

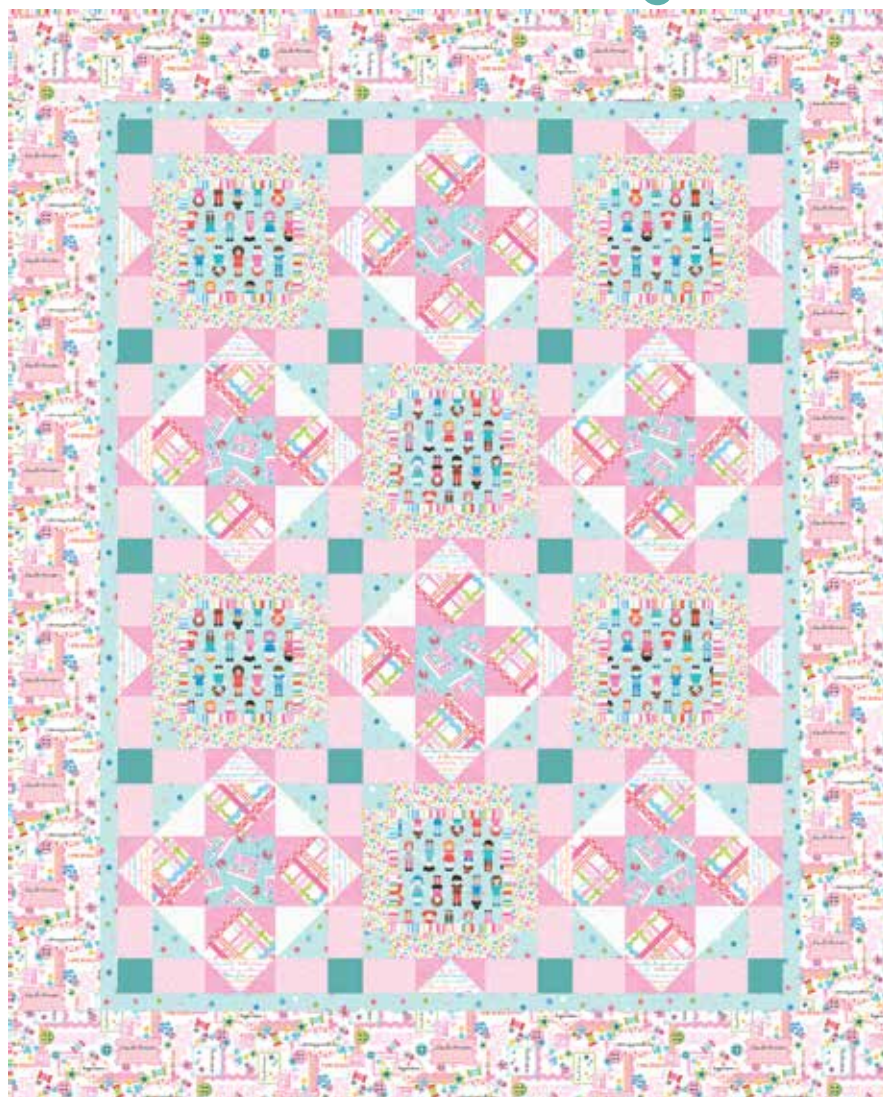

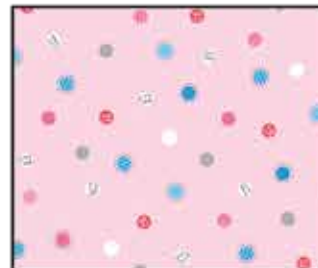

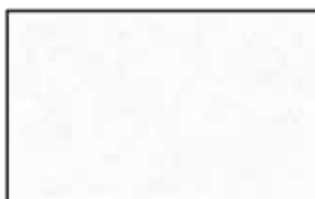

Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (5223-11 World Children – Light Blue), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (6) 6 ½" squares.

Fabric B (5228-21 Stripe – Multi), cut:

- (2) 1" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1" x 6 ½" strips.
- (3) 1" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1" x 7 ½" strips.
- (6) 2 ½" WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric C (5230-21 Ditsy Floral – Multi), cut:

- (5) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 2" x 7 ½" strips.

Fabric D (5231-11 Polka Dots – Light Blue), cut:

- (2) 3 ⅞" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 3 ⅞" squares.
- (2) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 2" squares.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 50 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 40 ½" WOF strips.

Fabric E (5227-11 Sewing Machines – Light Blue), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (6) 4 ½" squares.

Fabric F (1351-Carnation Just Color! – Carnation), cut:

- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (110) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric G (5226-22 Rick-Rack Plaid – Pink), cut:

- (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 3 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

Fabric H (1351-Pigment White Just Color! – Pigment White), cut:

- (2) 3 ⅞" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 3 ⅞" squares.

Fabric I (5229-21 Sentiments – Multi), cut:

- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (31) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

Fabric J (5232-22 Thread Scroll – Pink), cut:

- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (62) 2 ½" x 3 ½" strips.

