



Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (6868-71 Urban Floral – Bright Blue), cut:

- (2) 9 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (6) 9 ¼" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (24) 9 ¼" triangles.
- (1) 6 ¹/₂" x WOF strip, sub-cut (6) 6 ¹/₂" squares.

Fabric B (6873-90 Tone-on-Tone Skyscrapers – Gray), cut:

- (4) 2 ⁷/₈ x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 2 ⁷/₈ triangles. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (96) 2 ⁷/₈ triangles.
- (6) 2 ¹/₂" x WOF strips, sub-cut (96) 2 ¹/₂" squares.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 64 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 51 1/2" strips.
- (2) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ¹/₂" x 6 ¹/₂" strips.
- (3) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ¹/₂" x 8 ¹/₂" strips.

Fabric C (6869-57 Food Trucks – Hyacinth), cut:

- (3) 4 ¹/₂" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 4 ¹/₂" squares.
- (2) 2 ¹/₂" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 2 ¹/₂" squares.

Fabric D (6868-01 Urban Floral – White), cut:

- (2) 9 ¹/₄" x WOF strips, sub-cut (6) 9 ¹/₄" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (24) 9 ¹/₄" triangles.
- (1) 6 ¹/₄" x WOF strip, sub-cut (6) 6 ¹/₄" squares.

Fabric E (6872-64 Coffee Cups – Lime), cut:

- (3) 4 ⁷/₈" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 4 ⁷/₈" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (48) 4 ⁷/₈" triangles.
- (3) 4 ¹/₂" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 4 ¹/₂" squares.

Fabric F (6871-22 Pretzels – Bright Pink), cut:

- (2) 2 ¹/₂" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 2 ¹/₂" squares.
- (6) 2 ¹/₂" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric G (Fuchsia-40 Peppered Cottons – Fuchsia), cut:

- (2) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ¹/₂" x 6 ¹/₂" strips.
- (3) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ¹/₂" x 8 ¹/₂" strips.

Fabric H (Plum-43 Peppered Cottons - Plum), cut:

• (7) 2 7/8" x WOF strips, sub-cut (96) 2 7/8" triangles. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (192) 2 7/8" triangles.

Backing (6868-01 Urban Floral - White), cut:

• (2) 59" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 59" x 75" to make the back.

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Sewing

Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (6) Unit 1 squares total.


2. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip to each side of (1) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D square. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric D square to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (6) Unit 2 squares total.

3. Place (1) 4 ½" Fabric C square on the top left corner of (1) Unit 1 square, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 4).

4. Follow Figure 5 for the seam direction to add a $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C square to each of the remaining corners of the Unit 1 square to make Unit 3 square (Fig. 6).


5. Repeat Steps 3-4 to make (6) Unit 3 squares total.


6. Repeat Steps 3-4 and refer to Figure 7 for component identification, placement and seam direction to make (6) Unit 4 squares.




7. Sew (1) 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric B triangle to adjacent sides of (1) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F square. Sew (1) 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric E triangle to the long side of the newly sewn triangle to make (1) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 5 square (Fig. 8). Repeat to make (24) Unit 5 squares total.

8. Repeat Step 7 and refer to Figure 9 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (24) Unit 6 squares.





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12. Sew (1) Unit 5 square to each end of (1) Unit 8 strip to make the top row (Fig. 19).


13. Sew together (1) Unit 10 strip, (1) Unit 3 square and (1) Unit 12 strip, in that order from left to right, to make the middle row (Fig. 19).

14. Sew (1) Unit 5 square to each end of (1) Unit 14 strip to make the bottom row (Fig. 19).

15. Sew together the (3) rows from Steps 12-14 lengthwise to make (1) $16 \frac{1}{2}$ " Block One square (Fig. 19).

16. Repeat Steps 12-15 to make (6) Block One squares total.


17. Repeat Steps 12-15 and refer to Figure 20 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (6) Block Two squares.



18. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Two square to make Row One (Fig. 21). Repeat to make Row Three.

19. Sew (1) Block Two square to each side of (1) Block One square to make Row Two (Fig. 21). Repeat to make Row Four.

20. Sew together the (4) Rows from Steps 18-19, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the 48 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 64 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Center Block (Fig. 21).

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

21. Sew (1) 2" x 64 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 51 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.


Layering, Quilting and Finishing

22. Press the quilt top and 59" x 75" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

23. Cut the ends of the (6) Fabric F binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

24. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
