Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (5502-44 Tossed Campers – Yellow), cut:

- (11) Template 1 Arcs.

Fabric B (5502-88 Tossed Campers – Red), cut:

- (10) Template 1 Arcs.

Fabric C (5504-99 Tossed Campsite Icons – Black), cut:

- (11) Template 1 Arcs.

Fabric D (5505-11 Campsite Map – Light Blue), cut:

- (8) Template 1 Arcs.

Fabric E (5506-99 Starry Night – Black), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 74 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 65 ½" strips.
- (10) Template 1 Arcs.

Fabric F (55-0-11 Tone-on-Tone Campers – Light Blue), cut:

- (7) Template 1 Arcs.

Fabric G (5507-88 Tone-on-Tone Campers – Red), cut:

- (10) Template 1 Arcs.

Fabric H (5508-99 Barbecue – Black), cut:

- (9) Template 1 Arcs.

Fabric I (5509-44 Arrow Signs – Yellow), cut:

- (10) Template 1 Arcs.

Fabric J (5509-88 Arrow Signs – Red), cut:

- (10) Template 1 Arcs.

Fabric K (5503-89 Diagonal Stripe – Multi), cut:

- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric L (1351-Grass Just Color! – Grass), cut:

- (15) Template 1 Arcs.

Fabric M (1351-Sunshine Just Color! – Sunshine), cut:

- (9) Template 1 Arcs.

Fabric N (1351-Pigment White Just Color! – Pigment White), cut:

- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 72 ½" strips.
- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 62 ½" strips.
- (120) Template 2 Backgrounds.

Backing (5501-11 Landscape – Light Blue), cut:

- (2) 85" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 73" x 85" to make the back.

Sewing

Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Find and mark the center of the curve on the Fabric L-Template 1 arc piece and the Fabric N-Template 2 background piece. Align the arc and background pieces, right sides together, matching the center mark on each piece. Pin the (2) pieces together at the center mark, then at each end. Continue to pin as needed.
2. Carefully sew the (2) pieces together using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam (Fig. 1). Flip open the sewn unit and press to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 3). The unit should measure $6\frac{1}{2}$ " square.
3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make (15) Unit 1 squares total.

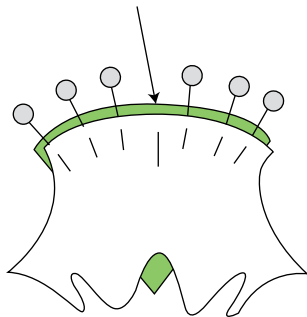

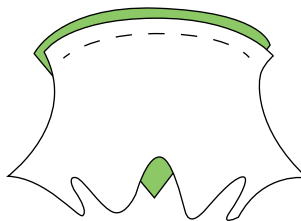

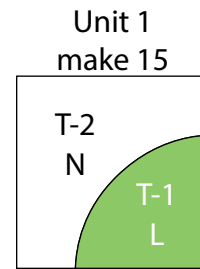

4. Repeat Steps 1-2 and refer to Figures 4-14 for fabric identification, placement and number of each unit to make Unit 10 through Unit 12.

