(I) 7242-16 .....	2 yards (1.83 m)

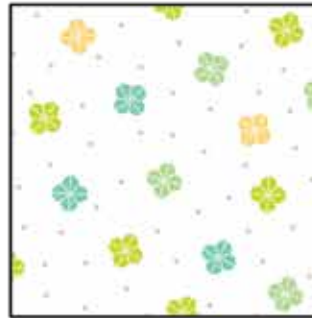

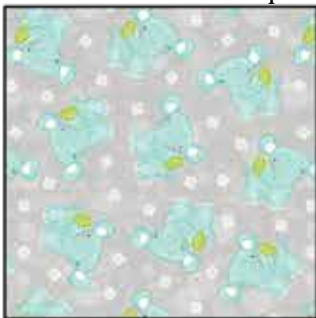

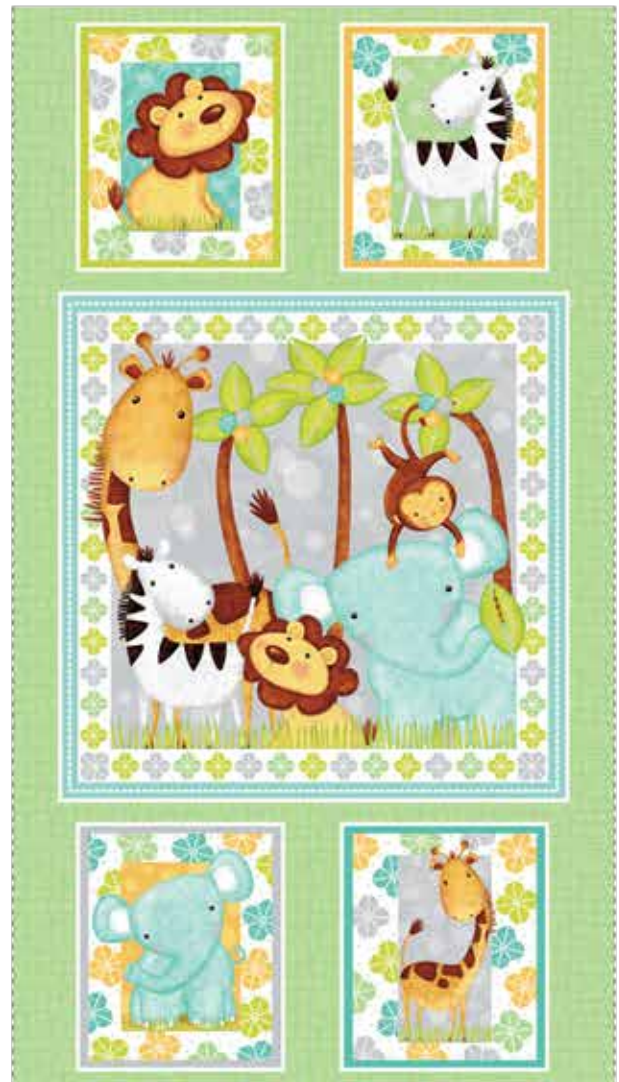

## Cutting

### Cutting Instructions

*Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.*

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

#### **Fabric A (7235-11 24 Inch Block Panel – Aqua):**

- Fussy cut (10) 7 ½" x 8 ⅛" rectangles, each centered on a block.

#### **Fabric B (1351-Teal Just Color! – Teal), cut:**

- (5) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (20) 2" x 8 ½" strips.
- (5) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (20) 1 ½" x 10 ½" strips.
- (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 1 ½" x 8 ½" strips.
- (1) 1" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 1" x 9 ½" strips.
- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### **Fabric C (7238-90 Tossed Elephants – Gray), cut:**

- (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 3 ½" x 9 ½" strips.

#### **Fabric D (7237-14 Animal Patchwork – Multi), cut:**

- (1) 8 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 8 ½" x 7 ½" rectangles.

#### **Fabric E (7241-11 Tossed Monkeys – Aqua), cut:**

- (2) 5" x 36 ½" WOF strips.

#### **Fabric F (7243-66 Tonal Texture – Green), cut:**

- (4) 1 ¼" x 36 ½" WOF strips.

