## Cutting

### Cutting Instructions

*Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.*

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

#### **Fabric A (5629P-17 Christmas Tree Panel – Ice Blue):**

- Fussy cut (1) 22 ½" x 34 ½" rectangle, centered on the panel.

#### **Fabric B (1351-Forest Just Color! – Forest), cut:**

- (2) 2" x 34 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 2" x 25 ½" WOF strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### **Fabric C (5632-17 Mini Snowflakes – Ice Blue), cut:**

- (2) 3 ½" x 36 ½" WOF strips.
- (4) 3" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 3" x 5 ½" strips.
- (4) 3" x WOF strips, sub-cut (56) 3" squares.
- (2) 2 ½" x 30 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 60 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 53 ½" strips.

#### **Fabric D (5626-17 Cardinals – Ice Blue), cut:**

- (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 5 ½" squares.

#### **Fabric E (5632-88 Mini Snowflakes – Red), cut:**

- (3) 3" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 3" x 5 ½" strips.

#### **Fabric F (5628-17 Swirling Snowflakes – Ice Blue), cut:**

- (2) 3" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 3" squares.

#### **Fabric G (5630-17 Animal Blocks – Ice Blue), cut:**

- (2) 8 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 8 ½" squares.

#### **Fabric H (5627-66 Chevron – Christmas Green), cut:**

- (4) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 2" x 8 ½" strips.
- (6) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 2" x 11 ½" strips.

#### **Fabric I (5624-17 Winterwood Animal Toss – Ice Blue), fussy cut:**

- (6) 5 ½" squares, each centered on an animal.

#### **Fabric J (1351-Pigment White Just Color! – Pigment White), cut:**

- (4) 3" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 3" squares.

#### **Fabric K (5625-77 Snowy Fir Trees – Spruce Blue), cut:**

- (2) 5 ½" x 63 ½" LOF strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 5 ½" x 63 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.

#### **Backing (5628-17 Swirling Snowflakes – Ice Blue), cut:**

- (2) 71" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 71" x 81" to make the back.

## Sewing

Sew using a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

### Block Assembly

**Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.**

1. Sew (1)  $2'' \times 34 \frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric B strip to each side of the  $22 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 34 \frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric A panel. Sew (1)  $2'' \times 25 \frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure  $24 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 36 \frac{1}{2}''$ .**

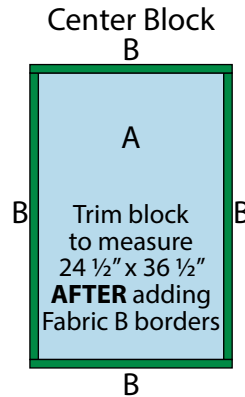

2. Sew (1)  $2'' \times 8 \frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric H strip to each side of (1)  $8 \frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric G square. Sew (1)  $2'' \times 11 \frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric G square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 2). **Trim the block to measure  $10 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 10 \frac{1}{2}''$ .** Repeat to make (8) Block One squares total.

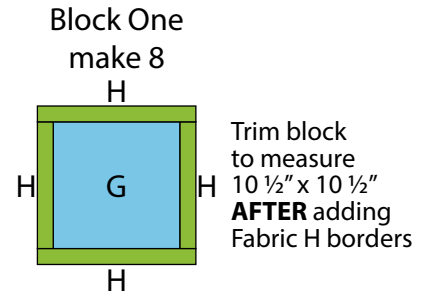

3. Place (1)  $3''$  Fabric J square on the left side of (1)  $3'' \times 5 \frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance (Fig. 4).

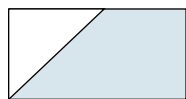

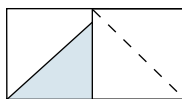

4. Place another  $3''$  Fabric J square on the right side of the  $3'' \times 5 \frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 5). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 5). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 6).

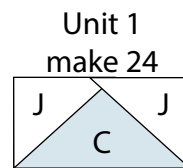

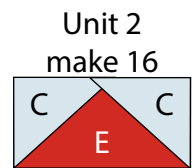

5. Repeat Steps 3-4 to make (24) Unit 1 strips total.

6. Repeat Steps 3-4 and refer to Figure 7 for fabric identification, location and seam direction to make (16) Unit 2 strips.

7. Sew (1)  $3''$  Fabric C square to each end of (1) Unit 1 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of (1)  $5 \frac{1}{2}''$  Fabric I square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together lengthwise to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 8). Repeat to make (6) Block Two squares total.

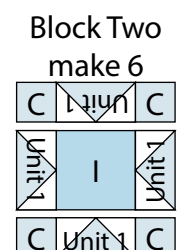

8. Sew (1) 3" Fabric F square to each end of (1) Unit 2 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip to each side of (1) 5 ½" Fabric D square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together lengthwise to make (1) Block Three square (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (4) Block Three squares total.