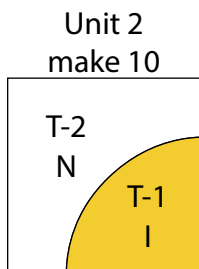

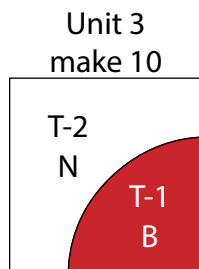

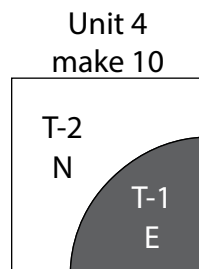

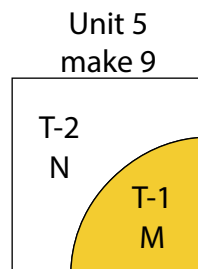

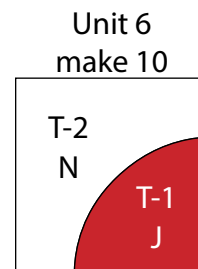

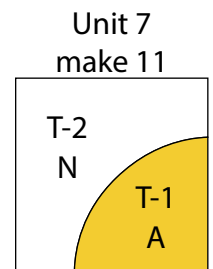

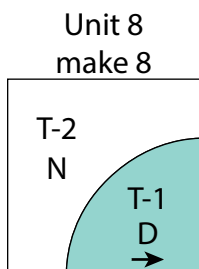

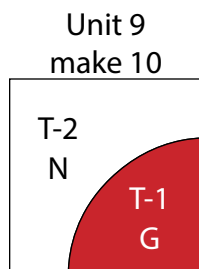

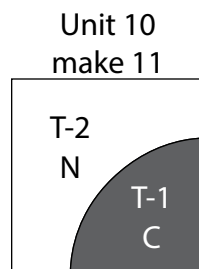

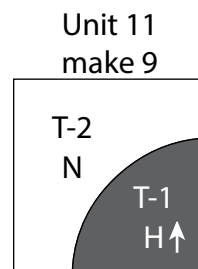

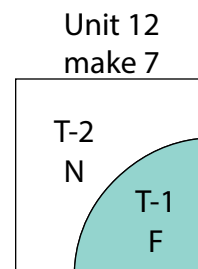

5. Follow Figure 15 and sew together the (120) squares into a 10 x 12 matrix to make the Center Block.

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

6. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 72 ½" Fabric N strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 62 ½" Fabric N strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

7. Sew (1) 2" x 74 ½" Fabric E strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 65 ½" Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