Fabric K (5224-22 Collage – Pink), cut:

- (2) 5 ½" x 52 ½" LOF strips.
- From the remaining fabric cut (2) 5 ½" x 50 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.

Fabric L (Surf-75 Peppered Cottons – Surf), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (20) 2 ½" squares.

Backing (5225-22 Spools – Pink), cut:

- (2) 58" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 58" x 70" to make the back.

Sewing

Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

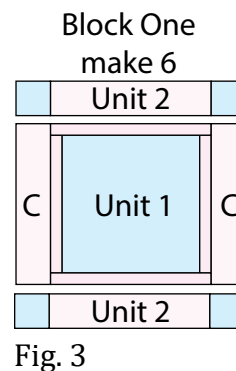
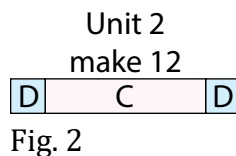
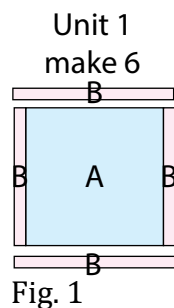
Block Assembly

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components.

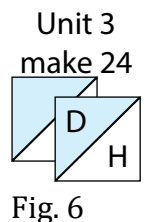
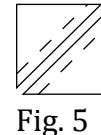
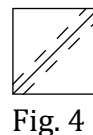
1. Sew (1) $1" \times 6\frac{1}{2}"$ Fabric B strip to each side of (1) $6\frac{1}{2}"$ Fabric A square. Sew (1) $1" \times 7\frac{1}{2}"$ Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (6) Unit 1 squares total.

2. Sew (1) $2"$ Fabric D square to each end of (1) $2" \times 7\frac{1}{2}"$ Fabric C strip to make (1) Unit 2 strip (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (12) Unit 2 strips total.

3. Sew (1) $2" \times 7\frac{1}{2}"$ Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.



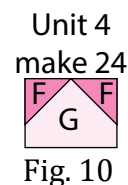
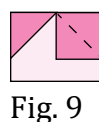
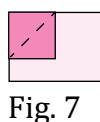
4. Place (1) $3\frac{7}{8}"$ Fabric H square on top of (1) $3\frac{7}{8}"$ Fabric D square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 4). Sew $\frac{1}{4}"$ away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 4). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 5) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure $3\frac{1}{2}"$ square to make (2) Unit 3 squares (Fig. 6). Repeat to make (24) Unit 3 squares total.



5. Place (1) $2\frac{1}{2}"$ Fabric F square on the top left corner of (1) $3\frac{1}{2}" \times 4\frac{1}{2}"$ Fabric G rectangle, right sides together (Fig. 7). Sew across the diagonal of the small square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 7). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 8). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $\frac{1}{4}"$ away from the sewn seam.

6. Follow Figure 9 for the seam direction to add a $2\frac{1}{2}"$ Fabric F square to the upper right corner of the $3\frac{1}{2}" \times 4\frac{1}{2}"$ Fabric G rectangle to make (1) Unit 4 rectangle (Fig. 10).

7. Repeat Steps 5-6 to make (24) Unit 4 rectangles total.



8. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to each side of (1) Unit 4 rectangle to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 4 strip to each side of (1) 4 ½" Fabric E square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 11). Repeat to make (6) Block Two squares total.

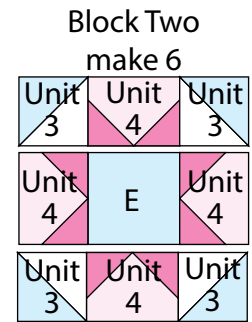

9. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric F square on the left side of (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric I strip, right sides together (Fig. 12). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 12). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 13). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance.

10. Place another 2 ½" Fabric F square on the right side of the 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric I strip, right sides together (Fig. 14). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 14). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 5 strip (Fig. 15).

11. Repeat Steps 9-10 to make (31) Unit 5 strips total.

12. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 3 ½" Fabric J strip to each end of (1) Unit 5 strip to make (1) Unit 6 strip (Fig. 16). Repeat to make (31) Unit 6 strips total.

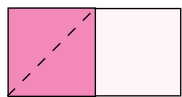

13. Sew (4) 2 ½" Fabric L squares and (3) Unit 6 strips together, alternating them, to make (1) Horizontal Sashing row (Fig. 17). Repeat to make (5) Horizontal Sashing rows total.

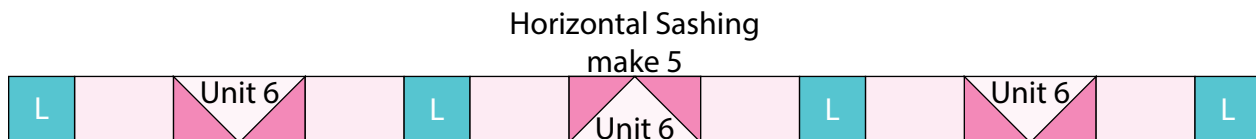

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

14. Sew (1) Unit 6 strip, (1) Block One square, (1) Unit 6 strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) Unit 6 strip, (1) Block One square and (1) Unit 6 strip together lengthwise and in that order left to right to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Three.