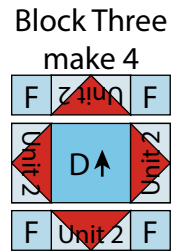

9. Sew together (1) Block One square, (2) Block Two squares and (1) Block One square, in that order from top to bottom, to make (1) Side Border (Fig. 10). Repeat to make a second Side Border.

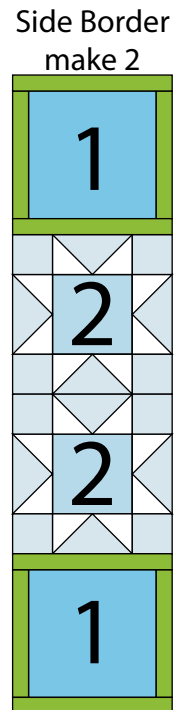

10. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Two square. Sew (1) Block Three square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Top Border. Repeat to make the Bottom Border.

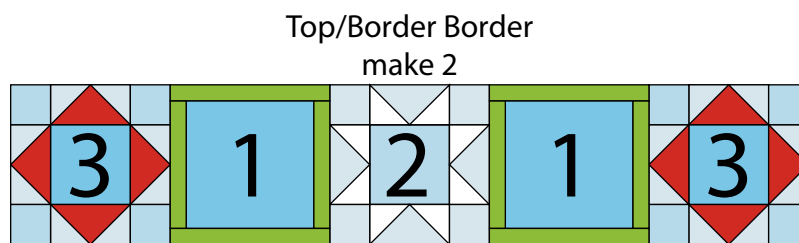

## Quilt Top Assembly

*(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)*

11. Sew (1) 3 ½" x 36 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 30 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
12. Sew (1) Side Border to each side of the Center Block. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
13. Sew (1) 2" x 60 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 53 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
14. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 63 ½" Fabric K LOF strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 63 ½" Fabric K WOF strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

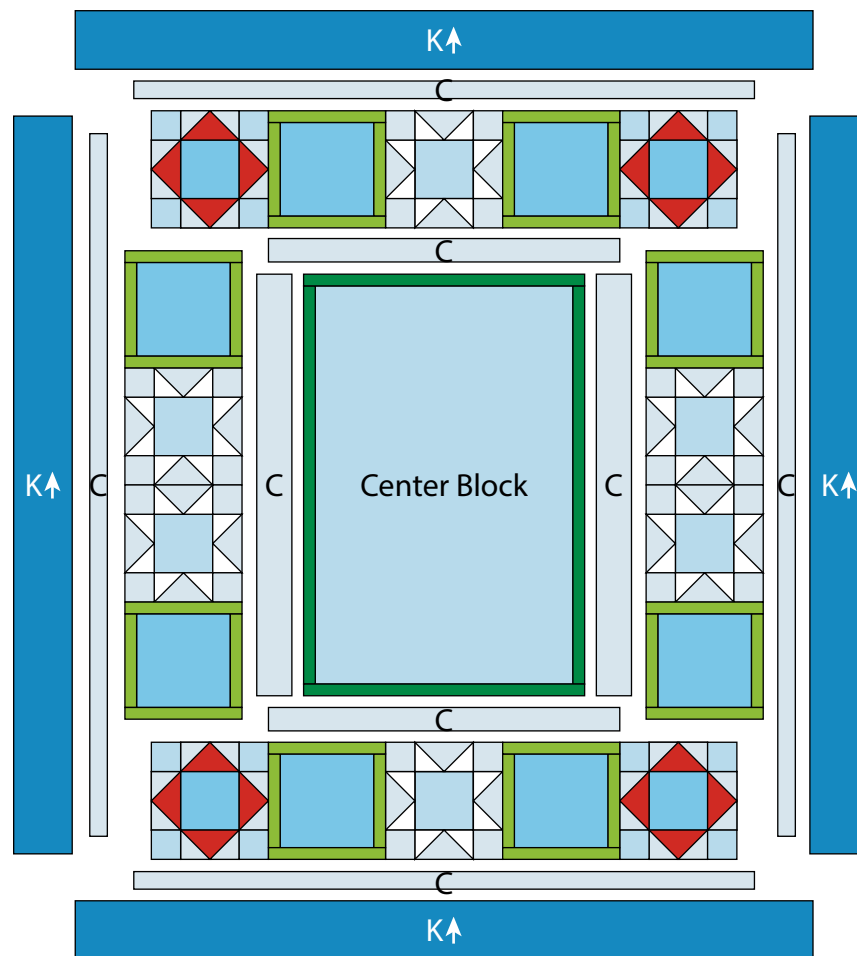
## Layering, Quilting and Finishing

15. Press the quilt top and 71" x 81" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

## Binding

16. Cut the ends of the (7) Fabric B binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

17. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
