



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## **Cutting**

#### **Cutting Instructions**

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

#### Fabric A (6893-77 Toys Allover - Navy), cut:

• (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (5) 4 ½" squares.

#### Fabric B (6894-01 Scenic - White), cut:

• (3) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (20) 4 ½" squares.

#### Fabric C (6891-39 Tossed Allover Bones - Ecru), cut:

• (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (20) 2 ½" squares.

#### Fabric D (1351-Sea Glass Just Color! Sea Glass), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (40) 2 ½" squares.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.
- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 2 ½" x 8 ½" strips.
- (2) 2" x 36 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 2" x 39 ½" WOF strips.

#### Fabric E (6892-88 Beach Ball Dot - Red), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (36) 2 ½" squares.
- (2) 1 ½" x 39 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 41 ½" WOF strips.
- (5) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### Fabric F (6890-77 Argyle - Navy), cut:

• (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 2 ½" squares.

#### Fabric G (6886-35 Packed Puppies - Tan), cut:

• (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4 ½" squares.

#### Fabric H (6889-44 Pup in Pot - Cream), cut:

• (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 2 ½" squares.

#### Fabric I (6888-77 Pups Allover - Navy), cut:

- (2) 4 ½" x 41 ½" LOF strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 4 ½" x 49 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.

#### Backing (6887-11 Puppy in Bathtub - Light Blue), cut:

• (2) 57" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 57" x 57" to make the back.




Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

#### **Block Assembly**

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square to the left side of (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D square to make the top row. Sew (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D square to the left side of (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C square to make the bottom row. Sew together the (2) rows lengthwise to make (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (20) Unit 1 squares total.



2. Sew (1) Unit 1 square to each side of (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B square to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B square to each side of (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1)  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Block One square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (5) Block One squares total.




3. Sew (1) 2 ½" Fabric E square to each side of (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric D strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric D strip to each side of (1) 4 ½" Fabric G square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 8 ½" Unit 2 square (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (4) Unit 2 squares total.



- 4. Sew together (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F square, (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip and (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H square, in that order from left to right, to make the top row (Fig. 4).
- 5. Sew (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to each side of (1) Unit 2 square to make the middle row (Fig. 4).
- 6. Sew together (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H square, (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip and (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F square, in that order from left to right, to make the bottom row (Fig. 4).
- 7. Sew together the (3) rows from Steps 4-6 lengthwise to make (1)  $12 \frac{1}{2}$ " Block Two square (Fig. 4).
- 8. Repeat Steps 4-7 to make (4) Block Two squares total.




- 9. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Two square to make Row One (Fig. 5). Repeat to make Row Three.
- 10. Sew (1) Block Two square to each side of (1) Block One square to make Row Two (Fig. 5).
- 11. Sew together the (3) Rows from Steps 9-10, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the  $36 \frac{1}{2}$ " x  $36 \frac{1}{2}$ " Center Block (Fig. 5).



#### **Quilt Top Assembly**

#### (Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)


- 12. Sew (1) 2" x 36  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 39  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 13. Sew (1) 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 39  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 41  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 14. Sew (1)  $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " x  $41 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1)  $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " x  $49 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

#### Layering, Quilting and Finishing

15. Press the quilt top and 57" x 57" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

#### Binding

- 16. Cut the ends of the (5) Fabric E binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.
- 17. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
