Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.
WOF = Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

## READ INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE CUTTING

## Quilt \#1

Fabric A (7540-17 Cloudy Days - Sky Blue), cut:

- (1) 9" x 25 " strip

Fabric B (Jungle-29 Peppered Cottons - Jungle):

- Cut (3) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips for the binding.
- Fussy Cut (1) 7" x 25 " strip on the mountains. Fussy cut the mountain tops.

Fabric C (7546-63 Tree and Landscape Border Autumn), cut:

- (1) 9 " $\times 25$ " strip and fussy cut along the blue tree line.
- (1) 13 " x $25^{\prime \prime}$ strip and fussy cut along the gold tree line.

Fabric D (7545-63 Marchland - Olive Autumn), cut: - (1) 10 " x 25 " strip

Backing (7538-66 Lake Forest Texture - Green), cut: - (1) 32 " x 40 " strip

## Quilt \#2

Fabric A (7539-17 Sea and Sky - Sea Blue), cut: - (1) 5 " x 15 " strip

Fabric B (7542-17 Sun-Washed Textures - Sky Blue), cut:

- (1) 9 " $\times 15$ " strip


## Fabric C (Storm Cloud-87 Peppered Cottons Storm Cloud), cut:

- (1) 6" x 7" to cut the Left Rock as desired.
- (1) 4 " x 7 " to cut the Upper Right Rock as desired.
- (1) 4 " x 5 " to cut the Lower Right Rock as desired.
- (1) $3^{\prime \prime} \times 6^{\prime \prime}$ to cut the Middle Rock as desired.

Fabric D (Carbon-23 Peppered Cottons - Carbon), cut:

- (1) 4 " x 9 " to cut one Tree as desired.
- (1) 4 " x 10 " to cut the Upper Right Rock as desired.
- (1) 5 " x 7 " to cut the Lower Right Rock as desired.

Fabric E (7546-63 Tree and Landscape Border Autumn), cut:

- (1) 5 " x 15 " fussy cut the sky and tree tops as desired.
- (1) 5 " $\times 10$ " to cut the trees for the upper right corner as desired.

Fabric F (7544-63 Tree and Brush Texture Green), cut:

- Fussy cut (1) 5" x 12" strip of the lower left grass.

Fabric G (7543-77 Watercolor Plaid - Blue), cut:

- Cut (1) $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares.
- Cut (2) $31 / 2 "$ x WOF strips. Sub-cut (2) $31 / 2 "$ x $141 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips and (2) $31 / 2$ " x $2011 / 2 "$ strips.

Fabric H (7544-77 Tree and Brush Texture - Blue), cut:

- Cut (3) $21 / 2$ " x WOF strips for the binding.

Backing (7538-75 Lake Forest Texture - Blue), cut:

- (1) 28 " x 28 " square


## READ INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE CUTTING

## Quilt \#3

Fabric A (7546-63 Tree and Landscape Border Autumn), cut:

- (1) $6^{\prime \prime} \times 25^{\prime \prime}$ strip for Dark Blue Top Strip.
- (1) 6 " x 25 " strip for the Olive Green Second strip. Cut the top edge as desired.
- (1) 6 " x 25 " strip for the Dark Blue Second strip. Cut the top edge as desired.
- (1) 9 " $\times 25$ " strip for the 4th strip. Cut the trees as desired.
- Fussy cut (3) trees for the left side and (2) trees for the right side.

Fabric B (7542-17 Sun-washed Texture - Sky Blue), cut:

- (1) $17^{\prime \prime} \times 25$ " strip.

Fabric C (7541-77 Pebbles - Slate/Blue), cut:

- (1) 5 " $\times 15^{\prime \prime}$ strip to fussy cut the left side as desired.
- (1) 3 " $\times 6$ " strip to fussy cut the right side as desired.

Fabric D (Jungle-29 Peppered Cottons - Jungle), cut:

- (1) 6 " $\times 10^{\prime \prime}$ strip to fussy cut one left branch as desired.
- (1) 6 " $\times 10^{\prime \prime}$ strip to fussy cut one right branch as desired.
- (3) 2 " x 5 " strip to fussy cut three pond islands as desired.
- Cut (3) $21 / 2 " x$ WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric E (7545-77 Marshland - Blue Summer) cut:

- (1) $3^{\prime \prime} \times 4$ " strip to fussy cut the flowers as desired.
- (1) 4 " x 4 " strip to fussy cut the flowers as desired.
- (1) 3 " x 3 " strip to fussy cut the flowers as desired

Fabric F (7544-77 Tree and Brush Texture - Blue), cut:

- (1) 9 " $\times 10$ " strip to cut the left side as desired.
- (1) 6 " $\times 9$ " strip to cut the right side as desired.


