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Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted. WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (4810P-99 Banner Panel – Black):

• Fussy cut (1) 22 ½" x 42 ½" panel.

Fabric B (4816-33 Rake Texture - Yellow), cut:

- (2) $2^{"} \times 42 \frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips, piece as needed.
- (2) 2" x 25 ½" WOF strips.
- (4) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 67 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (4) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 63 1/2" strips.
- (2) 1 ¹/₂" x 42 ¹/₂" WOF strips, piece as needed.
- (1) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 1 ¹/₂" x 7 ¹/₂" strips.

Fabric C (4814-55 Leaves – Purple), cut:

- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 1/2" x 44 1/2" strips.
- (2) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips, piece as needed.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 64 1/2" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 61 1/2" strips.

Fabric D (4811-22 Large Butterfly – Lilac), cut:

• (2) 6 ¹/₂" x 42 ¹/₂" WOF strips, piece as needed.

Fabric E (Oyster-35 Peppered Cottons - Oyster), cut:

- (2) 8 ¹/₂" x 58 ¹/₂" LOF strips.
- (2) 8 ½" x 48 ½" LOF strips.

Fabric F (4812-58 Floral – Purple), cut:

• See instructions to cut (2) Large Butterflies.

Fabric G (4813-76 Marble – Teal), cut:

- See instructions to cut (1) Large Butterfly.
- See instructions to cut (2) Small Butterflies.

Fabric H (4815-58 Small Butterfly – Purple), cut:

• See instructions to cut (1) Large Butterfly.

Fabric I (4814-76 Leaves - Teal):

• See instructions to cut (2) Small Butterflies.

Fabric J (4815-76 Small Butterfly – Teal), cut:

• See instructions to cut (2) Large Butterflies.

Fabric K (4813-58 Marble – Purple), cut:

• See instructions to cut (4) Small Butterflies.

Fabric L (4812-99 Floral – Black), cut:

• See instructions to cut (2) Large Butterflies.

Fabric M (4811-11 Large Butterfly – Blue), cut:

- (4) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 6 ½" x 75 ½" strips.
- (4) 6 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 6 1/2" x 69 1/2" strips.

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Cutting - Continued

Fabric N (4816-17 Rake Texture – Teal), cut:

• (8) 2 ¹/₂" x WOF strips for the binding.

Backing (4811-11 Large Butterfly – Blue), cut:


• (2) 89" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 83" x 89" to make the back.

Sewing

Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.


Block Assembly

1. Sew (1) $2^n \times 42^{\frac{1}{2}}$ Fabric B strip to each side of the 22 $\frac{1}{2}^n \times 42^{\frac{1}{2}}$ Fabric A panel. Sew (1) $2^n \times 25^{\frac{1}{2}}$ Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel. Trim the block to measure 24 $\frac{1}{2}^n \times 44^{\frac{1}{2}}$ to make (1) Unit 1 rectangle (Fig. 1).




2. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the left side of (1) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip lengthwise. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the sewn strip to make (1) Unit 2 strip (Fig. 2).


3. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the right side of (1) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip lengthwise. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the sewn strip to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 3).



5. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 44 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the Unit 4 rectangle. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 42 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 4 rectangle (Fig. 5).

6. Sew (1) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 48 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to each side of the Unit 4 rectangle. Sew (1) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 58 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 4 rectangle to make (1) Unit 5 rectangle (Fig. 5).






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7. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about 1/8" outside the drawn lines.

8. Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.

9. Refer to Figure 6 to arrange and press the (8) Small Butterflies and (8) Large Butterflies onto the Unit 5 rectangle.

10. Finish the raw edges of each shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to make the Center Block.





Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

11. Sew (1) 2" x 64 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 61 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

12. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 67 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 63 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

13. Sew (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $69\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric M strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $75\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric M strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

Layering, Quilting and Finishing


14. Press the quilt top and 83" x 89" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

15. Cut the ends of the (8) Fabric N binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.


16. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.


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Quilt Layout

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
