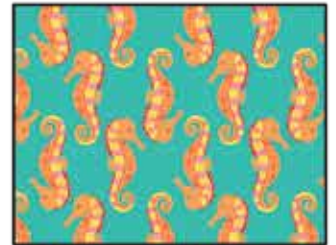

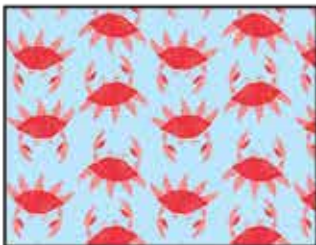

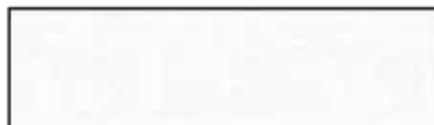

Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (6206-11 Six Block 24 inch repeat – Multi):

- Fussy cut (6) 10 ½" squares, each centered on a block.

Fabric B (1351-Aegean Blue Just Color! – Aegean Blue), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 2" x 10 ½" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 2" x 13 ½" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 2" x 12 ½" strips.
- (6) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 2" x 15 ½" strips.

Fabric C (1351-Pigment White Just Color! – Pigment White), cut:

- (4) 3" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 3" x 5 ½" strips.
- (6) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 2" x 15 ½" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 2" x 12 ½" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 62 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 50 ½" strips.
- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 12 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 10 ½" strips.

Fabric D (6207-44 Tossed Jellyfish – Yellow), cut:

- (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 5 ½" squares.

Fabric E (6210-11 Starfish – Blue), cut:

- (4) 3" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 3" squares.

Fabric F (6216-11 Shells – Royal), cut:

- (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 5 ½" squares.

Fabric G (6209-66 Whales – Green), cut:

- (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 5 ½" squares.

Fabric H (6217-11 Crabs – Blue), cut:

- (2) 3" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 3" squares.

Fabric I (1351-Red Delicious Just Color! Red Delicious), cut:

- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 60 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 47 ½" strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric J (6215-18 Sea Creatures in Bubbles – Multi), cut:

- (4) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 4 ½" x 65 ½" strips.
- (3) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 4 ½" x 58 ½" strips.

Backing (6213-12 San Dollars – Multi), cut:

- (2) 66" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 66" x 81" to make the back.

Sewing

Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2" x 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strips to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). **Trim the unit to measure 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".** Repeat to make (6) Unit 1 squares total.

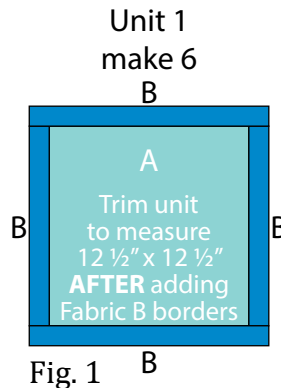

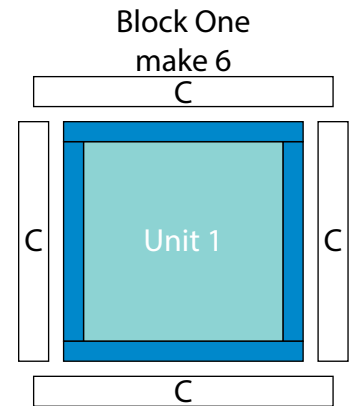

2. Sew (1) 2" x 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square. Sew (1) 2" x 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 square to make (1) 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Block One square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.

3. Place (1) 3" Fabric E square on the left side of (1) 3" x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance (Fig. 4).

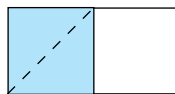

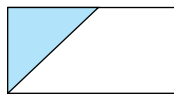

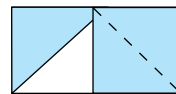

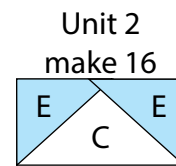

4. Place another 3" Fabric E square on the right side of the 3" x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 5). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 5). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 2 strip (Fig. 6).