## Backing (7543-35 Watercolor Plaid - Sunset

 Orange), cut:- (1) 32 " x 38 " strip


## Quilt \#4

Fabric A (7542-17 Sun Washed Textured - Sky Blue), cut:

- (1) $13^{\prime \prime} \times 25^{\prime \prime}$ strip.

Fabric B (7545-77 Marshland - Blue Summer), cut:

- (1) 7 " $\times 25^{\prime \prime}$ Bottom strip.
- (1) 8 " $\times 18^{\prime \prime}$ strip to fussy cut the flowers as desired.

Fabric C (7539-17 Sea and Sky - Sea Blue), cut:

- (1) 12 " x $25^{\prime \prime}$ strip fussy cut the top edge as desired.
- (1) 10 " x 25 " strip fussy cut the top edge as desired.

Fabric D (7544-77 Tree and Brush Texture - Blue), cut:

- (1) 6 " $\times 25$ " strip fussy cut the top edge as desired.

Fabric E (Jungle-29 Peppered Cut - Jungle) cut:

- (1) 8 " x 25 " strip to fussy cut the Mountains as desired.
- (4) $21 / 2$ " x WOF strip for the binding.

Fabric F (7546-63 Tree and Landscape Border Autumn), cut:

- (1) 4 " $\times 20$ " strip to cut the ground as desired.
- (1) 10 " $\times 23$ " strip to fussy cut the trees as desired.

Fabric G (Walnut-33 Peppered Cottons - Walnut), cut:

- (1) $26 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 321 / 2 "$ strip

Backing (7539-75 Sea and Sky - Blue Sunset), cut: - (1) 34 " $\times 40$ " strip

Sew using a $1 \nmid 4$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Landscape Quilts are a form of Art Quilt made to represent a real or imagined landscape. As with any type of artists representation, there are many methods to use when creating a landscape quilt. Every quilt is different and this type of quilt gives the quilter freedom to cut and arrange the pieces as desired. These instructions are just a guide to get you started.

## Prepping the Pieces

1. The pieces can be prepped with fusible web before fussy cutting or they can be cut and stitched in place without fusible web. It is recommended that beginners use fusible web to hold the pieces together. Follow the manufacturer's instructions to press fusible web on the back of each fabric before fussy cutting the shape.

## General Assembly Instructions

2. Lay out the pieces of fabric and plan the pieces for the quilt top. In this pattern we have given four examples as guides to get you started. Add fusible web if desired. It is recommended to cut each layer as the quilt is built to make sure the pieces fit as desired.
3. Pick one of the examples in this pattern or create your own. Cut the pieces as needed. Start with the bottom layer of fabric and build the landscape quilt up to the top layer. Note: The fabrics can hang off the edge as the quilt top is built.
4. Once the landscape quilt is assembled as desired, trim and square up the quilt top to the desired size.
5. Layer the quilt top, batting and backing. Quilt the landscape quilt as desires. You will need to quilt over every piece to keep the pieces attached to the background.
6. Trim the backing and batting even with the quilt top edge and bind as desired.

## Quilt \#1 Assembly

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations and assembly order when assembling the various components.
7. Cut the pieces as listed in the Cutting section on Page 3.
8. Refer to Figures 1-4 for fabric placement.

9. Trim the quilt top to measure $24 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 321 / 2$ ".
10. Refer to the General Instructions to complete the quilt top.

Quilt \#2 Assembly

12. Cut the pieces as listed in the Cutting section on Page 3.
12. Refer to Figures 5-14 for fabric placement.

13. Trim the Unit 13 to measure $14 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 14 \frac{1}{2}$ " square.
14. Place $31 / 2 "$ Fabric G square on the top left corner of the Unit 13 square, right sides together (Fig. 15). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 15). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $1 / 4$ " away from the sewn seam (Fig. 16).
15. Follow Figure 17 for the seam direction to add a $31 / 2 "$ Fabric G square to each of the remaining corners of the Unit 13 square to make (1) Unit 17 square (Fig. 18).

16. Sew (1) $31 / 2$ " $\times 14 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip to each side of the Unit 17 square. Sew (1) $31 / 2$ " $\times 201 / 2 "$ Fabric G strip to the top and bottom of the Unit 17 square to make Quilt Top 2 (Fig. 19).
17. Refer to the General Instructions to complete the quilt top.
