

### Cutting

#### **Cutting Instructions**

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of the fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage unless otherwise noted. (WOF = Width of Fabric, LOF = Length of Fabric)

#### Fabric A (Peppered Cottons-99 True Taupe), cut:

\*(30) stems with template B.

#### Fabric B (Peppered Cottons-22 Green Tea), cut:

\*(12) leaves with template A.

#### Fabric C (Peppered Cottons-64 Bright Kiwi), cut:

\*(6) leaves with template A.

#### Fabric D (5024-89 Flourish-Wine), cut:

\*(3) 1-1/2" x WOF strips for border 1.

#### Fabric E (5026-09 Stone Wall-Stone), cut:

\*(3) 2" x WOF strips for border 2.

#### Fabric F (Peppered Cottons-46 Vanilla), cut:

\*(1) 5-1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut six 5-1/2" squares.

#### Fabric G (5024-44 Flourish-Ochre), cut:

\*(5) 1-1/2" x WOF strips for border 4.

#### Fabric H (Peppered Cottons-29 Jungle), cut:

\*(12) leaves with template A.

\*(6) 2-1/2" x WOF strips for binding.

#### Fabric I (5023-89 Grape Harvest-Wine Multi), cut:

\*(5) 3-1/2" x WOF strips for border 5.

#### Fabric J (Peppered Cottons-34 Aubergine), cut:

\*(7) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut eighty-eight 3" squares.

#### Fabric K (5025-66 Olive Branch Allover-Green/Multi), cut:

\*(4) 5-1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut twenty-two 5-1/2" squares.

#### Fabric L (5021-44 Wine Collage-Ochre/Multi), cut:

\*(2) 13-1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut six 9" x 13-1/2" rectangles (placemats).

#### Fabric M (5020-33 Grapevine Border Stripe), fussy-cut:

- \*(1) 5-1/2" x 50-1/2" rectangle (runner).
- \*(5) 3-1/2" x **LOF** strips (placemats border).

### Sewing

#### Fabric N (5022-44 Villa Pen & Ink Scenic), cut:

\*(6) 14" x 18.5" rectangles for placemats backing.

\*Use remainder as backing for the table runner.

#### **Block Assembly**

**Note**: Measurements include 1/4" seam allowances. Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated. If no direction is specified, press seams toward darker fabric.

#### Table Runner




Figure 1 – Make 22.

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the 3" Fabric J squares. With right sides together, place one marked Fabric J square on a corner of one 5-1/2" Fabric K square and stitch on the drawn line. Repeat with the opposite corner of the same square. Trim seam allowances to ¼" and press open. In the same manner, sew Fabric J squares to the other corners of the square (*figure 1*). Make twenty-two 5-1/2" blocks.

- 2. Place the leaf shape onto a light box or windowpane. Layer the fusible web onto it and trace thirty times. Cut each shape 1/8" outside the outline and fuse to the wrong side of the fabrics: twelve *each* to Fabrics B and H, and six to Fabric C. Repeat with the stems and the Fabric A. Cut on the outline and remove paper backing.
- 3. Fold and crease the 5-1/2" Fabric F squares in half twice. Position appliqué shapes on squares using the creases as guidelines and fuse them according to manufacturer's instructions (*figure 2*). Machine appliqué using matching thread and the blanket stitch. Make six 5-1/2" blocks.

### Sewing

#### **Table Runner Assembly**

(Follow the diagram and photograph while assembling the table runner.)

- 4. For border 1, join the 1-1/2" Fabric D strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Cut two strips 50-1/2" long and sew them to each side of the panel. Press the seams toward the border strips. Measure the width of the quilt top through the center. Cut two border strips that length and sew one to the top and one to the bottom. Press the seams toward the borders.
- 5. For border 2, sew the 2" Fabric E strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Measure the vertical length of the table runner through the center and cut two border strips that length. Sew one strip to each side of the runner. Press seam allowances toward the border strips. Measure the width of the runner through the center. Cut two border strips that length and sew one to the top and one to the bottom. Press the seams toward the borders.
- 6. For border 3 and referring to the table runner photo and diagram for block placement, arrange ten 5-1/2" blocks in two strips. Sew blocks together in each strip and press seam allowances in one direction. Sew one strip to each side of the runner.
- 7. Repeat step 6 with the remainder blocks and sew one 4-block border strip to the top and one to the bottom of the runner.
- 8. Repeat step 5 with the 1-1/2" Fabric G strips to make and add border 4.
- 9. Repeat step 5 with the 3-1/2" Fabric I strips to make and add border 5.

#### Layering, Quilting, and Finishing

10. Create a quilt sandwich with the batting between the table runner and the backing. Pin or baste layers together, mark quilting design, and quilt by hand or machine. When quilting is complete, remove pins or basting, and trim batting and backing even with raw edges of the runner.

#### **Binding**

11. Join the six 2-1/2" Fabric H binding strips together end to end using a diagonal seam to make one long strip. Fold in half lengthwise and press. Sew binding to the edges of the table runner, mitering corners, and overlapping ends. Fold binding to the back of the runner and stitch it in place by hand to finish.

#### **Placemats Assembly**


- 1. For the placemat border, mark the center of the 9"x 13-1/2" Fabric L rectangles along the sides, top, and bottom. Cut the 3-1/2" Fabric M border strips into twelve 27" (placemat sides) and twelve 36" (top/bottom) strips and mark their center. Matching the centers, sew each border strip in place beginning and ending exactly ¼" from the corners. DO NOT trim the extra length.
- 2. To miter the borders, fold one corner of the placemat on a 45° angle so that the border strips are directly on top of one another and the seams nest together. Place your rotary ruler on the fold of the placemat so that the long edge is against the fold and the 45° line is on the side of the seam. Draw a line from the corner of the placemat to the outside edge of the border. Pin the borders together. Position your needle on the inside corner

where the border meets the placemat. Stitch directly on the line you have drawn to the outside edge of the border. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam allowance. Press. Repeat the process for the remaining three corners of the placemat, and remaining placemat centers.

#### Layering, Quilting, and Finishing

- 3. Layer the placemat centers **right sides together** atop the 14" x 18-1/2" Fabric N rectangles. Layer a piece of batting on top. Sew around the placemats using a 1/4" seam allowance and leaving a 4" opening. Trim placemats at the seam allowance.
- 4. Turn placemats inside out, close opening with a hand stitch (or pin to close them when topstitching), press, and topstitch 1/2" inside the edge.







Table Runner and Placemat Diagrams
