

Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of the fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage unless otherwise noted. (WOF = Width of Fabric, LOF = Length of Fabric)

Fabric A (4726-90 Trees-Gray), cut:

*(3) 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut twenty 4-1/2" squares.

Fabric B (Shot Cotton-98 Deep Space), cut:

*(5) 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut eighty 2-1/2" squares.

Fabric C (4727-1 Candy Cane-White), cut:

- *(3) 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut ten 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles.
- *(3) 5-1/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut ten 5-1/8" x 8-1/2" rectangles.

Fabric D (4729-99 Sweet Treats Shelves-Black), cut:

*(3) 13" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (10) triangles for trees with template C.

Note: This fabric is directional. Do not flip template A upside down when cutting.

Fabric E (4724-98 Patchwork-Black/Red), cut:

- *(3) 8-1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut ten 8-1/2" squares.
- *(2) 13" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (10) triangles for trees with template C.

Fabric F (Shot Cotton-16 Flame), cut:

- *(2) 1-7/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut ten 1-7/8" x 8-1/2" strips.
- *(3) 2" x WOF strips.
- *(5) 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut eighty 2-1/2" squares.
- *(9) 2-1/2" x WOF strips for binding.

Fabric G (4723-98 Border Stripe-Black/Red), fussy-cut:

*(5) 5-1/2" x **LOF** strips for border 2.

Fabric H (Shot Cotton-09 White Sugar), cut:

- *(7) 1-1/2" x WOF strips for horizontal sashing.
- *(5) 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut eighty 2-1/2" squares.
- *(6) 3-3/4" x WOF strips.
- *(5) 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut eighty 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles.
- *(1) 16-1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (15) 1-1/2" x 16-1/2" strips.
- *(8) 2" x WOF strips for border 1.
- *(20) triangles with template A.
- *(20) triangles with template B.


Block Assembly


1. Trace shapes A, B, and C on the plastic to make templates. Cut on the outline. Label templates with words or names to avoid accidentally reversing them (for instance: Amber, Ben, Charles).

Sewing

Measurements include ¼" seam allowances. Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated. If no direction is specified, press seam toward darker fabric.

2. Trace template C (tree) on the right side of Fabric D taking care not to flip template upside down to ensure print appears correctly. For Fabric E, template C can be flipped to cut more trees per width of fabric (*figure 1*). Cut on the outline using a ruler and a rotary cutter.




Figure 2 – Cut 20 of each.

3. Trace templates A and B twenty times each on the wrong side of Fabric H (*figure 2*). Cut on the outline using a ruler and a rotary cutter and group them by type.

4. Sew one step 3 template A to the left side of a step 2 tree. Press open. Sew one step 3 template B to the right side of the same tree (*figure 3*). Press open. Repeat with the remaining step 2 trees to make 10 of each fabric.

5. Sew one 2" Fabric F strip in between two 3-3/4" Fabric H strips to make a strip set. Press seams to center. Repeat to make four strip sets. Cut strip sets into twenty 4-1/2" sections (*figure 4*) to make 4-1/2" x 8-1/2" tree trunks.

6. Sew the step 5 tree trunks to the bottom of the step 4 trees (figure 5). Press seams open. Trees measure 8-1/2" x 16-1/2".

7. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the 2-1/2" Fabric F squares. With right sides together, layer a marked square on the left short end of a 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" Fabric H rectangle and stitch on the drawn line. Trim 1/4" away from the seam line and press open. In the same manner, stitch another Fabric F square to the opposite end of the same rectangle (*figure 6*). Repeat to make a total of forty flying-geese units.

7a. Repeat step 7 with the 2-1/2" Fabric B squares and the 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" Fabric H rectangles to make forty flying-geese units (*figure 7*).

8. Sew one step 7 flying geese to opposite sides of a 4-1/2" Fabric A square (*figure 8*). Press seams to center. Repeat to make ten block centers.

8a. Repeat step 8 with the step 7a flying-geese units and the remaining 4-1/2" Fabric A squares (figure 9, next page).

9. Sew one 2-1/2" Fabric H square to each end of the remaining step 7 flying-geese units (*figure 10*). Press seams toward squares.

9a. Repeat step 8 with the remaining step 7a flying-geese units and the remaining 2-1/2" Fabric H squares (figure 11).

10. Sew one step 9 strip to the top and one to the bottom of a step 8 block center (*figure 12*). Press seams open. Repeat to make ten 8-1/2" blocks.

10a. Repeat step 10 with the step 9a strips and the step 8a block centers (*figure 13*).

11. Sew a 1-7/8" x 8-1/2" Fabric F strip to a 5-1/8" x 8-1/2" Fabric C rectangle. Press seam to the dark fabric. Sew a 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" Fabric C rectangle to the Fabric F strip. Press seam to the dark fabric (*figure 14*, next page). Repeat to make ten 8-1/2" blocks.

12. Sew one 8-1/2" Fabric E square to the bottom of the step 10 blocks (figure 15). Press seams toward square.

13. Sew the step 12 units to the step 6 X Trees and the step 12a units to the step 6 Y Trees (*figure 17*). Press seams toward the trees.

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the quilt diagram and photograph while assembling the quilt top.)


- 14. Referring to the quilt photo for block placement, lay out the blocks and the 1-1/2" x 16-1/2" Fabric H sashing strips in five rows, and join the blocks and sashing strips together in each row. Press seams toward sashings.
- 15. Sew block rows and horizontal sashing strips together, matching adjacent seams. Press seams in one direction.
- 16. For border 1, sew the eight 1-1/2" Fabric H strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Measure the vertical length of the quilt top through the center and cut two border strips that length. Sew one strip to each side of the quilt top. Measure the width of the quilt top through the center. Cut two border strips that length and sew one to the top and one to the bottom. Press the seams toward the borders.
- 17. For border 2, sew the five 5-1/2" Fabric G strips together end to end using **straight** seams. Proceed as in step 16 to add this border.

Layering, Quilting, and Finishing

18. Create a quilt sandwich with the batting between the quilt top and the backing. Pin or baste layers together, mark quilting design, and quilt by hand or machine. When quilting is complete, remove pins or basting, and trim batting and backing even with raw edges of the quilt top.

Binding

19. Join the nine 2-1/2" Fabric F binding strips together end to end using a diagonal seam to make one long strip. Press in half lengthwise. Sew binding to the edges of the quilt top, mitering corners, and overlapping ends. Fold binding to the back of the quilt and stitch it in place by hand to finish.

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Yuletide Cheer – Quilt 1 Templates Print on 11" x 17" paper.

Choose "No scaling" on printer settings to ensure templates are printed at their actual size.
