## Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.
WOF = Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric
Fabric A (7048P-70 24In x 44In Panel - Multi):

- Fussy cut (1) $221 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 421 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle, centered on the panel.

Fabric B (7044-77 Diagonal Plaid - Blue), cut:

- (2) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 421 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ WOF strips, piece as needed.
- (2) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 26 \frac{1}{2 \prime}$ " WOF strips.
- (4) $13 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $13 / 4{ }^{\prime \prime} \times 671 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips.
- (3) $13 / 4$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $13 / 4$ " x 50 " strips.
- (3) $1 \frac{1}{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$ x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $1 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 531 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips.
- (2) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ x $351 / 2$ " WOF strips.
- (8) $21 / 22^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric C (7047-76 Border Stripe - Multi), cut:

- (2) $6 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 86^{\prime \prime}$ LOF strips, centered on trees.
- (2) $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 66^{\prime \prime}$ LOF strips, centered on trees.
- (2) $33 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 56^{\prime \prime}$ LOF strips, centered on snowmen.
- (2) $33 / 4$ " x $36^{\prime \prime}$ LOF strips, centered on snowmen.

Fabric D (1351-Red Just Color! - Red), cut:

- (4) $11 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $651 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips.
- (3) $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $11 / 2$ " x $471 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips.
- (3) $11 / 4$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $1 \frac{1}{4}$ " x 52 " strips.
-(2) $11 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 331 / 2 "$ WOF strips.
Fabric E (Green Tea-22 Peppered Cottons - Green Tea), cut:
- (6) 3 " x WOF strips, sub-cut (40) 3 " x $51 / 2 "$ strips.

Fabric F (1351-Pigment White Just Color! - Pigment White), cut:

- (6) 3" x WOF strips, sub-cut (80) 3" squares.

Fabric G (7038-09 Tossed Snowman - Gray), cut:

- (1) $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Fabric H (7042-09 Tossed Bunny - White), cut:

- (1) $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) $5 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ squares.

Fabric I (7037-70 Snow Flakes - Blue), cut:

- (1) $51 / 2 " \times$ WOF strip, sub-cut (2) $51 / 2 "$ squares.

Fabric J (7045-03 Tossed Pinecones - Multi), cut:

- (1) $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Fabric K (7043-70 Tossed Snowkid - Multi), cut:

- (1) $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times$ WOF strip, sub-cut (2) $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Fabric L (7040-73 Tossed Squirrel - Multi), cut:

- (1) $5 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strip, sub-cut (2) $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Fabric M (7046-78 Tossed Birds - Multi), cut:

- (1) $5 \underline{1 ⁄ 2 " x}$ WOF strip, sub-cut (2) $51 / 2 "$ squares.

Backing (7043-70 Tossed Snowkid - Multi), cut:

- (2) 90 " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 70 " x 90 " to make the back.

Sew using a 114 " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

## Block Assembly

## Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 421 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B strip to each side of the $221 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 421 / 2 "$ Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) $2 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 26 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). Trim the block to measure $251 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 451 / 2$ ".

2. Place (1) 3" Fabric F square on the left side of (1) 3 " $\times 51 / 2 "$ Fabric E strip, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance (Fig. 3).
3. Place another 3" Fabric F square on the right side of the 3 " $\times 5 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ Fabric E strip, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 5).
4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (40) Unit 1 strips total.

6. Follow Figure 7 and sew together (6) Unit 2 squares, (1) $5 \frac{1}{2 \prime}$ " Fabric K square,
(1) $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J square, (1) $5 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric M square, (1) $5 \frac{1}{2} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric H square and Left Side (1) $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric L square to make the Left Side Border.
7. Repeat Step 6 and refer to Figures 8-10 for component identification, placement and orientation to make the Right Side Border, the Top Border and the Bottom Border.

## Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)
8. Center (1) $33 / 4$ " x 56 " Fabric C strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a $1 / 4$ " from the top edge of the block and stop a $1 / 4$ " from the bottom edge. DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS. Repeat with the opposite side.
9. Repeat Step 8 to sew (1) $33 / 4$ " $\times 36^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start $1 / 4$ " away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 11).
10. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 11), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners.

11. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{4 \prime \prime} \times 52$ " Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{4} 4^{\prime \prime} \times 331 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
12. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 531 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 351 / 2 "$ Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
13. Sew the Left Side Border and Right Side Border to the left and to the right sides of the Center Block.
14. Sew the Top Border and the Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
15. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 651 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 471 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
16. Sew (1) $13 / 4 "$ x $671 / 2 "$ Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $13 / 4$ " x 50 " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
17. Center (1) $61 / 2 " x 86$ " Fabric C strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ from the top edge of the block and stop a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ from the bottom edge. DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS. Repeat with the opposite side.
18. Repeat Step 17 to sew (1) $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 66$ " Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start $1 / 4$ " away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 11).
19. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 11), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.

## Layering, Quilting and Finishing

20. Press the quilt top and $70^{\prime \prime} \times 90^{\prime \prime}$ backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

## Binding

21. Cut the ends of the (8) Fabric B binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.
22. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.

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