#### **Fabric G (7236-16 Tossed Geometric – Multi), cut:**

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 48 ½" strips.
- (2) 2" x 39 ½" WOF strips.

#### **Fabric H (1351-Daffodil Just Color! – Daffodil), cut:**

- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 51 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 41 ½" WOF strips.

#### **Fabric I (7242-16 Novelty Safari Stripe – Multi), cut:**

- (2) 5 ½" x 67" LOF strips.
- (2) 5 ½" x 55" LOF strips.

#### **Backing (7240-16 Tossed Safari Animals – Multi), cut:**

- (2) 59" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 59" x 71" to make the back.

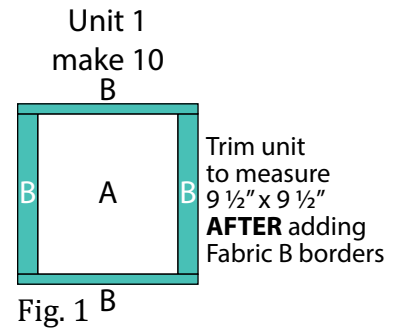
## Sewing

Sew using a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

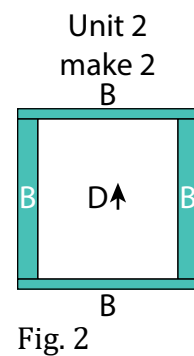
### Block Assembly

**Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.**

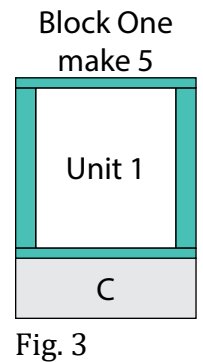
1. Sew (1)  $2'' \times 8\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric B strip to each side of (1)  $7\frac{1}{2}'' \times 8\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1)  $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 10\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). **Trim the unit to measure  $9\frac{1}{2}'' \times 9\frac{1}{2}''$ .** Repeat to make (10) Unit 1 squares total.



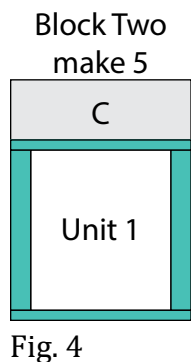
2. Sew (1)  $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 8\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric B strip to each side of (1)  $7\frac{1}{2}'' \times 8\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric D rectangle. Sew (1)  $1'' \times 9\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric D rectangle to make (1)  $9\frac{1}{2}''$  Unit 2 square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make a second Unit 2 square.



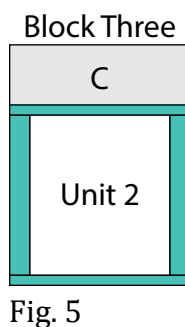
3. Sew (1)  $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 9\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric C strip to the bottom of (1) Unit 1 square lengthwise to make (1)  $9\frac{1}{2}'' \times 12\frac{1}{2}''$  Block One rectangle (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (5) Block One rectangles total.



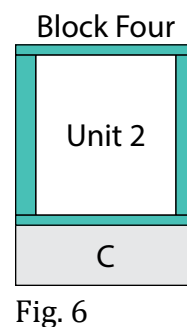
4. Sew (1)  $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 9\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric C strip to the top of (1) Unit 1 square lengthwise to make (1)  $9\frac{1}{2}'' \times 12\frac{1}{2}''$  Block Two rectangle (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (5) Block Two rectangles total.



5. Sew (1)  $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 9\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric C strip to the top of (1) Unit 2 square to make (1)  $9\frac{1}{2}'' \times 12\frac{1}{2}''$  Block Three rectangle (Fig. 5).



6. Sew (1)  $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 9\frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric C strip to the bottom of (1) Unit 2 square to make (1)  $9\frac{1}{2}'' \times 12\frac{1}{2}''$  Block Four rectangle (Fig. 6).



7. Sew (1) 1 ¼" x 36 ½" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) 5" x 36 ½" Fabric E strip lengthwise to make (1) 6 ½" x 36 ½" Block Five strip (Fig. 7). Repeat to make a second Block Five strip.

