

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# Cutting

## **Cutting Instructions**

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

#### Fabric A (5388-81 24" Block Repeat - Multi):

• Fussy cut (6) 10 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" squares, each centered on a block.

#### Fabric B (1351-Orange Just Color! - Orange), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 51 ½" strips.
- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 43 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 2" x 10 ½" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 2" x 13 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" strips.
- (6)  $2 \frac{1}{2}$  x WOF strips for the binding.

#### Fabric C (5389-11 Cloud, Sun, Rainbow Allover – Blue), cut:

• (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 6 ½" squares.

#### Fabric D (5390-8 Chubby Butterfly Allover - Multi/White), cut:

• (4) 3 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 3 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 6 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" strips.

#### Fabric E (5395-11 Clouds and Bees Allover – Blue), cut:

• (4) 3 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 3 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" squares.

#### Fabric F (5391-8 Overlapping Rainbows – Multi/White), cut:

• (2) 3 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 3 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" squares.

#### Fabric G (5394-44 Trees and Critters Allover – Yellow), cut:

• (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 6 ½" squares.

#### Fabric H (5392-88 Playground Scenic - Red), cut:

• (1) 6 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 6 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" squares and (4) 5 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" squares.

#### Fabric I (1351-Pigment White Just Color! - Pigment White), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 48 1/2" strips.
- (2) 2" x 39 ½" WOF strips.

#### Fabric J (5393-8 Words and Motifs – Multi/White), cut:

- (2) 5 ½" x 55 ½" LOF strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 5 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 43 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" WOF strips, piece as needed.

#### Backing (5392-88 Playground Scenic - Red), cut:

• (2) 73" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 61" x 73" to make the back.

# Sewing

Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

# **Block Assembly**


# Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 10 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 10 ½" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2" x 13 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 12 ½" x 12 ½".** Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.

2. Place (1) 3 ½" Fabric E square on the left side of (1) 3 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 3). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance.


3. Place another 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square on the right side of the 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 5).


4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (24) Unit 1 strips total.



5. Sew (1)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F square to each side of (1) Unit 1 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of (1)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C square to make the middle row. Sew the rows together to make (1)  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Block Two square. Repeat to make a second Block Two square.

6. Repeat Step 5 and refer to Figures 7-8 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (2) Block Three squares and (2) Block Four squares.





Unit 1

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#### (Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

7. Sew (1) Block One square to each side (1) Block Two square to make Row One.

8. Sew (1) Block Three square to each side of (1) Block One square to make Row Two.

9. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Two square to make Row Three.

10. Sew (1) Block Four square to each side of (1) Block One square to make Row Four.

11. Sew the (4) Rows together, in numerical order, to make the Center Block.

12. Sew (1) 2" x 48 ½" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 39 ½" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

13. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 51 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 43 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

14. Sew (1) 5  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 55  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H square to each end of (1) 5  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 43  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to make the Top Border. Repeat to make the Bottom Border. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.


### Layering, Quilting and Finishing

15. Press the quilt top and 61" x 73" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

# Binding

16. Cut the ends of the (6) Fabric B binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

17. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
