

Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (7032P-83 Vintage Santa 24 Inch Panel – Multi):

• Fussy cut (1) 22 ¹/₂" x 40 ¹/₂" rectangle, centered on the panel.

Fabric B (7028-88 Ho Ho Ho Allover - Red), cut:

- (2) 3" x 25 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 2" x 40 ½" WOF strips.

Fabric C (7025-86 Vintage Newspaper Advertisement – Multi), cut:

• (3) 5 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5 1/2" x 44 1/2" strips.

Fabric D (1351-Brown Just Color! - Brown), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x 36 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ¹/₂" x 44 ¹/₂" strips.
- (3) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 60 1/2" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 50 ½" strips.

Fabric E (Jungle-29 Peppered Cottons – Jungle), cut:

- (5) 3 ¹/₂" x WOF strips, sub-cut (56) 3 ¹/₂" squares.
- (7) 2 ¹/₂" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric F (7026-88 Vintage Toy Toss - Red), cut:

• (1) 6 ¹/₂" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 6 ¹/₂" squares.

Fabric G (7024-89 Vintage Santa Allover – Multi), cut:

• (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (6) 6 ½" squares.

Fabric H (7021-86 Peppermint Candy Allover – Multi), cut:

- (2) 6 ¹/₂" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 6 ¹/₂" squares.
- (4) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 1/2" x 71 1/2" strips.
- (4) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 63 $\frac{1}{2}$ strips.

Fabric I (7023-88 Reindeer - Red), cut:

• (1) 6 ¹/₂" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 6 ¹/₂" squares.

Fabric J (7027-08 Street Signs – Red), cut:

• (1) 6 ¹/₂" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 6 ¹/₂" squares.

Fabric K (7029-86 Santa Faces – Multi), cut:

• (1) 6 ¹/₂" x WOF strip, sub-cut (6) 6 ¹/₂" squares.

Fabric L (7030-86 Peppermint Stripe – Multi), cut:

- (2) 3 ½" x 72" LOF strips.
- (2) 3 ¹/₂" x 60" LOF strips.

Fabric M (7022-68 Stars and Snowflakes Allover – Cream), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 68 1/2" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 59 1/2" strips.

Backing (7031-83 Vintage Toys on Woodgrain - Brown), cut:

• (2) 83" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 83" x 71" to make the back.

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Sewing

Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 40 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the 22 ½" x 40 ½" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 3" x 25 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 24 ½" x 44 ½"**.

2. Place (1) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square on the top left corner of (1) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H square, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 3). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam.

3. Follow Figure 4 for the seam direction to add a 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square to the lower right corner of the 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 5).

4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (4) Unit 1 squares total.

5. Repeat Steps 2-3 and refer to Figures 6-10 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (2) Unit 2 squares, (3) Unit 3 squares, (2) Unit 4 squares, (4) Unit 5 squares and (1) Unit 6 square.

6. Place (1) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square on the bottom left corner of (1) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H square, right sides together (Fig. 11). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 11). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam (Fig. 12).

7. Follow Figure 13 for the seam direction to add a 3 ½" Fabric E square to the upper right corner of the 6 ½" Fabric H square to make (1) Unit 7 square (Fig. 14).

8. Repeat Steps 6-7 to make (4) Unit 7 squares total.

9. Repeat Steps 6-7 and refer to Figures 15-18 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make
(2) Unit 8 squares, (3) Unit 9 squares, (2) Unit 10 squares and
(1) Unit 11 square.






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10. Follow Figure 19 and sew together (8) assorted Unit squares to make the Left Side Border.

11. Follow Figure 20 and sew together (8) assorted Unit squares to make the Right Side Border.

12. Sew (6) assorted Unit squares together. Sew (1) 6 ½" Fabric K square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Top Border (Fig. 21).

13. Sew (6) assorted Unit squares together. Sew (1) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric K square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Bottom Border (Fig. 22).



Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

14. Sew (1) 5 ¹/₂" x 44 ¹/₂" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block.


15. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 44 ½" Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 36 ½" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

16. Sew the Left Side and Right Side Borders to the left and right sides of the Center Block.

17. Sew the Top Border and the Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

18. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 60 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 50 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

19. Center (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 72" Fabric L strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the top edge of the block and stop a $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

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20. Repeat Step 19 to sew (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 60" Fabric L strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 23).

21. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 23), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners.

22. Sew (1) 2" x 68 ½" Fabric M strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 59 ½" Fabric M strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

23. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 71 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 63 ½" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

Layering, Quilting and Finishing

24. Press the quilt top and 83" x 71" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

25. Cut the ends of the (7) Fabric E binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

26. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