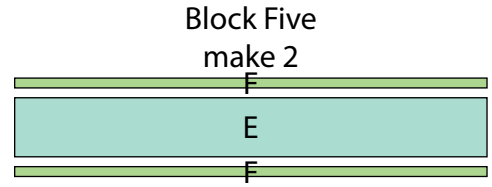

8. Sew together (2) Block One rectangles and (2) Block Two rectangles, lengthwise and alternating them from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 8). Repeat to make Row Three.

9. Sew together (1) Block One rectangle, (1) Block Three rectangle, (1) Block Four rectangle and (1) Block Two rectangle, lengthwise and in that order from left to right, to make Row Two (Fig. 8).

10. Sew together the (3) Rows from Steps 8-9 in numerical order and the (2) Block Five strips, lengthwise and alternating them from top to bottom, to make the 36 ½" x 48 ½" Center Block (Fig. 8).

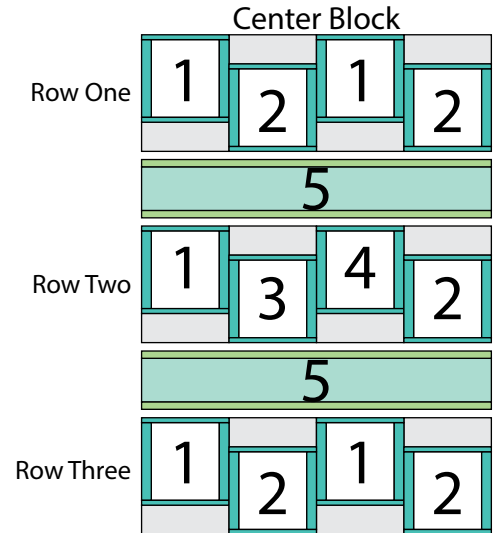

## Quilt Top Assembly

*(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)*

11. Sew (1) 2" x 48 ½" Fabric G strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 39 ½" Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

12. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 51 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 41 ½" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

13. Center (1) 5 ½" x 67" Fabric I" strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ¼" from the top edge of the block and stop a ¼" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

14. Repeat Step 13 to sew (1) 5 ½" x 55" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start ¼" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 9).

15. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 9), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.

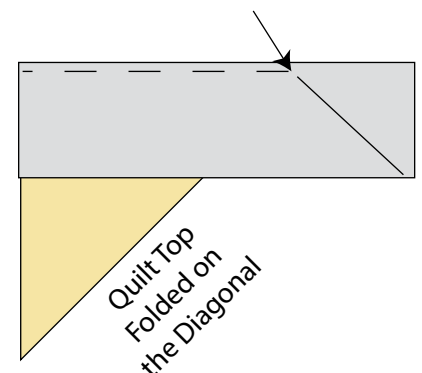

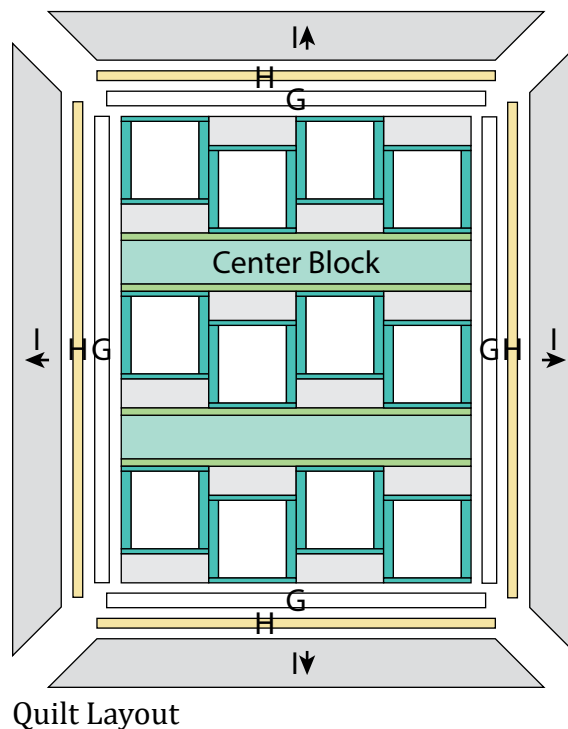
## Layering, Quilting and Finishing

16. Press the quilt top and 59" x 71" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

## Binding

17. Cut the ends of the (6) Fabric B binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

18. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