5. Repeat Steps 3-4 to make (16) Unit 2 squares total.

6. Repeat Steps 3-4 and refer to Figure 7 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (8) Unit 3 strips.

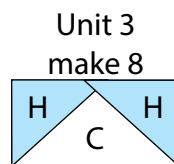

7. Sew (1) 3" Fabric E square to each end of (1) Unit 2 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip to each side of (1) 5 1/2" Fabric D square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 10 1/2" Unit 4 square (Fig. 8). Repeat to make a second Unit 4 square.

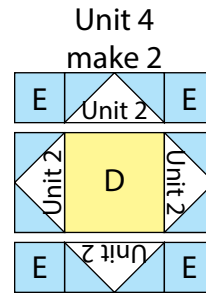

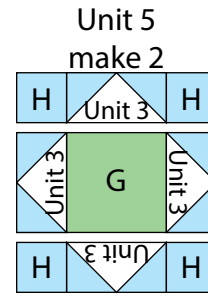

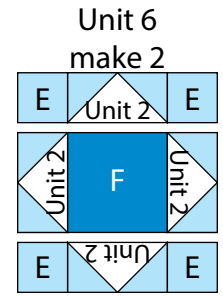

8. Repeat Step 7 and refer to Figures 9-10 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (2) 10 1/2" Unit 5 squares and (2) 10 1/2" Unit 6 squares.

9. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 10 1/2" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 4 square. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 4 square to make (1) Unit 7 square (Fig. 11). Repeat to make a second Unit 7 square.

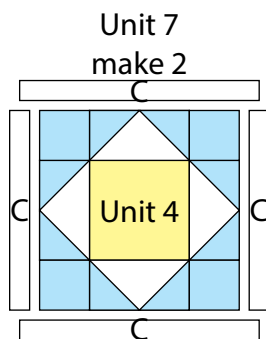

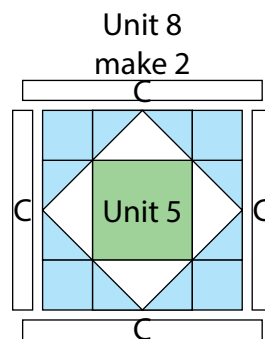

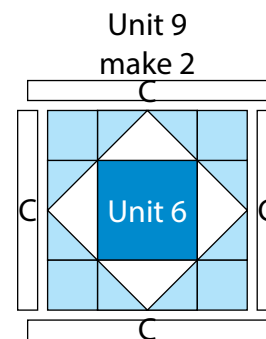

11. Sew (1) 2" x 12 1/2" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) Unit 7 square. Sew (1) 2" x 15 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 7 square to make (1) 15 1/2" Block Two square (Fig. 14). Repeat to make a second Block Two square.

12. Repeat Step 11 and refer to Figures 15-16 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (2) 15 1/2" Block Three squares and (2) 15 1/2" Block Four squares.

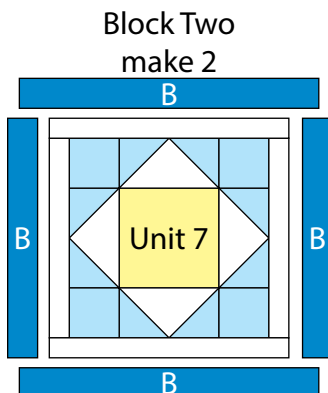

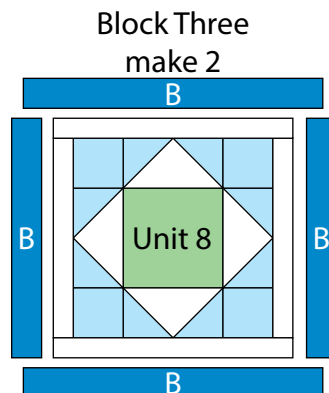

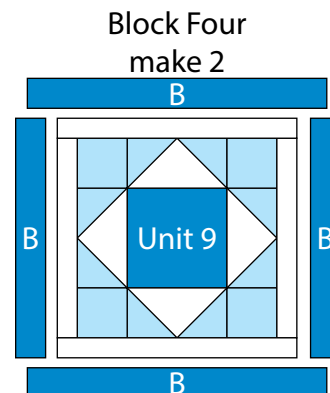

13. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Two square to make Row One (Fig. 17).