15. Sew (1) Unit 6 strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) Unit 6 strip, (1) Block One square, (1) Unit 6 strip, (1) Block Two square and (1) Unit 6 strip together lengthwise and in that order left to right to make Row Two. Repeat to make Row Four.

16. Sew the (5) Horizontal Sashing rows and (4) pieced rows, in numerical order, together and alternating them to make the Center Block.

17. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 50 ½" Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 40 ½" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

18. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 52 ½" Fabric K strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 50 ½" Fabric K strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

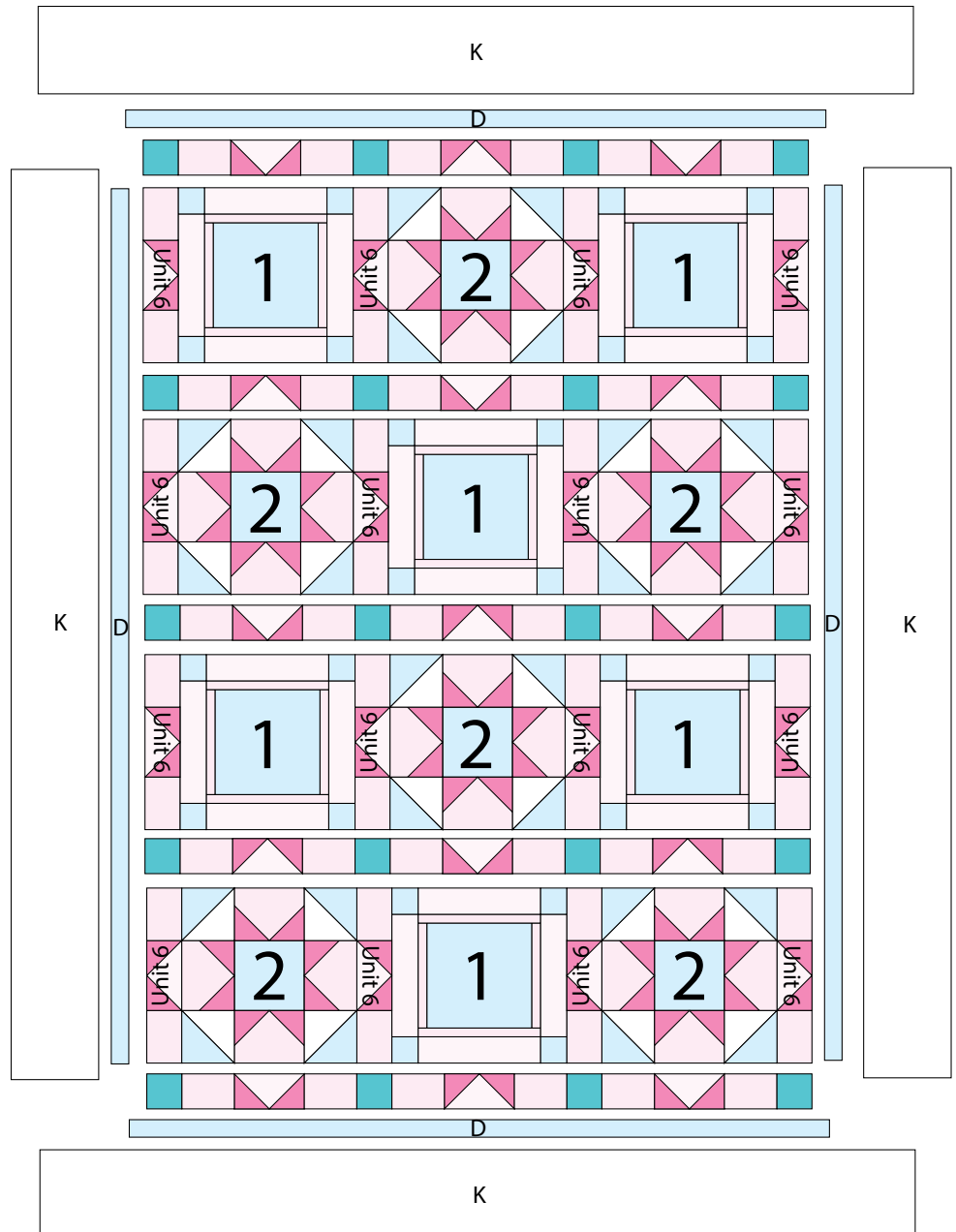
Layering, Quilting and Finishing

19. Press the quilt top and 58" x 70" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

20. Cut the ends of the (6) Fabric B binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

21. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