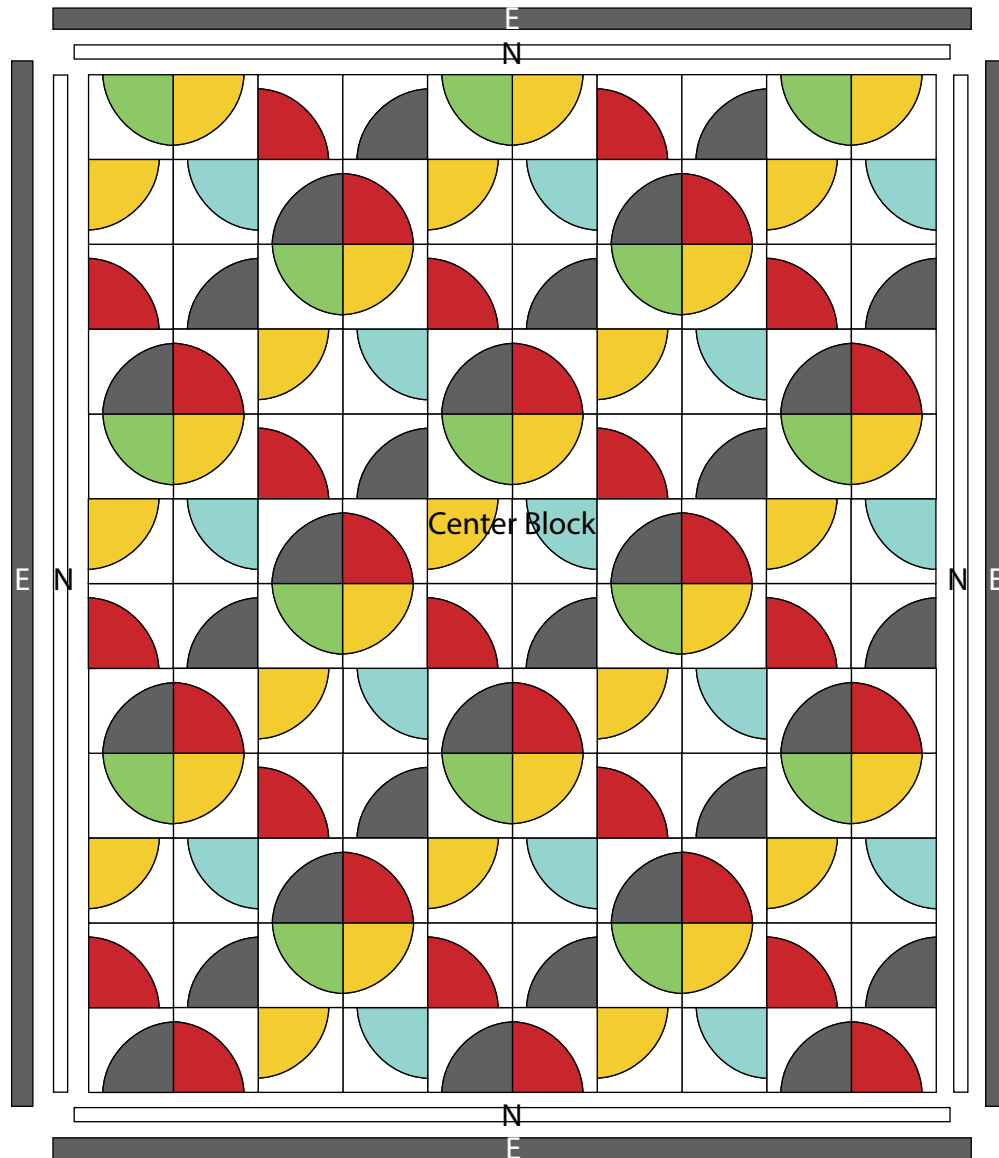
Layering, Quilting and Finishing

8. Press the quilt top and 73" x 85" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

9. Cut the ends of the (8) Fabric K binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

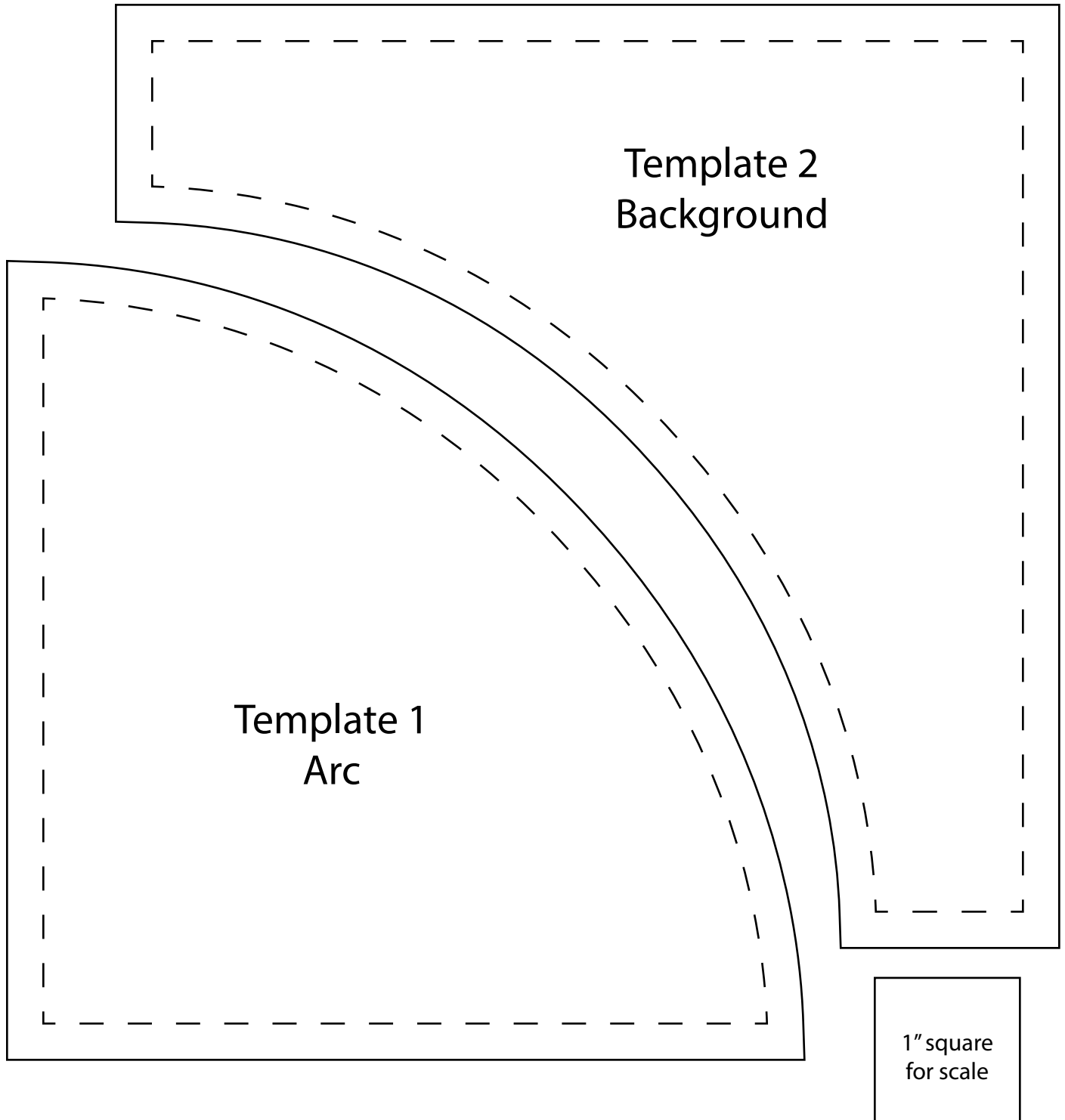
10. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