14. Sew (1) Block Three square, (1) Block One square and (1) Block Four square together in that order from left to right to make Row Two (Fig. 17).

15. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Four square to make Row Three (Fig. 17).

16. Sew together (1) Block Two square, (1) Block One square and (1) Block Three square, in that order from left to right, to make Row Four (Fig. 17).

17. Sew together the (4) Rows from Steps 13-16, in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the 45 ½" x 60 ½" Center Block (Fig. 17).

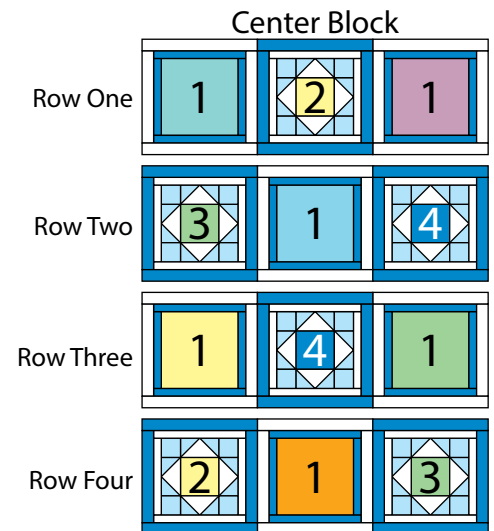

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

18. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 60 ½" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 47 ½" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

19. Sew (1) 2" x 62 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 50 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

20. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 65 ½" Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 58 ½" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

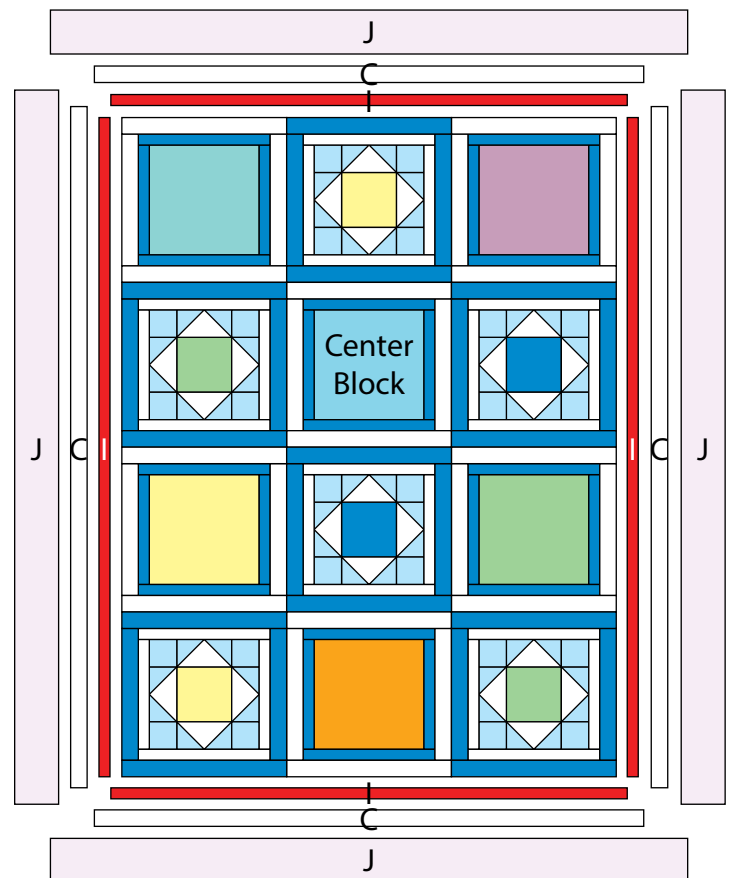
Layering, Quilting and Finishing

21. Press the quilt top and 66" x 81" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

22. Cut the ends of the (7) Fabric I binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

23. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
