.


#### **Place Mat Binding**

- 21. Cut the ends of the (13) Fabric D binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together. Cut the strip into (8) equal lengths.
- 22. Sew the binding to the front of each place mat, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.

#### 100% Templates
